

President's Message

I hope you have been enjoying the feature articles on our community partners that we have been highlighting over the past 6 months. This month you will read about the Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy (WWGC). In fact you will find multiple articles about this incredible 300 acre green belt that runs almost from Chimnev Rock to beyond South Post Oak. New York has Central Park: Houston has several wonderful parks: Midtown has Hermann Park; Downtown has Discovery Green; Memorial has Memorial Park and the Arboretum: and scattered elsewhere are Terry Hershey Park, Keith Weiss park and Jesse Jones Park.

And we in Southwest Houston are going to have something just as fabulous...the Willow Waterhole! This space is still in its infancy with 40% more still to be excavated. The WWGC has been staging various events for the past 9 years to introduce people to the park and to hopefully engage them in its growth and development. Some people have written to me expressing concern about people using the Willow

Waterhole to the detriment of wildlife. With 300 acres, there is more than enough space for all of us. The greenspace is a needed oasis in a busy urban corridor. It is bordered by busy Highway 90 and South Post Oak: a railroad track with over 40 trains a day; industrial operations of crushed concrete; a single stream recycling plant; a trash facility; and a research plant. Wildlife here will be acclimated to urban living. I hope many of you will join us for the annual meeting on April 18 to hear the Master Plan.

I'd like to thank everyone who has sent in their dues. And to those who sent in additional donations, I want to especially thank you for your generosity. If you haven't sent them in yet, please do. Each of you helps make Westbury & Parkwest a desirable place to live. Now that the weather is nicer. I have been out walking and am always struck by what a nice neighborhood we have. The majority of the homes are well kept and look well loved. Yes, there are the handful of homes owned by people who do not care; that don't maintain their property; don't paint, don't

mow; store trash; park in the grass or across the sidewalk or try to operate businesses out of their homes to the annoyance of their neighbors. We are a deed restricted community and we enforce deed restrictions. But there is a process and sometimes it seems to take too long. But the WCC is active, engaged and vigilantly working on behalf of Westbury & Parkwest. And you as a resident are an integral part of the WCC.

To paraphrase Garrison Keillor: "Be well, be good neighbors, and keep in touch." Let us know what we can do to help make your part of Westbury the best that it can be.

Enjoy Spring! There are lots of activities in Westbury this month to enjoy before summer arrives. Clean up Westbury at our two "Keep District K Beautiful" events on the 6th. Shop at our popular Westbury Community Garage Sale event on the 20th. Celebrate an amazing music festival at Willow Waterhole on the 28th - where there will be good music to enjoy, good food to eat, beautiful scenery to view, and a good time to be had for all! **Becky Edmondson**

Of course not, so Westbury is pleased to announce that several locations in Westbury will be participating in the Keep District K Beautiful Day. Both the Willow Waterhole and the Westbury Community Garden will be having events.



Willow Waterhole Volunteer Event

Volunteer work opportunities will include planting 50 trees, creating mulch islands to protect recently planted trees, picking up litter, cleaning trails, and getting the area sparkling for the April 28th JazzFest event.

As part of the clean-up effort, Melanie Roy, a sophomore at Bellaire High School, will lead a pick up team specifically to collect plastic grocery bags. A news conference is planned for 9:30 AM on the west side of South Post Oak just north of Gasmer so that the team can report on the number of plastic bags they collected. It is estimated that 100 billion plastic shopping bags are used in the United States every year and only 1 - 2% of plastic bags end up getting recycled. Animals will often either mistakenly ingest the bags or become entangled in them. Thousands of marine animals and more than 1 million birds die each year due to plastic pollution.

One of the first hurdles in using the app successfully is knowing what type of violations and problems can be turned into 311. Here is a quick list of the common issues and where to report them.

Trash Q & A

The Westbury Civic Club receives hundreds of calls and emails a month. The most commonly asked questions have to do with trash. Here are some of the questions and answers from the past month.

Heavy Trash trucks are picking up tree waste on my street but it's Wednesday and my pick-up day should be Thursday. What's going on? Can I still place my tree waste at the street for Thursday? Will they come again?

Sometimes the Solid Waste Department (SWD) will send trucks early to start collecting tree waste, especially in neighborhoods like Westbury which generate a lot of tree waste due to our mature trees and extensive landscaping. The trash trucks are still supposed to pick up tree waste on the correct day, so go ahead and put it out. If they do not return on the correct day to get your tree waste, then immediately call 311. They will send a crew out within 2-5 days to collect the waste.

When is Heavy Trash?

Heavy Trash pick-up for ALL of Westbury is the 2nd Thursday of every month. Tree waste may be put out every month and EVEN junk waste can be put out on EVEN months. What do I do if my household trash, yard waste or heavy trash was not collected on when it was supposed to be collected?

Call 311 or use the 311 App to report service problems. If this problem continues, then also contact the WCC office. In March, Parkwest 3 was having trash collection problems.

Why didn't the city collect my yard waste that I put at the curb?

Are you using the correct type bag? Yard waste can only be placed in plastic bags approved by the City of Houston. The SWD workers will NOT collect yard waste if it has been placed in the wrong type bag. Additionally, they will not collect the wrong type of plastic bags during monthly junk waste or tree waste pickup.



The picture above shows the wrong type bag. DO NOT USE large black bags for yard waste.

When is Heavy Trash?

Heavy Trash pick-up for ALL of Westbury is the 2nd Thursday of every month. Tree waste may be put out every month and EVEN junk waste can be put out on EVEN months.

Today was trash day and I came home to discover my trash can and/or recycling bin broken. What do I do now? Call 311 to report the broken bin. A new bin will be delivered to your home as soon as stock allows. Several small recycling bins in PW3 and Westbury 3 were broken or stolen last month. The residents reported that the city

was back ordered on the small bins.

Heavy Trash Revisited

Attention Westbury Residents Hiring a Contractor? Please

One would think that having just one heavy trash day for all of Westbury would alleviate some of our heavy trash violations. The fact that it is the same day of the week as our regular trash pickup should make it even easier to remember. The **second Thursday** of every month you may put out tree waste (straight from the tree or shrub). On the **EVEN** numbered months, you can **EVEN** put out JUNK Waste.

The following dates are the **ONLY** dates that **JUNK waste** will be picked up:

April 11 June 13 August 8 October 10 December 12

What can be done about

violators? Anyone can report heavy trash violators to 311 and we encourage you to do so. The WCC has been hanging door hangers on violator's doors reminding them of the correct dates. March was a particularly bad month with multiple violators on heavily travelled streets such as Willowbend, W. Bellfort and Ludington. make sure all contractor r Please make sure all contractors hired follow city ordinances and deed restrictions. If you are using a contractor to remodel, cut your trees, build a fence, etc., they are **REQUIRED to haul their trash away.**

Each user must provide the following as proof of residency: 1)Texas Driver's License or ID, and 2) A current utility bill or city property tax receipt. **The depository accepts the following items:** Furniture, Tree Waste, Stoves, Refrigerators, etc. Up to 10 automobile tires (No Rims). **The depository also accepts recyclable** materials free of charge.


Neighborhood depositories will not accept household garbage, more than ten tires from an individual, and large quantities of building materials. Trash from commercial haulers or brought in a commercial vehicle (business or rented commercial) will not be accepted.

Environmental Service Center

(Recycle and Household Hazardous Waste) 11500 South Post Oak - between Gasmer and South Main The Environmental Service Center accepts household hazardous waste such as anti-freeze, batteries, fuel, oil, paint, paint thinner, pesticides, herbicides and household cleaners. Residential electronic scrap items will also be accepted (monitors, televisions, printers, keyboards, mice, scanners, fax machines, telephone handsets, VCRs, CPUs, cellular phones and other small consumer electronics). These items should not be placed on the curb with or in your container for collection with garbage or heavy trash pick-up. The center is open every Tues, and Wed, from 9AM to 3PM and the 2nd Saturday of the month from 9 AM-1 PM.

Halfway House Closes

The WCC is happy to announce that the halfway house on West Bellfort that housed parolees from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice has been vacated as of February 28th and the home is up for sale. We thank nearby residents who brought this home to our attention. We had been told that this was transitional housing for the disabled, but found two convicted sex offenders registered at this address. This home was taking people released from prison, with some wearing electronic monitoring devices. Needless to say neighbors were worried. One resident was re-arrested within months of his release and sent back to prison. In January, according to police records, a woman living in the home reported that she had been sexually

assaulted. The bank foreclosed on the home and gave them six months to relocate.

This facility has relocated to a commercial building on Burdine across from Westbury Square. According to the man who runs this facility, sex offenders and violent offenders will not be housed at this facility due to its proximity to Chimney Rock Park. Westbury Community Garden

SuperNeighborhood 37, which consists of the WAIC and WCC, approved a motion to have the seven acre site of the Westbury Community Garden (WCG) appraised. Cindy Chapman and Becky Edmondson met with the Houston Parks Board to determine how best to move forward. The WCC engaged an appraiser to determine the market value of the property. The appraisal process looks at the "highest and best use" and looks at residential feasibility first. The appraisal found that residential development was not considered feasible nor was retail development. In his opinion, the land's maximally productive and highest use are institutional use such as a school, church, community center or recreational facility.

And that is what the Westbury Community Garden provides on this property now.

A school? Yes, the WCG is an outdoor classroom; we are a teaching garden, Urban Harvest conducts classes, the WCG teaches gardening to residents, gardeners and to school groups. **Neighboring Foerster Elementary** gardens with us and learns from us. We have a large compost area and rain water collection device to show residents how to replicate these important recycling tools.

A community center? Yes, the WCG is experience nature and work with one a community. Community was such an important part of what we envisioned the garden to be that we put it in our name. The WCG is the visible tangible center of our community and formed a bridge between our single family and multifamily residents. The beautiful June Holly Learning Pavilion stands as a gathering place and is tangible evidence of June Holly's mission -- to bring together different communities to improve dialogue, understanding and cooperation in order -- to improve the quality of life for all.

A recreational facility? Yes the WCG provides recreation in the form of gardening, weed pulling, compost turning and more. It brings people outdoors to enjoy not only gardening, but one another's company. In the master plan for the garden are trails around and through the garden.

A church? While the garden is not a church in its definition as a building for worship, it is place where one can commune with nature and God. We have partnered with the neighboring Bethel's Family Church and hope to expand our donations to their Food Bank, which feeds over 6,000 needy residents a month.



Foxxy's Cabaret Update

Last month we reported that Harris County Attorney Vince Ryan had filed a lawsuit seeking an injunction against Foxxy's Cabaret, an adult entertainment club located in the 11100 block of South Post Oak Road on the perimeter of the Westbury SuperNeighborhood, to stop criminal activity occurring at the club. Ryan said in a press release that Foxxy's Cabaret has been the location of crimes, including prostitution and narcotics offenses.

WCC President Becky Edmondson and WCC Director Cindy Chapman attended the Sharpstown "Law Enforcement March on Crime" luncheon on March 7 as guests of District K City Councilmember Larry Green. We noticed Harris County Attorney Vince Ryan was also in the audience, so of course, we dashed over to thank him for the work his office has been doing to stop criminal activity at Foxxy's Cabaret and other locations in southwest Houston. We also discussed some long-standing area problems as he was our city council person from 1987-1993.

A week later on March 15 we received a call from the Harris County Attorney's Office (CAO) that the hearing for



Foxxy's Cabaret scheduled for March 19 had been CANCELED, because the CAO and Foxxy's had mutually agreed to terms for a temporary injunction, awaiting signature approval by the judge. This is a positive initial step toward stopping criminal activity at Foxxy's. The Westbury Civic Club had planned to have representatives from Westbury and our community allies sitting in the courtroom audience during the hearing about Foxxy's.



Railroad Quiet Zone

Long time residents living near the South Main/Highway 90 railroad tracks know that train horns have been a part of their daily lives since they moved into their homes. Today there is more train traffic (about 30 trains each day) and the Westbury Civic Club began lobbying for a Railroad Quiet Zone over a decade ago. We were elated when a Railroad Quiet Zone was finally implemented in June 2012. Unfortunately, the quiet did not last long because Union Pacific (UP) then approved a 43 million dollar project to add \Rightarrow To warn animals, vehicle operators, a second set of tracks alongside the existing track. UP track crews work one week off, one week on. They do some work at night and sometimes leave their equipment out. The train horns blow whenever workers or equipment are near the railroad tracks. This is not a

violation of the Quiet Zone: this is a safety measure during construction. Some weeks are quieter than others due to the construction schedule. Work in Westbury may be completed in about a month, but work at railroad crossings to our west will continue for several more months.

When we as residents in our homes think about a railroad Quiet Zone, we think of

peace and quiet and not being awakened at 3AM or having our children awakened. When the train companies think about Quiet Zones they think about safety. Even in a Quiet Zone, there are rules requiring that train horns MUST be used under certain conditions:




- pedestrian, trespassers or crews on other trains
- \Rightarrow To alert employees who are working on or near the track
- \Rightarrow When approaching or passing another train in the vicinity (this may cause more horns in our future)
- \Rightarrow At crossings known to have malfunctioning warning devices
- \Rightarrow When starting a train from a stopped position
- \Rightarrow In an emergency situation when an engineer believes such action is appropriate in order to prevent injury, death or property damage.

Federal regulations provide public authorities the option to maintain and/or

establish quiet zones provided certain supplemental or alternative safety measures are in place and the crossing accident rate meets FRA standards. That is what the City of Houston did for the crossings through Westbury. Union Pacific believes quiet zones compromise the safety of railroad employees, customers, and the general public. While the railroad does not endorse quiet zones, it does comply with provisions outlined in the federal law.

Even when the construction work is finished and the Quiet Zone is fully back in place, we may still hear horns. The WCC has a contact at HPD to report horns to and they will investigate for any possible violations.
