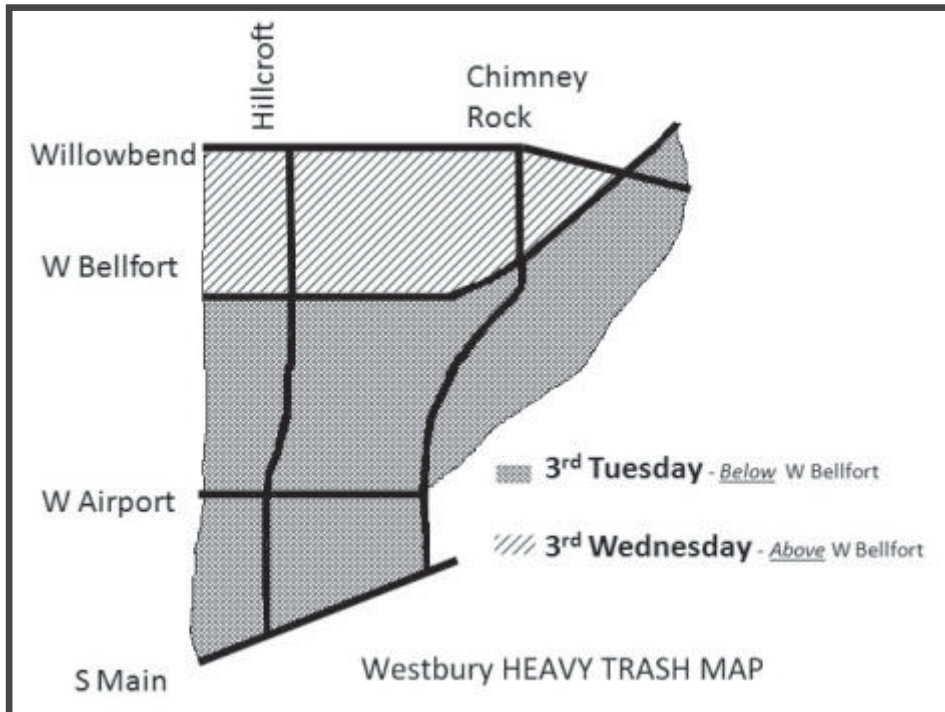

Southwest Houston Trash Depository & Recycling Center

Directions: West Bellfort west to the Sam Houston Tollway feeder road and make a right, then stay on the feeder road until you reach the traffic light at the feeder road for the SW Freeway, and then turn right onto the SW Freeway feeder road....it's just a few hundred feet to the entrance of the depository. Present your identification at the entrance office and then follow instructions

When: The depository is open 7 days a week, except holidays. The hours are from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. (Non-Daylight Savings Time) from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. (Daylight Savings Time).

What to bring: To use the facility, City of Houston residents must stop, sign in at the office and present a current water bill and a driver's license. A utility bill or Texas ID may be substituted.

What to dispose of here: Junk waste, tree waste, used tires and recyclables. The site is a drop-off recycling center that accepts paper, #1 -5 and #7 plastic, glass, and aluminum and tin cans.

What is not accepted: Household garbage, more than ten tires from an individual, and large quantities of building materials. Trash from commercial haulers is not accepted. Trash brought in a commercial vehicle (business or rented commercial) also will not be accepted.

What does the new facility mean for Westbury? The new facility is much closer to Westbury than other solid waste depository locations in Houston. It is anticipated that the new location will also reduce trash dumping in the Westbury area.

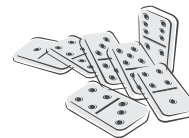

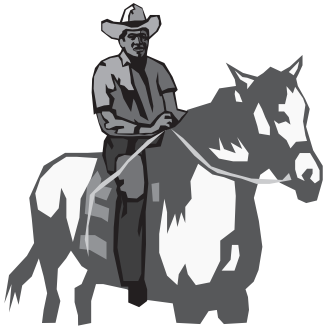

SuperNeighborhood Update

On January 10th, Mayor Annise Parker met with representatives from city-designated "SuperNeighborhoods" during the monthly SuperNeighborhood Alliance meeting. Cindy Chapman represented the Westbury Area Super-Neighborhood at the meeting. Mayor Parker stated that there are 3 priorities for 2011: Finalizing the city budget, Redistricting all city council districts, and Implementing the *ReBuild Houston* ballot initiative. All three of these priorities must be completed by the end of June 2011.

City Budget: The city has cut tens of millions of dollars from the budget and still has another 8 million dollars to cut. The mayor plans to meet with police and firefighter unions to discuss the problem and also plans to look at city healthcare expenses.

Redistricting: More than 30 years ago, the city pledged to redistrict all city council boundaries when the city population reached 2 million. US Census data will be used to define the boundaries as council increases from 9 to 11 city council seats, not including the 5 at-large seats. Public hearings will begin in March for the draft plan, and then the proposed final plan must be sent to the US Justice Department in June for review.

ReBuild Houston: Voters in November 2010 created a dedicated fund via city charter to pay for street and drainage projects. The newly passed measure does not allow the city to borrow money for these projects, so funds will need to accumulate first. The fee will be based on impervious coverage of each lot and satellite imagery is being used for initial

estimates. Streets are being evaluated by a Street Surface Assessment Vehicle which uses lasers, plus citizen comments from the upcoming February Capital Improvement Project (CIP) meetings will also be considered. Drainage projects will have higher priority, since the mayor notes that a flooded house is a more serious event than a bumpy road.

Department of Neighborhoods:

Mayor Parker has created a new "Department of Neighborhoods". The new Director, Katherine Flowers, was hired in January. The mayor envisions that all neighborhood services will ultimately be moved to the new department.

Question and Answer

Why do I send WCC dues to Dallas? The Dallas address is the check-processing center for the bank used by the Westbury Civic Club.

Why do we contribute money to maintain public property? Why does the WCC do this? Many neighborhoods adopt all of their esplanades and pay to maintain them to THEIR standards and not the CITY standards. All you need to do is drive through Maplewood or Meyerland or Braes Oaks to see what a difference private maintenance makes. Our

Greenspace Beautification fund maintains the flower beds and landscape plants at our subdivision marker signs and also at various medians. These projects help create a positive image of our community, even though the property is owned by the city. Just as importantly, this fund also pays to mow certain areas which are not often mowed. For example, there are several places where utility or flood control district drainage easements cross our major thoroughfares. Unfortunately, these organizations do not de-litter or mow their easements very often, so the WCC pays to have these

locations cleaned and mowed. In some years when the city mowing schedule was absurdly long between mowings, we paid to have our medians mowed. Additionally, the WCC is required by the city to mow any esplanade where we have installed an irrigation system, which describes the two large landscaped beds on Chimney Rock at West Bellfort. We wish we could adopt more of our esplanades and really make them shine. A linear park down Hillcroft would be an incredible addition to our neighborhood.

Security Update

I am excited to be serving in the role of Security Director. My main goal is to keep the community informed and safe. As we begin 2011, there are a few tips that I would like to share about keeping your home safe. The Precinct 5 Constable has reported new and unique burglary methods in the area that involve individuals posing as friendly service providers to entice the homeowner to invite that individual in. That then allows for a second individual to enter the home and burglarize the home without the homeowners knowing. This type of incident can be avoided by knowing the following information which was provided by the Constable's office:

BOTTOM LINE: IF YOU HAVEN'T CALLED A UTILITY OR SERVICE COMPANY REGARDING A PROBLEM AT YOUR RESIDENCE, DON'T LET ANY STRANGER INTO YOUR HOME!

Reliant Energy:

- Employees will wear a Reliant Energy patch on a white polo-type shirt.
- They will have paperwork with Reliant letterhead.

Reliant will not come to your home; however, occasionally there are vendors who will be trying to sell electric service.

Centerpoint:

- Employees will have a badge with a technician number.
- They do NOT DRIVE UNMARKED vehicles.

A Centerpoint employee may need access to the inside of your home in 3 instances: 1) you report a gas leak; (2) for an inspection prior to a move-in, or 3) to hook up service.

City of Houston - Water Dept:

- Employees wear blue uniforms with the City of Houston logo.
- They drive white vehicles that are labeled "City of Houston."

They will NEVER need access inside of your home - all of their work is done on the exterior.

Remember, you have total control over who gains entry into your home. You have every right to reject someone who appears unannounced, even if they represent that they are from the City or from an electrical/gas company.

Two meetings will be held in the Westbury area. It is anticipated that a rail station will be constructed somewhere in our general area.

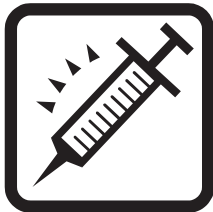

Willow Waterhole Monthly Audubon Society Bird Survey

Date and time: Saturday, February 19, at 8 a.m.

Location: The Gathering Place Parking Lot, 5310 S. Willow

Take a walk at Willow Waterhole with Joy Hester, Houston Audubon Society member, and count the birds. Highlights in January were 6 Hooded Mergansers, a Palm Warbler, a Wilson's Snipe, and the drama of seeing a Cooper's Hawk fatally interrupt the courtship of a pair of Chickadees. The total for the day was 38 species. Some of you may be interested to know that Houston Audubon began the WillowWaterhole Bird Survey in May of 2007, so we're close to having four years of monthly survey data!



Directions: To reach Willow Waterhole, drive south on Chimney Rock to Gasmer and turn left. At the fork, bear left on S. Willow and watch for the Gathering Place on your left. Or drive south on S. Post Oak to S. Willow and turn right. The Gathering Place will be on the right about a mile from S. Post Oak.

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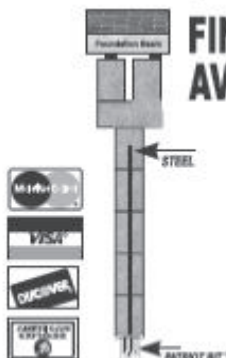
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
