# **Parker Elementary**

# Design Charrette for New Building @ Parker

HISD will be constructing a new school for Parker Elementary, and HISD wants the new school to be designed for a 21st Century Learning Environment which is flexible and attractive and enhances the learning process. Brave (Bra VAY) Architecture has been hired as architects. In late February, members of the school Project Advisory Team (PAT) met with the architects for a two day "design charette" to start the design stage of the project. Cindy Chapman represented the WCC and the WAIC on the team. The goal was to identify challenges for the project, share ideas, and to develop a consensus on concepts. These concepts will continue to be refined, with a goal to have preliminary designs ready for comments from the community and the Parker Elementary family, hopefully before the end of this school year.

For example, the PAT and architects discussed the unique needs Parker has as a music magnet elementary school. Which areas need to have sound isolation? Which areas need to have sound isolation yet still be in view of other areas? What are the needs and desires for practice and performing spaces? What needs are related to evening performances or community events?

There was much discussion about transportation and parking needs. How many students walk or bike? Use a bus? Use Metro? Use private cars or vans? Are the needs different in the morning than in the afternoon? How are these needs handled now and how might they be handled in the future? Where do deliveries need to be made? Where will music equipment be loaded and

unloaded? How much parking is needed?

The architects also wanted to discuss the design constraints and challenges for Parker Elementary. It is vital that the school be fully functional during construction, so how

can the functions that are currently housed in 5 temporary buildings be squeezed into the existing building during

housed in 5 temporary buildings be squeezed into the existing building during the construction process? Where can recess be held? How can school drop-off and pick-up be handled?

After the meeting ended on the first day, the architects continued to work into the night. On the morning of the second day, the architects presented drawings to the PAT showing early conceptual ideas for the school and site. Amazingly, considering all the site complications, the architects delivered a promising concept that squeezes into the available space and seems to accommodate key needs for the school.

## **HISD Updates**

# HISD Boundaries to Change

HISD Trustee Wanda Adams was the invited guest speaker for the March WAIC / Westbury SuperNeighborhood meeting. Trustee Adams was accompanied by Chief Student Support Officer Mark Smith (a former principal at Anderson Elementary here in Westbury) and HISD demographer Justin Silhavy.

Trustee Adams explained that HISD trustee boundaries will be changing because HISD was asked by the state to annex the struggling North Forest School District in July 2013 and to also include the most recent 2010 demographic information.

Preliminary maps will be prepared for community input, possibly in April, and the lines will follow current precinct boundaries. Trustee Adams has requested that communities be kept together as much as possible.

HISD has also been looking at demographics to determine school boundaries and where to build new schools. In the south and southwest part of Houston, new developments are being built on vacant land, especially near Highway 288 and Beltway 8. Kolter and Parker Elementary are seeing more student enrollments as younger families buy existing housing. For example, the birth rate has gone up by 11% in zip code 77096. Milne Elementary is an example of increasing student enrollment as apartment occupancy rates rise. We discussed that Anderson Elementary has two apartment complexes zoned to it that will be shut down and razed as part of a pending campus expansion at WHS, which will decrease enrollment at Anderson unless modifications are made to the attendance boundaries.

The demographer also discussed that data is now available for each school at HISD showing how many students transfer IN and OUT and where these students are coming from/going to. This data only includes information about students at public schools and state charter schools, and does not include students who are at private schools or are home-schooled or are not in school.

Here is demographic information about Anderson Elementary. There are 192 students who are zoned to Anderson who go to other public schools and there are 91 students who have opted to transfer to Anderson who are zoned elsewhere. There are 40 students who are zoned to Anderson who have opted to transfer to Parker's magnet program, yet there are 22 students zoned to Parker who have requested a transfer to Anderson.

Parker Elementary has 195 zoned students who have opted to transfer elsewhere, and there are 493 who have opted to transfer to Parker, a music magnet school.

HISD Superintendent Dr. Terry Grier and HISD Trustee Wanda Adams were in southwest Houston on March 11 as guest speakers at a BiMonthly Breakfast organized by our community partner Southwest Houston 2000. Members of the WCC and WAIC boards



(Cindy Chapman, Russell Schexnayder, Van Austell, and Virginia and Taylor Livingston) attended the breakfast to demonstrate our community support for neighborhood schools. Additionally, Principal Dr. Roz Vaughn and Christine Turner from Anderson Elementary plus Principal Lori Frodine and Carol Kehlenbrink from Parker Elementary were in the audience from the Westbury community.

Dr. Grier summarized recent achievements by the school district and current challenges. He is proud that more HISD high school students are applying to prestigious universities because these universities are able to provide better financial packages to make school affordable. He notes that reading and literacy continue to be issues, and he encouraged the audience to support reading programs and to read to children every day.

# Westbury Area School Updates

#### **Johnston Traffic Plan & Westbury**

The safety audit at Johnston Middle School, while needed and necessary, has the possibility to negatively impact Westbury residents south of Willowbend near Johnston. The WCC and District K are working with the City of Houston traffic management to evaluate the traffic issues during school hours along Manhattan and Creekbend in Westbury 2. The WCC has concerns that the situation will worsen as parking becomes more limited north of Willowbend. The City needs your input. #### WHS Campus Expansion Update

On March 2, 2014, the Houston Chronicle published an article about campus expansions, including the campus expansion for Westbury High School that was approved by voters via a bond election in 2012. The Chronicle says that HISD "has made offers on two area apartment complexes: Westbury Manor at 5565 Gasmer and Las Villas Del Parque next door at 5541 Gasmer. HISD previously bought a complex on Gasmer, farther from the Westbury campus, so the new purchases would give the district a large, uninterrupted stretch of land."

The goal is to double the WHS campus size to about 50 acres in association with the pending building renovations at WHS. Suburban school districts routinely build high schools on campuses of at least 50 acres, and the Chronicle noted that the Cy-Fair School District provides about 65 acres for high school campuses. "I hate for people to feel like we're being the mean, heartless big school district because that's not the way we've approached it," said Sue Robertson, HISD's general manager of facilities planning. "We're all in this together to try to make the communities and the schools better."

#### Message from Harris County Constable Pct. 5

Sergeant Mitchell Hutter, the community relations and crime prevention officer for the Harris County Constables Office PCT5, needs your help with putting a stop to crimes in Westbury. You are the eyes and ears. Please call the WAP Constables at **281-463-6666** whenever you see anything suspicious.

A suspicious person is anyone you see on your block you do not recognize. Do not let age, race, or gender play a factor in who you believe to be a criminal. Two young female burglars were arrested in Westbury not too long ago.

If someone comes to your door, please always go to your door and acknowledge that you are home. Never open your door for anyone you do not know. Then please call our dispatch at 281-463-6666 so that a deputy can check on them.

The same applies for vehicles. If you see a vehicle driving around slowly or parked in front of a neighbor's home, call the constables. Neighbors looking out for neighbors is how we catch criminals. Please put the constables' number in your cell phones 281-463-6666.

**Home Security Inspection:** The constables' office provides a Home Security Inspection service. Sgt. Hutter is specially trained to view your property and make suggestions on how to better secure your homes. In a 30 minute review, he can find security deficiencies that make you vulnerable to crime and recommend improvements that are easy, inexpensive and can make a big impact on your safety. #### Alert Neighbors Stop Crime

In Maplewood South, a homeowner saw a suspicious vehicle backed into a driveway and immediately called Precinct 5. A deputy was dispatched and was able to determine that it was a burglary in progress. A chase ensued and the burglar fled on foot, escaping law enforcement. However, the vehicle left behind produced not only stolen merchandise, but also the name and address of the owner of the vehicle (the burglar). A warrant for his arrest was issued. He showed up in court and was charged for this crime as well as a few other crimes.

This is a good example of "unusual or suspicious behavior" that was immediately reported to the Constables at the time of the occurrence. As you can see, the criminals can and will be caught.

#### Westbury Rain Garden

A rain garden is a garden planted in a low area that can be very wet for a time after a heavy Houston rain event or very dry during a prolonged dry spell. Plants in a rain garden are chosen for their ability to exist under these extreme conditions. Some interested folks in Westbury decided to try this concept on an area on Hillcroft esplanade just south of the Burlinghall crossing. Look for the live oak with the one park bench beneath it.

This garden is a wonderful display of native Texas plants that provide color for months on end. On the high side, there are shrubs and small trees including red bud, Mexican plum, fig, citrus, crape myrtle, native palmetto and autumn sage. In the basin there are crinum lilies, Louisiana iris, tropical yucca, Texas star hibiscus and Candelaria. There is a good stand of bluebonnets now. In the summer you will see the red of the Texas star hibiscus and in late summer the yellow of the spikes of candelaria. #### **Keep Storm Drains Clean & Clear**

Please keep the curb line in front of your house free of leaves by raking and bagging them weekly. It is spring and the oak trees are dropping their leaves and our storm sewers are filling up with them because some homeowners are not keeping their curbs clean. Remember if you use a yard service to tell them not to blow your leaves or debris out into the street. The debris should be bagged or composted. Also, Do NOT blow your leaves into the city esplanades.

This will help get the storm water on its way more quickly. It is important for storm water to be able drain freely and as quickly as possible.

# Remodeling your home? Adding On? Do you know your deed restrictions?

Did you know that the Westbury Civic Club can look over your proposed plans for free before you start construction? We want to avoid deed restriction violations before they happen. Did you know that Westbury 2, Westbury 3, and Westbury 5 have a 25 foot rear setback for the main structure? Did you know that there is a minimum percentage of brick that must be on your home? Did you know that you can't build in front of your building line? We want to help you! We want you to find out about possible violations before it costs you money and time. Several homeowners in the past couple years have had to tear down and/or modify their construction due to deed restriction violations.

The City of Houston does not review deed restrictions when issuing permits. They require a signed affidavit acknowledging that the plans comply with your deed restrictions. This holds YOU, the homeowner, accountable for knowing and complying with your deed restrictions. We are here to help you. All deed restrictions are available online at westburycrier.com.

# Westbury 5 Waterline Replacement

#### **Waterline Replacement in Westbury 5** Starts in August

We are happy to see this Capital Improvement Project (CIP) taking place in Westbury. A very informative meeting was held by District K. Public Works, and the contractor on March 18 to distribute information about the upcoming waterline replacement project that will take place in a portion of Westbury 5 on the following streets:

- Claridge (Braewick to Dunlap)
- Portal (Braewick to Hillcroft)
- Sanford (Braewick to Dunlap)
- Benning (Braewick to Dunlap
- Spellman (Braewick to Dunlap
- Braewick (Vickijohn to Spellman)
- Dunlap (Vickijohn to Spellman)
- Kirkside (West Bellfort to Spellman)

Work on the Westbury portion of this project, entitled the Cambridge Park Waterline Replacement Project, is scheduled to begin in August. Informational door hangers will be hung on door knobs of affected residents about 72 hours before construction begins. Keep

this door hanger as it has important contact information. District K has posted the materials that they distributed at the meeting on their website, http://www.houstontx.gov/council/k/ cambridgepark.html which includes frequently asked questions and a schedule What about French drains? and Special Needs Form.

The FAQ on District K's website will answer many of your questions and concerns. Here are a few of them:

#### What should residents with sprinkler systems be prepared for?

We recommend that you take pictures of the sprinkler heads in the "on" position and be sure the pictures clearly show how many and the location of the sprinklers/ heads that you have in the right of way area near the street/curb. The construction company will make the effort to cap off your sprinklers in the right of way that will be torn up with the intent to keep your sprinklers working in the rest of the yard. The pictures should resolve any questions when it comes time for the construction company to repair them. It is entirely possible your system or at least certain zones may stop working once your vard is dug up as wires do occasionally get clipped. Be sure to have a garden hose and traditional sprinklers ready to use during this period. If you believe that your


sprinklers systems were damaged during construction, please contact the project manager (Scott Ellefson) at 281-705-2251 so that he can investigate and schedule

We also recommend residents take pictures of any drains/pvc tubing that you have going to the sidewalk or to the curb so you have evidence for replacement.

#### What about landscaping near streets, sidewalks and curbs?

Right-of-way does extend well into your vards. You all mow and maintain these areas and consider this area your property. However, the existing roadway right-of-way grants City of Houston full access and utilization to this right of way as deemed necessary. All efforts will be made not to disturb your landscaping during this project. However, if you have extensive landscaping in your yard, some of it may be impacted with the construction. If you have a specific plant you would like to save, we suggest you (personally) relocate such plant materials. Grass will be restored in yards upon completion of all construction.

Call 311 if you see any water line breaks, home flooding, or streets that need repairs.

# **CIP Meeting & Flooding**

Over a dozen Westbury Civic Club (WCC) board members and concerned Westbury residents attended the District K Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) meeting on February 27. The CIP meeting is an annual forum where the City discusses projects planned for our part of town and allows residents to ask questions and make comments or requests. Presentations were made by Public Works, ReBuild Houston, the Parks Dept, and General Services. The CIP process is meant for big ticket capital items like street replacement, major park improvements, waterline and sewer replacements, drainage improvement, libraries, etc.

Becky Edmondson, representing the WCC and the Westbury Super Neighborhood, spoke about flooding, sewage backing up into some homes after heavy rains, and needed street repairs in Westbury. The

WCC presented "Public Input" forms from residents that ReBuild Houston had requested to substantiate flooding issues. From the data gathered, we were able to put together a map to show where floodwaters have entered HOUSES in Westbury. It is our strongest desire to see that no more homes flood in Westbury. The

WCC has asked the city to initiate an engineering study of this problem; the city had been unaware of an issue in this problem area -- west of Chimney Rock along the Willow Waterhole bayou.

We have also asked for street improvements on Hillcroft, Willowbend,

> Ludington, Dryad, and Gasmer. ReBuild Houston has been in the neighborhood with their vehicle checking our streets. Hopefully the worst streets will see some repairs soon.

**WESTBURY RESIDENTS** - It is very important that you take the time to call 311 or use the online application for 311 to report flooding, sewage backup, potholes, missed trash pickup, or

other problems. The City departments use 311 data to determine problem areas. If you don't report problems, then it does not exist on the city radar.

#### CIP meeting update from WCC President, Becky Edmondson:

It is with extreme pleasure that I report that I have received an email from Public Works thanking me for attending the CIP meeting and notifying us that they will be issuing work orders to perform Cleaning and Televising (CTV) of approximately 250,000 linear feet of sewer in the next 6 months. They will then perform rehabilitation based on CTV and field information. We look forward to working with them and we will keep you informed as this process moves forward.






# Willow Waterhole Music Fest 2014



#### **Prairie Plant Rescue**

Over three workdays in February and March thousands of native prairie plants were rescued by volunteers from the Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy, Brays Bayou Association, Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD), Houston Parks and Recreation Department,



and an advisement group that includes Gulf Coast Master Naturalists and the Houston Audubon Society.

Volunteers rescued (dug up) native prairie plants in a portion of the Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve that will be excavated soon by the HCFCD. These plants were then potted into 1 gallon pots and transported to the nearby HISD Hollingsworth Science Center to be stored. They will be planted later at another site in the Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve. More than 3,000 plants were rescued by these hardworking volunteers. On one day alone they rescued 1,125 plants from the site!

# Obituary for Warren Roquet, Past WCC President

Westbury lost another long time resident when past WCC president, Warren Albert Roquet, 93, passed away Monday, February 17, 2014. He served as president from 1963 to 1964. One of the major accomplishments of his presidency was the installation of street lights in Westbury. We are indebted to Warren and his family for their many years of support and civic-mindedness.

He was born August 23, 1920 in Cincinnati, Ohio, to Aloysius "Albert" Roquet and Mary Heintz Roquet. Warren Roquet graduated from Owensville High School (Ohio) in 1938, earned a Degree in Business Administration (BBA) from the University of Cincinnati in 1947, and later earned a law degree (J.D.) from Southern Methodist Law School in Dallas in 1948. On October 23, 1944, he married Miss Gwen Worsham. He was employed by Shell Oil Company from August of 1948 until he retired in 1981. He worked in the Land, Pipeline, Legal, Public Affairs, Government Affairs and Insurance Departments. From 1981 until 1985, he engaged in consulting work as a Petroleum Land and Legal Consultant. Mr. Roquet joined the United States Air Force in August of 1942 and served as a Navigator with the 491st Heavy Bomb Group of the Eighth Air Force in England until 1945. He remained in the Air Force Reserve until he retired from duty at the rank of Colonel. He was a member of the Association of Former Intelligence Officers in the late 1970's and a charter and life member of the Silver Falcons of the United States Air Force Academy since 1974. He is survived by his wife of 69 years: Gwen Worsham Roquet of Houston and 3 generations of children. grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, plus numerous nieces and nephews.

### Importance of Calling 311

Skipped trash pickup, sewage problems, flooding, potholes, broken main lines and broken trash cans are all things that need to be called into the City of Houston at 311. The city uses 311 data to determine problem areas. 311 complaints can be reported by email, by mobile app and by phone. They can be anonymous. The City says that we do not have a flooding problem and that our roads aren't bad. They base this on a lack of 311 calls. Call 311 if your home floods. Call 311 if there is a pothole on your street or any major street you drive on (Willowbend, Hillcroft, etc.). Call 311 if your trash was out on the street curb but was not picked up.

After calling 311, please call the WCC office with the 311 service request number. We might be able to help expedite the process, especially with skipped trash pick up.

# **BARC City Ordinance Changes**

# Changes Coming for City Ordinances about Animal Control

WCC Board members Cindy Chapman, Jennifer Edmondson, and Robert Capps plus Westbury residents Kathy Elder and Kerry Adams attended a District K "Neighborhood 101" workshop on Saturday March 22 to learn about animal control issues and upcoming changes to the city ordinances about animals.

Once known as the Bureau of Animal Regulations and Control, the re-organized city department is now called BARC Animal Shelter and Adoptions. Animal control issues affect quality of life and safety. In 2013 there were more than 2,000 dog bites and HPD shot 34 dogs which were an imminent danger. BARC had more than 50,000 calls for service, yet only about 13,000 calls could be handled with current staffing. This means that more than 200 calls EACH day are not handled. Priority 4 & 5 calls are NOT handled, including calls for assistance where a dog bit another animal, injured yet mobile animals, or stray animals. To resolve this problem, both the mayor and city council want to increase funding for BARC, although funding on a per capita basis will still lag that of other major cities in Texas. During the presentation, District K CM Larry Green stated he hopes that after staffing at BARC has been improved, that District K will be assigned an animal control officer dedicated to solely to District K issues.

Chris Newport has been shepherding discussions with various stakeholders to

create a draft of proposed revisions to the city animal control ordinance. Mr. Newport reviewed the proposed ordinance. The WCC has proposed some fine-tuning of the ordinance directly to Mr. Newport. The changes to the ordinance are scheduled to be voted on by city council at the end of March.

Here are some key points of interest to Westbury:

- ⇒ Get your pet micro-chipped and keep your contact information up-to-date! An animal which has a micro-chip or a city tag will be kept at least 6 days while the city tries to contact the owner or the vet of record. Pets without this will be kept only 3 days minimum.
- The term "owner" has been clarified to make it more difficult for people to claim that they do not "own" an animal and are not responsible for its actions. "Any person who has encouraged the presence of any domestic animal on his property, residence, or premises by providing food and water or other care, or has otherwise accepted caretaker responsibility for the animal for longer than three consecutive days, shall be considered to be the owner of the animal."
- ⇒ Enforcement is allowed by BARC, police officers, or Neighborhood Protection
- ⇒ BARC will not allow a person convicted of animal cruelty to adopt or foster an animal




Acknowledges the need to address problem dogs that are not yet Dangerous Dogs. Therefore 2 new categories of problem dogs have been added: "Aggressive Dogs" and "Public Nuisance Dogs". An investigation will be conducted to determine if a dog is "Aggressive" or a "Public Nuisance". Owners will be required to implement defined actions to abate the nuisance or to keep aggressive dogs under control. For example, if an owner repeatedly allows an animal to escape its backyard, then the dog might be declared a public nuisance and the owner may be ordered to repair the dog's fence.


