The Westbury Civic Club will be continuing its **60th anniversary** celebration on April 24 during the Sunday Music Fest (details on page 19).

Perhaps the most important meeting coming up is on April 21, where the city Public Works & Engineering (PWE)
Department will be hosting a Public Meeting to get public input for a Storm & Street Drainage project that is in the planning stages for the Westbury area. EVERYONE needs to come out for this. If you flooded, if you are concerned about flooding, or if you are concerned about when and how the city plans to do this project, then please come to WHS on April 21. There is power in numbers! After several fitful attempts, the dues solicitation letters were finally generated, stuffed and mailed. If you paid your dues prior to receiving the letter, please disregard! Thanks to all of you who have paid and to those of you who are about to pay! The WCC Board is made up of un-paid volunteers, and knowing that you appreciate the work we do by paying your civic club dues means a lot.

The 2016 WCC dues are just \$50. The Westbury Area Patrol (WAP) fee is \$285. You can pay for both in installments if you prefer. You can write a check (Yes, we know the mailing address is Dallas) or you can pay using PayPal. We know times are tough and some of you are experiencing the pinch of the oil crisis, but the WCC is fiscally responsible and prudent with every dollar you contribute. We are working for you, for a better Westbury.

This seems like a good time to thank all of you who raise your hands and volunteer for the many tasks that need doing around Westbury. Every month an army of Westbury volunteers work on projects that make a Westbury a better place to live. Volunteers work on improving or helping our: Parks and Greenspaces, Security and Public Safety, Community Outreach, Street lighting, Trails, Flooding & Infrastructure, the Westbury HPD Storefront, and dozens of other projects. Volunteers attend meetings and represent Westbury issues. They sit on boards working to make things better. I also want to thank the many residents who came out to the District K 2016 CIP meeting on a dreary night. "Showing up" and "Speaking Up" is often the key to getting things done.

Spring also means it's time to get back to working in the yard. The Yard of the Month judging will resume in April. The azaleas and spring flowers in Westbury were spectacular this year. Every March I think we should have our own local azalea trail. Anyone interested in putting this together, please raise your hand!

We have been approached to participate in a Houston history project, so I have had the past 60 years of Westbury newsletters out again. They are fascinating to read. Our newsletters are a window into a different time. In April of 1960, the first street lights in Westbury were going to be



installed after residents of certain streets raised the required funds to make it happen. Yes, residents had to pay to install our streetlights. In 1956 an article invited everyone out to see the new city water building on Chimney Rock with a room that could be used for community meetings. This building was later re-purposed as a community center and then renamed the Platou Community Center after past-WCC President Leiv Platou and his wife Betty Platou, an advocate for the children at the community center. I heard at the 2016 CIP meeting that the average age of city facilities is 30 years; well, the Platou Center building has doubled that life expectancy and is 60 years old! At the 2016 CIP meeting, we asked again for a new community center to replace the aging Platou Center.

Sixty years ago, in 1956, Westbury had just begun. There were no trees, except for the ones planted by the builders. There were no street lights. The City had not yet annexed us, and we were at the far edge of suburbia. There were fields surrounding us. We had no fire station, no churches, and no schools. Hillcroft didn't have a bridge over Brays Bayou! Sixty years later it is hard to imagine those early days. I want to thank the residents who have been sending pictures and stories of the early years in Westbury. We will start featuring more of them soon. If you are an original resident or early settler, and plan to come to the Willow Waterhole Music Fest on Sunday April 24, please let us know so that we can recognize you.

I hope to see you at these April events! Becky Edmondson



Annual CIP Meeting

Advocating for Westbury at Annual CIP Meetings

Every year the city hosts meetings in each council district to provide information about planned city capital projects for the coming 5-10 years, and to receive feedback from citizens and neighborhood groups about issues and needs. Mayor Sylvester Turner attended each of the 11 meetings this year.



Every year the WCC, the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation (WAIC), and the Westbury Super Neighborhood prepare a long WRITTEN list of concerns and requests, but it is also helpful to be seen at heard at these meetings. WCC President Becky Edmondson attended both the District F and District K meetings. More than a dozen Westbury residents attended the meeting for District K, even though it was held on a rainy night at the very edge of Houston down in Ft. Bend County. Thanks to Becky Edmondson, Cindy Chapman, Marcia Hartman, Jennifer Edmondson, and Virginia Livingston for attending for the WCC Board. Other Westbury residents in the audience included: New resident Rancy Lee, who is interested in bike trails; Hazel Potvin who spoke about the many needs of Westbury parks and the Platou center; 3 residents from flooded areas - Vicki Davison, a man from Beaudry, and Jane Falk from Beaudry; Precinct worker Mrs. Clements and her daughter; Nancy Stewart who was recovering from chemo but attended anyway; Jennifer Ferguson; precinct judge Priscilla Bloomquist; and lighting advocate Steve Goldberg.

WCC President Becky Edmondson expressed distress that Westbury 3 was not included in the storm drain plans displayed for the Westbury area, even though some homes in this area have had repeated structural flooding. After her speech, she was asked to speak to representatives of Public Works & Engineering (PWE), who were at the meeting, including Dale Rudick, the director of PWE.

PWE plans to hold a meeting in the Westbury area to discuss the topic. The Westbury storm drainage project is in the preliminary design phase. The public meeting is designed to gather community input regarding the storm drainage project. It is recommended that ALL residents within the Westbury subdivision attend the meeting. For more information about this project, e-mail pweplanning@houstontx.gov and reference the Westbury Area Storm Drainage project. Flooding in Westbury

Flooding in Westbury (extracted from a letter submitted to the City and to the County March 2016)

At the 2016 District K CIP meeting, the Westbury Civic Club submitted a letter requesting storm drain improvements for areas in Westbury that experience **routine structural flooding**. We first spoke about this topic at the 2012 CIP meeting. Since 2012, there have been 3 additional times when homes in Westbury have had structural flooding. Additionally, there has been non-residential structural flooding along Gasmer near Chimney Rock at the Shell Research Center and Westbury High School.

ISSUES

A. Aged and Inadequate City Storm Drainage System. Design Standards.

The streets and storm water drainage system in Westbury were built in the 1950s and 1960s. The residential problem area is from West Airport to West Bellfort and from Chimney Rock to Braewick with the hardest hit area between Hillcroft and Chimney Rock. In 2014/15 the majority of Westbury was pre-engineered for new storm drains. In 2015 a map was displayed at the District K CIP meeting showing that problem areas in Westbury were scheduled to have new storm drains. However, that information from 2015 has turned out to be false, as the Westbury stormwater projects appear unfunded and unplanned. When the city implements new storm water drainage in the Westbury area in the future, we urge the city to use designs that utilize the best practices from across the nation and internationally. It would be a huge waste of time and money to re-do the stormwater infrastructure in Westbury and still have a deficient system. We have heard complaints from other nearby neighborhoods which have had their streets and drainage recently redone.

B. Drainage Problem along Gasmer and Chimney Rock There is also a problem with the drainage along Chimney Rock and Gasmer. Both Westbury High School and the Shell Research Center on Gasmer in Westbury experienced structural flooding in May and October of 2015. The Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) is nearing completion of the Willow Waterhole Detention Basins on both sides of Gasmer. Also, the Houston Independent School District (HISD) is currently designing a new building wing for Westbury High School plus new ballfields with additional parking. It makes no sense to us that this new construction for Westbury High School will tie into an overloaded city drainage system on Gasmer or Dryad that flows AWAY from the new HCFCD detention basins. Instead, the Gasmer drainage flows toward Chimney Rock, an area with known flooding problems, and then the Chimney Rock drainage ties into Willow Waterhole Bayou that flows TOWARD the new HCFCD detention basins. Perhaps a simple re-routing of water would fix some of the problems.

C. Reconstruction of Fondren Road

We believe the City / County should add more detention upstream of Westbury to alleviate the flooding in Westbury. For example, Fondren Road is upstream of Westbury and is planned to be reconstructed. We understand NO additional detention is being planned other than some increase in holding capacity under the road to offset the additional construction. The city should seek opportunities such as this to maximize the amount of detention under the road and sidewalks, both under Fondren Road and under all other new roads and sidewalks.


D. Additional detention upstream of Westbury / Willow Waterhole Bayou The Fondren Southwest area is higher than Westbury and uses the Fondren Diversion Channel ditch to route stormwater toward Brays Bayou. However, there is a small dam at the western edge of Westbury that allows water to overflow from the Fondren area into the Westbury area via the Willow Waterhole Bayou when water levels start rising in the Fondren Diversion Channel. We request that the city and county investigate the design and function of this small dam. We also request that the city and county investigate adding detention upstream of Westbury.

E. County and City Working Together

We would love to see the county and city working more closely together to make sure that our existing stormwater systems work as efficiently as possible. As a neighborhood, we sometimes see problems where the two systems connect. We believe that opportunities exist to improve maintenance issues between these connections. We also believe that the design of our city stormwater systems could be improved by reviewing and enhancing city design standards for streets, sidewalks, and development.



Trash Can Placement

*Household garbage must be put inside the city-provided container which should be placed at the curb between 6PM Wednesday evening and 7AM Thursday morning.

*Do NOT place trashcans in the street.

*The container must be accessible to the automated collection truck and not blocked by obstacles, including parked cars.



*Homeowners with multiple trashcans MUST place trashcans three (3) feet apart.

*Do not place cans next to light poles or trees.

The city has started tagging cans that are placed incorrectly. Homes on corners must place their trash cans on the front street (not side). Trash cans must be removed from the curb by 10PM Thursday.

Q: What is the deal about Garage Sales and Estate Sales in Westbury? Why can't I have one? Why aren't they allowed?

A: For many years, the Westbury Civic Club has hosted two community garage sales per year, the White Elephant Sale. The sales are awesome! The next White Elephant sale will be held on April 16 at Westbury United Methodist Church. It is far safer location than hosting an event at your home where complete strangers can look at your belongings, your security system, and know whether or not you have kids or are elderly. Individual sales also give possible thieves an excuse to be cruising the neighborhood. Newsletter articles in the Westbury Crier from as far back as 1962 ask residents in Westbury to not hold garage sales. A WCC board policy explains the many nuisances associated with these type sales. "Nuisance" use of property is forbidden in the deed restrictions. Also, these sales can violate the "non-residential use" of the deed restrictions.

Q: Can I build a fence in front of my house?

A: The answer for most homes in Westbury is NO! However, depending on where your home sits in relation to your front building line, a fence might be possible as long as it is NOT in front of the front setback line, whether it is 25 or 35 feet. If you have a corner home, the rules are different. When in doubt or if you have any questions, please call the WCC Office at 713-723-5437. We are here to

Information from this gauge can be found at www.harriscountyfws.org/. The name of the new gauge is: Gauge 445 (the full name is "D112 445 Willow Water Hole @ Landsdowne Drive").


This new gauge will report rainfall amounts every 15 minutes when raining and will also report the water level in Willow Waterhole Bayou. There is a "Near Top of Bank" and "Out of Bank" feature on the overall map.

Willowbend Construction Update

Keep Storm Drains Clean & Clear

If you have a storm drain inlet in the street in front of your home, check it regularly. You should remove any debris including newspapers, twigs and leaves from the grates. Also, look inside and see if you have standing water. If your storm drain is full of water and if has NOT rained recently, report to 311 for storm drain cleaning and maintenance.

Please keep the curb line in front of your house free of leaves by raking and bagging them weekly. It is spring and the oak trees are dropping their leaves, and our storm sewers are filling up with them because some homeowners are not keeping their curbs clean. Remember if you use a yard service to tell them not to blow your leaves or debris out into the street. The debris should be bagged or composted.

This will help get the storm water on its way more quickly. It is important for storm water to be able drain freely and as quickly as possible. Clogged drains slow water flow and cause flooding.

On Monday 3/21, heavy equipment was back at Westbury Square to remove the debris from demolition work done on February 2. We do not know what the demolition schedule is for the remaining buildings at Westbury Square.





Do NOT Recycle Glass in Big Green Bins **NEW Contract for Recycling Approved**

Good news! Houston City Council voted and approved a two-year, \$5,758,000 contract with Waste Management to continue providing uninterrupted, bi-weekly curbside recycling services to City of Houston residents on March 23.

As agreed upon in the contract, the only change in service that Houstonians can expect to see is the elimination of glass from the list of items that are acceptable green bins, effective immediately. Items that will still be accepted include paper, cardboard, plastics and metal cans. Please do NOT put glass item in your green recycle bin. Take glass items to a depository (preferred) or put it in the trash.

Glass will be accepted for recycling at Neighborhood Depositories. The two locations closest to Westbury are:

- * 5900 Westpark, 77057
- * 10785 SW Freeway, 77074

Glass is **NOT** currently accepted at the Environmental Service Center (ESC) at 11500 S Post Oak. If there is a change in the glass recycling policy, we'll let you know.



ZIKA Virus

Outbreaks of Zika have been reported recently in the Americas. Because the mosquitoes that spread Zika virus are found throughout the world, it is likely that outbreaks will continue to spread. Here are 5 things that you really need to know about the Zika virus.

- 1. Zika is primarily spread through infected mosquito bites. Many areas in the United States have the type of mosquitoes that can become infected with and spread Zika virus.
- 2. The best way to prevent Zika is to prevent mosquito bites. Protect yourself from mosquitoes by wearing long-sleeved shirts and long pants outside. When inside, stay in places with air conditioning or that use window and door screens to keep mosquitoes outside. Use insect repellents approved by the EPA (not on infants less than 2 months old)
- 3. Infection with Zika during pregnancy is linked to birth defects in **babies.** There have been reports of a serious birth defect of the brain called microcephaly (a birth defect in which the size of a baby's head is smaller than expected for age and sex) in babies of mothers who were infected with Zika virus while pregnant. Avoid getting bitten by mosquitos. If you have a male partner who lives in or has traveled to an area where Zika is spreading, either do not have sex or use condoms the right way every time during your pregnancy.
- 4. Pregnant women should delay travel to areas where Zika is spreading. Until more is known, CDC recommends that pregnant women consider postponing travel to any area where Zika virus is spreading. If you must travel to one of these areas, talk to your healthcare provider first and strictly follow steps to prevent mosquito bites during the trip.
- 5. Returning travelers infected with Zika can spread the virus through mosquito bites. During the first week of infection, Zika virus can be found in the blood and passed from an infected person to a mosquito through mosquito bites. The infected mosquito must live long enough for the virus to multiply and for the mosquito to bite another person.



LOCAL FARM STAND

Buy Fresh, Locally-Grown Veggies Right In Your Neighborhood

Beginning on Saturday, April 9, farm stand sales of fresh, locally-grown vegetables will be held each weekend at the Westbury Community Garden. These veggies are grown right in the neighborhood and are produced by the farmers with "Plant It Forward Farms."

Weekends, starting April 9 Saturdays 9 AM to NOON Sundays 11 AM to 3:30 PM

Westbury Pocket Prairie

Did you know in addition to all the incredible things at the Westbury Community Garden site, there is also a pocket prairie? About an acre of land has been set aside for a prairie so that native grasses and Texas wildflowers can flourish. If you are interested in wildflowers, you can find this prairie at Greencraig and Dunlap. The best time for visiting is in the morning when flowers are fully opened. Flowers like spiderwort, evening primrose, fleabanes, dandelions, lyre leaf sage, penstemon and skullcap started to show up in March. In April, we expect a display of the

winecups, herbertia (a tiny iris), liatris, milkweed, and rudbeckia. We are hoping the Texas cone flower and the Baptisia will bloom this year.

Why do we set aside a wildflower area? Promoting the growth of native wildflowers and grasses is good for pollinators, birds and small mammals. Besides the well-known honey bee, many other bees, butterflies and other insects function to help pollinate plants. Rather 12581 Dunlap (77035) is off Hillcroft than destroying them with insecticides and rather than keeping grass mowed, we strive to encourage and preserve natural conditions through the growth of native grasses and plants at the Westbury Pocket Prairie.

If you are interested in knowing more about Texas wildflowers, come join us for a walk on Saturday mornings at 9AM. Park along Greencraig and bring a camera to record what you see. Noreen Hoard and I are members of the Native Plant Society and the Native Prairie Society. We will gladly explore with you.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY WCG

The Westbury Community Garden (WCG) just celebrated its sixth birthday with two celebrations. Attendees of the first celebration enjoyed birthday cake while viewing Noreen Hoard's informative slide show on

the flowers of the WCG Pocket Prairie. The second celebration was held at the garden and District K Chief of Staff Donald Perkins presented the WCG with a Certificate of Appreciation. The garden then presented him with 4 wonderful green chairs, which were donated to the garden in memory of Larry Green's mother, and to thank him for his support of the garden.

Becky Edmondson attended the celebration at the garden and had this to say: "It's hard to believe that just six years ago this site was an empty, weedy unused seven acres of land. It is now an oasis. I can't help but think how far and how much has been accomplished in six short years. The orchard planted on Earth Day 2010, with help from the Houston Astros, is well established. The 60 raised beds are well tended and the aisles weed free. Bluebonnets line the entry way through the certified wildflower



butterfly garden. Habi, one of the Plant-It-Forward refugee farmers proudly showed me his farm and produce. It is truly an amazing place; well-loved and well-cared for by a group of dedicated and talented gardeners."


Speedier Way to Apply for Speed Bumps

On March 21, the Public Works & Engineering (PWE) Department announced a speedier way for neighborhoods to apply for "speed humps", more commonly known as "speed bumps". The change would only apply for residential streets, where the speed bumps are practical. During the Transportation, Technology & Infrastructure committee meeting, PWE said that they would not longer require the lengthy traffic and speeding studies for the approval process. The streamlined approval process means that traffic calming devices will be installed for less money and faster.

Under the new process, when requests are made for speed bumps, then PWE will evaluate a 10 to 20 square block area to propose a traffic plan for that entire area. PWE will then submit their recommendations to the local city councilmember. Almost all of Westbury is in District K represented by CM Larry Green. The councilmember may seek additional feedback before approval. After approval, then PWE will plan the timeline for construction.

The old way took up to 9 months for approval. The new method may decrease the approval time to as few as 2 months. The councilmember will have more control over the process. If additional feedback or studies are requested, then the approval time may be longer. The cost of each speed hump is about \$5,000.

Westbury residents are encouraged to contact 311 to request speed bumps in your area. Please also let the WCC know that you have submitted a request. The WCC will compile a list of all the streets that have outstanding requests on them and monitor the progress. We know there are a number of streets in Westbury that would be made safer by the addition of speed bumps. Keep in mind that our neighborhood is HUGE and it is far larger than most Houston neighborhoods. At this time, we are not sure how the revised speed bump request system will be affected by planned future work by PWE to replace certain Westbury streets and storm water drainage piping.


