Are YOU Recycling RIGHT?

All Westbury homes are part of the City of Houston recycling program. Houston has single stream recycling, which means you do not have to separate your recyclables. Recycling is picked up every other Thursday in Westbury (Schedule A). Every home has a big green rolling can for CITY APPROVED RECYCLABLE ITEMS. Just because an item is technically recyclable does not meant the City of Houston allows it in their recycling stream.

Plastic bags are NOT allowed in your recycling can. Do NOT bag your recyclables in trash bags or plastic grocery store bags. These items are NOT recyclable.

Alyce Coffey with the COH Solid Waste Department attended the March WCC board meeting and expressed how important it is to recycle correctly. The City is experiencing extremely high contamination in the recycling. The current contamination rate for the City of Houston is approximately 45% which is extremely high. If a load is too contaminated with non-recyclable items, then the entire load ends up diverted to landfill instead of being recycled. The biggest culprit is plastic bags—trash bags and plastic grocery store bags.

DO NOT PUT YOUR RECYLCING IN ANY TYPE OF BAG.

The City is starting a pilot recycling enforcement program in the Heights area. WCC board members expressed the need for such a program in SW Houston as well. The WCC office manager was recently driving down a street in a nearby subdivision (not Westbury) and was shocked to see over 20 recycling cans in a row ALL with plastic trash bans or wrong items (fencing, lamps, extension cords) sticking out the tops visible from the

Message from the Westbury Civic Club President

Westbury has some of the nicest people in the world. I want to personally thank all the people who dropped by to bring their Westbury Civic Club and Constable Patrol payments during the March drivethru dues event. It was great to see you! I also want to thank the many residents who have already paid their dues for 2021. Your financial support helps keep Westbury as one of the safest, greenest, and most desirable neighborhoods in Houston. It says a lot about a community when so many people voluntarily contribute to pay for the amenities we deserve for our neighborhood.

As more and more people get vaccinated, it is our hope that we will be able to host more events and more activities. Our April event will be outdoors. The annual Keep Houston Beautiful workday event will be on Saturday, April 10 (see page 1 & 8). This will be our monthly Working on Westbury day as well. I hope to see you there!

Westbury also has some of the nicest volunteers and board members. Half the fun and satisfaction of volunteering is the feeling of camaraderie and friendship while doing activities together. Yet over the past year, the WCC board members and volunteers persevered alone, online or on the phone, still getting things done and still staying involved. Our board members have certainly gotten used to participating via online meetings; multiple board members were "at" the March WCC board meeting, while they were actually out of town on vacation for Spring Break!

It has been a year since the COVID-19 pandemic began impacting everyday life. On March 10, 2020, Becky Edmondson and I waited for 5 hours to speak at Harris County Commissioners Court on behalf of the Constable Patrol Program, sitting shoulder to shoulder in a packed meeting room.

I will never forget that County Judge Lina Hidalgo discussed the potential dangers of COVID-19 during that meeting, and several days later, the 2020 Houston Rodeo was cancelled after the first cases were discovered in Houston. It seems hard to imagine that the meeting I attended with Becky at Commissioners Court would be the last indoor meeting I would attend for more than 12 months! I use an online calendar, color-coded to distinguish between meetings or health appointments or birthdays/ anniversaries, and after that date my calendar shows "cancelled" for meeting after meeting after meeting. It took a while for organizations to figure out how to do online meetings, and now my calendar is packed again. Although online meetings are convenient, I look

forward to having meetings again in person. The WCC board is in discussions about when to resume in-person board meetings. For community advocacy, often the most important part of the meeting is actually the pre-meeting and the post-meeting, which is the time to meet people and find out if there are common interests to work together on.

During those early Stay-At-Home orders, my husband and I were grateful that we lived in a safe, pleasant neighborhood where we could walk outside and that we were so close to the trails and natural. expanses of Willow Waterhole. Those daily walks worked off a lot of stress and worry and my doctor says I am in better shape than I was a year ago. During those walks, my husband and I have tried to be more observant and enjoy finding and identifying birds and other wildlife during our excursions. I also began learning the piano as an adult, about 50 years after taking piano lessons way back in the 4th grade!

My husband and I are now both fully vaccinated and are looking forward to visiting distant relatives we have not seen in more than a year. We were on waiting lists for a long time and I found it helpful to join a "vaccine hunter" group on Facebook with tips to find an appointment. Since it can still be hard to obtain a vaccination appointment, we have provided information and tips to help you obtain a vaccination on page 15. I hope by the time that this newsletter is delivered that vaccinations will be more readily available and easier to obtain. All adults are now eligible for the vaccine in Texas.


→ NEW Library Update

Trash, yard waste, recycling, and heavy trash are picked up by the City of Houston.

Regular Household Trash

Pick-up is EVERY Thursday. Regular household trash goes into the black trash can.

Yard Waste

Pick-up is EVERY week either on Thursday or Saturday or any day the City decides to come by. Yard Waste MUST be placed in the correct City bio-degradable bags.

Recycling in Westbury

All of Westbury recycles on Schedule A. Recycling is every other week. Recycling goes into the green trash can.



Why Support the WCC?

Westbury is a unique neighborhood. While all 5,000 homes in our Westbury neighborhood have active deed restrictions, only 463 have mandatory assessments. This means the Westbury Civic Club heavily relies on voluntary financial contributions from residents.

Westbury has historically had strong voluntary support because residents understood the great benefits of the WCC and our programs. The past several years contributions to the Westbury Civic Club and Westbury Area Patrol have been down. By working together, we can meet the challenges head on and keep our neighborhood the jewel that it is. We all want a safe, flood free neighborhood with great schools and nice neighbors!

The total amount for the **2021 Voluntary dues** are \$360. That is less than a dollar a day! The Westbury Civic Club dues are \$60 for the year. The WCC suggests a contribution of \$300 for the Westbury Area Patrol (a paid contract with Precinct 5 Constables).

Why are Westbury Dues Mailed to a Dallas Address?

You are mailing your payments directly to our bank's processing center in Dallas. This allows your payments to be processed immediately. You may also drop off the payment directly to the WCC Office or pay online at www.westburycrier.com

You may choose any amount to

pay in any increment throughout

the year.

Here are a few examples:

2 payments of \$180 is \$360/yr

3 payments of \$120 is \$360/yr

4 payments of \$90 is \$360/yr

NEW ONLINE RESIDENT PORTAL COMING SOON

We have heard from our residents that they would like to have better options for communications with and payments to the Westbury Civic Club. We agree! We are excited to announce that the WCC is transitioning to a new property management software which adds some features that you residents have been requesting.

We will have a single portal where homeowners can make online payments, view payment history, view important documents, submit requests, and update contact information. The new system will make it easier for you to contact us, and for us to contact you and to be able to track your requests or concerns. There will be more payment options available, including the ability to set up auto-pay scheduled payments.

The office is currently working on the transfer of data and we should have the new system up and running for you early in 2021, Future Criers will have detailed instructions on how to access and use the new system.

In the meantime for those of you that like to pay your dues early, please continue to use the dues form below or paypal.com. You can still pay your dues through our website, www.westburycrier.com.

FEMA Deadline for TX Winter Storm April 20. 2021

FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) has made federal emergency aid available to supplement recovery efforts due to the winter storm which began on February 11, 2021.

The DEADLINE to apply for FEMA assistance is April 20, 2021, for damage done by SNOW / ICE. If you have insurance, you must file a claim first with your insurance company. You will need to provide FEMA with: identification, insurance determination letter, and proof of occupancy or ownership. More detailed information is available at www.fema.gov/disaster/4586

To apply to FEMA: The fastest and easiest way to apply is at www.disasterassistance.gov and then selecting "Apply Online." During the application process, please be sure to select the cause of damage as snow/ice. If you have insurance and are applying for disaster assistance, you must file a claim with your insurance company as soon as possible. By law, FEMA cannot duplicate benefits for losses covered by insurance. If insurance does not cover all your damage, you may be eligible for federal assistance.

Here is some advice from Lone Star Legal Aid


- → Consider filing an application for FEMA assistance even if you don't think you need it at the time. This can help document your damage in case you need FEMA's help later.
- → Keep all the papers you get from FEMA.
- → Keep receipts that show how you spend the money FEMA gives you.
- → When FEMA gives you money, they will tell you how you should use it.
- → Only use FEMA money for things FEMA tells you to spend.
- → Be sure to claim the full value of your damaged home or property, even if it exceeds FEMA or insurance limits.



Parking Violation Safe Passable Sidewalk.

When you park your vehicle in your driveway, do you block the sidewalk? Did you know it is a violation of city ordinance to block a public sidewalk? You can be ticketed and have to pay a fine for parking your vehicle if/when it blocks a public sidewalk.

Be a good neighbor and keep the sidewalks open for pedestrians. Avoid having to pay a parking violation ticket.



IRS Extends Tax Deadline for Texas Residents due to Winter Storm

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has announced that taxpayers in all 254 counties of Texas now have until June 15, 2021, to file various individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. This includes Individuals and households that reside or have a business in any of these counties. This extended IRS deadline is because FEMA declared that the entire state of Texas was a disaster area due to the February winter storms that began on February 11, 2021.

The declaration permits the IRS to postpone certain tax-filing and tax-payment deadlines for taxpayers who reside or have a business in the disaster area. For instance, certain deadlines falling on or after February 11, 2021, and before June 15, 2021, are postponed through June 15, 2021. This includes 2020 business returns, normally due on March 15 and individual and business returns normally due on April 15. It also includes the special March 1 filing and payment deadline for farmers and fishermen who forgo making estimated tax payments.

Taxpayers also have until June 15 to make 2020 IRA contributions.

The June 15, 2021 deadline applies to the first quarter estimated tax payment due on April 15. It also applies to the quarterly payroll and excise tax returns normally due on April 30, 2021. In addition, it applies to tax-exempt organizations, operating on a calendar year basis, that have a 2020 return due on May 17, 2021. In addition, penalties on deposits due on or after February 11, 2021, and before February 26, 2021, will be abated as long as the tax deposits were made by February 26, 2021.

If an affected taxpayer receives a late filing or late payment penalty notice from the IRS that has an original or extended filing, payment or deposit due date that falls within the postponement period, the taxpayer should call the telephone number on the notice to have the IRS abate the penalty. For information on services currently available, visit the IRS operations and services page at IRS.gov/coronavirus.

The IRS automatically identifies taxpayers located in the covered disaster area and applies filing and payment relief. But affected taxpayers who reside or have a business located outside the covered disaster area should call the IRS disaster hotline at 866-562-5227 to request this tax relief.

Buying or Refinancing a Home in Westbury?

Recently there has been a kerfuffle in the news and social media about administrative fees that the Westbury Civic Club requests when a home is refinanced or purchased. During these events, the title company asks the WCC to provide information about the property being refinanced or purchased. These fees are not hidden; they are described and listed on the website of the Westbury Civic Club in an open and public manner. We believe it is our duty to respond to these requests for information by the title companies. If we did not respond, then our homeowners would face difficulty in obtaining and providing the information requested by the title companies. The WCC fees are similar to (and sometimes lower) than fees charged by other civic organizations in the area. The fees do not apply if a transaction occurs without a request made to us by a title company.

Here is the information posted on the WCC website:

Fees: All properties in Westbury are subject to fees when a property transfers or refinances. These administrative fees cover our expenses of providing any information requested and then changing/updating our records as needed. Types of information requested are any assessments owed or paid, property conditions, current violations and/or general information about the Westbury Civic Club. These requests must be made in writing by either the owner of the property, the owner's agent, buyer, or buyer's agent. All requests will be responded to within 10 business days.

Transfer Fee: \$125

A transfer occurs when the property is changing ownership. Payment is usually made at closing and is made with the title company who forwards payment to the Westbury Civic Club.

Refinance Fee: \$75

A refinance occurs when the property is not changing hands but the owner is refinancing the loan. Payment is usually made at closing and is made with the title company who forwards payment to the Westbury Civic Club.

Resale Certificate: \$100

A resale certificate is not currently required by the Civic Club, but can be requested by the owner, owner's agent, buyer or buyer's agent. Resale certificates include the Deed Restrictions for the section of Westbury that the property lies in, the By-Laws of the WCC, documents proving solvency, the policies of the WCC, and more. The fee must be paid at the time of request. Please complete the Resale Certificate Request Form on the Forms Page and deliver to the WCC office with payment.

RUSH Resale Certificate: \$150

A RUSH request is defined as the Certificate being needed within 3 business days of the official request via the Resale Certificate Request Form on the Forms Page.

Request for HOA Fees and Account Status

All requests for financial status of a property account must be made in writing. You may email your request to the WCC office at westburycc@sbcglobal.net. We do not accept requests made over the phone.

Buyer Information

It is very important that correct and current information for buyers is provided to WCC at the time of transfer so that we may provide the new owners with important correspondence about their new property. When a cash sale is completed, please provide New Owner Contact Information on the Forms Page, for cash sales at the time of transfer.

New HPD Chief Announced

Troy Finner has been promoted to be new Chief of the Houston Police Department (HPD). Chief Finner grew up in Houston and has served 31 years with HPD. City Council approved the appointment on March 24, and the promotion will take effect on Monday, April 5, 2021. Outgoing Chief Art Acevedo is leaving HPD for the Miami Police Department.

Previously, Chief Finner was an Executive Assistant
Chief with HPD in charge of field and support
operations. This responsibility encompassed 15
Patrol Divisions, Traffic Enforcement, Emergency
Communications, Mental Health Division, and the
Gang Division. Chief Troy Finner is very familiar with
Westbury and southwest Houston since he grew up in
southwest Houston and has served at both the South-

"Executive Assistant Chief Finner is highly regarded in the Houston Police Department and has earned the trust and respect of our diverse community. He possesses a style of leadership best described as quiet with a strong demeanor," said Mayor Turner. "He has never hesitated to lead from the front during major events, civil unrest, and protests. He embraces the use of technology and data-driven analysis in the reduction of crime."

Security and Crime Updates

Crime Stats in SW Houston Explained

The March PIP meeting had a presentation on HPD Internal Affairs and the process when complaints are made against officers. Commander Holladay provided an update on crime statistics. Comparing crime in the Southwest division from January through February of 2020 to 2021 most violent crime, i.e., rape, murder and robbery, were down. However, aggravated assaults were up 34%. When averaged together, violent crime was up 11%. Nonviolent crime was down in all categories except Burglary of buildings. This was up 78% and attributed to the number of businesses that were closed during the winter storm which left many without working alarm systems due to the power and internet outages. Burglary of habitations were down as were BMVs (Burglary of Motor Vehicles). Non-violent crime showed an overall decrease of 10%.



DEA National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

April 24 is "National Prescription Drug Take Back Day". The DEA provides this opportunity for people to take back their unused prescription drugs. A 2018 study showed that a majority of abused prescription drugs were obtained from family and friends and often from the home medicine cabinet. A list of special locations will be available at https://takebackday.dea.gov/.

Meanwhile, we are lucky that nearby Walgreens at 5300 N. Braeswood and CVS at 5430 Bissonnet will take back your unused RX drugs anytime.

Speeding in Westbury

Do we sound like a broken record? No street in Westbury has a speed limit over 35 MPH. The majority of our streets (with the exception of Hillcroft, West Bellfort, Chimney Rock, and West Airport) are all 30 MPH. With so many people still working remotely and going to school remotely, our streets are full of walkers, joggers, and bikers.

On Saturday, March 20, there were TWO major accidents in Westbury. One was on West Bellfort and the other at the Willowbend and Chimney Rock intersection. We have asked, through HPD open records, for information on the accidents at Willowbend and Chimney Rock as these have become regular occurrences. We would like to see if there is a pattern to these violent crashes.

For West Bellfort, we have asked through our City Council office to have a traffic study to see if a light at West Bellfort and Burdine is warranted. Students from Westbury High School have to cross this uncontrolled intersection to get to the bus stop. Burdine will also be the street to access the new District K library on Belrose.

Yard Parking is NOT Allowed in Westbury

It is a violation of city ordinance to park any vehicle on the front or side yard of a residential property in Westbury.

Sec. 28-303. Parking of vehicles prohibited in certain residential areas. It shall be an offense for any person to park or to cause, suffer or permit the parking of a vehicle or equipment on any surface that is not an improved surface as defined in this article, within any front or side yard of a single-family residence in a residential area subject to this section.

After hearing numerous complaints about vehicles parked on the grass, in 2009, the City of Houston enacted an ordinance to allow communities to opt-in to an ordinance to regulate the practice of vehicles parked in the front or side yard. City Council noted that parking vehicles on the front or side yard has "a negative effect on the aesthetics of single-family residential areas affected by such practices and the property values of residences in those affected areas". The Westbury Civic Club applied to the program, public notices were made as required, and a hearing was conducted. In November 2009, the Prohibited Yard-Parking ordinance went into effect in all parts of Westbury.

How are violations handled? Report yard-parking violations to the HPD officers at the Southwest HPD Station at 832-394-0400. Photographs of violations are accepted to help document the problem. It is helpful to record the license plate and make/model of the offending vehicle.

Air Quality Workshop

Are you concerned about the quality of the air we breathe? Girl Scout Maddy Vanlandingham is concerned and for her Girl Scout gold project, she is doing something about it. She planted ten trees at the Willow Waterhole and has been working to get an Air quality monitor set up at the Willow Waterhole. She also hosted a community workshop on March 30.



The workshop was entitled: Air Quality and Environmental Justice in the Energy Capital. A copy of this workshop will be available on the WAIC website, www.westbury37waic.org as well as the Westbury Houston Facebook page.

The Greater Houston area faces unique air quality challenges and environmental justice challenges. Houston is home to over 400 chemical and manufacturing facilities, over 150 concrete batch plants, and more than 140 metal recycling facilities that can expose residents to harmful air pollutants. Moreover, it is estimated that, because of population growth, there will be 61% more vehicles on the road by 2045. The absence of adequate land-use policies contributes to many residents living, working and playing in close proximity to these sources of air pollution. However, the exposure to these hazards is not distributed equally. Houston's communities of color and working-class

neighborhoods are disproportionately impacted by air pollution and experience vast inequities in health outcomes, including differences in life expectancy of more than 20 years between some communities.

Speakers—

Bakeyah S. Nelson, PhD, is the Executive Director of Air Alliance Houston - a research-based nonprofit organization working to reduce the public health impacts of air pollution and advance environmental justice in the Houston Region. Dr. Nelson has been working to reduce environmental inequities in Houston communities for 15 years. She was recently honored as the 2020 Texas Energy Summit's Clean Air Champion of the Year.

Hanadi Rifai, PhD, P.E., is a professor in the Civil and Environmental Engineering Department at the University of Houston. She currently serves as the Director of the Environmental Graduate program, and is the Associate Dean for Research and Facilities.

COVID Vaccines – Now Available to ALL Adults

There are three COVID-19 vaccines that have been given emergency approval in the United States. Moderna and Pfizer are both two shot regimes while the Johnson & Johnson vaccine is just one shot.

Effective on March 29, the State of Texas lowered the eligibility age for COVID-19 vaccinations so that ALL adults are now eligible to receive the vaccine. Persons between 16 and 18 are also eligible, but only the Pfizer vaccine can be used for someone who is 16 to 18 years old. Reminder: the federal government is providing all COVID-19 vaccines for FREE, regardless of your immigration or health insurance status.

As of March 14, over half a million people in Harris County have been fully vaccinated against Covid-19 and another half million are partially vaccinated.

Tips to Sign-up for Appointments or Waitlists

Finding a vaccine can be a challenge involving signing up for multiple waitlists or searching pharmacy websites for available appointments. Most locations will require an appointment. Providing your cell phone number will help you get text alerts and reminders.

Government or Hospital Waitlists – You are allowed to sign up for as many waitlists as you want to be on! You do not have to live in that county or be a patient of a hospital system to be on their waiting lists since the vaccines are provided to them from the federal government via the state of Texas. Vaccines are FREE.



New Security Cameras to be Installed

The Willow Waterhole, like all Houston greenspaces, has its share of illegal dumping, vandalism, and illegal use of motorized vehicles.

A major evolutionary step is occurring at the Greenway with the addition of cameras. Bruce Krewinghaus, an area resi-



dent and Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy (WWGC) member has donated monies to enable the WWGC to purchase some strategically placed security cameras. These satellite enabled cameras will be high definition color. When the WWGC posted the need for additional community donations to fund satellite service from Comcast and a subscription to software that will allow for real time viewing along with storage to retrieve history, Westbury resident and longtime WWGC volunteer Margaret Greene, stepped up to cover the first year annual cost. Donations and membership fees continue to make the Willow Waterhole better and better.

City Nature Challenge 2021

Observe and Record Wild Species from April 30–May 3

Join The Nature Conservancy in Texas, the Houston Museum of Natural Science, Bayou Land Conservancy, Audubon Society, Texas Master Naturalists, Texas Parks and Wildlife, and many others in a fun challenge to observe and record wild species from April 30 – May 3, 2021. It is easy to participate by making observations on your own using the iNaturalist app.

Cities around the world will compete to see which urban area has the most nature and the most engaged residents! Nearly 200 cities around the world will participate, including 14 metro areas in Texas! Be part of a global challenge to see which city can document the most wildlife species. The data generated will help researchers, land managers, and policy makers.

With the iNaturalist app, you just take a picture of a plant or animal, and the community will help identify which species it is. Any observation in the greater metropolitan area of Houston will count during the four-day challenge. You can participate by exploring the life in your backyard (and use the hashtag #backyardchallenge on social media), in a neighborhood park, or any location in the Houston-Galveston area. You can also help with IDs for other people's observations to increase our species count.

Spring is Here!

After all the freeze damage, Westbury yards are beginning to see some life as shrubs and trees begin to leaf out. The roses and azaleas seem to have survived and even thrived after the freeze. The jury is still out on some of the more fragile tropical plants. This is a good time to take stock of your yard to see which plants survived and replace those that died with heartier stock. Native plants will do best.

Joshua's Native Plants, in the Heights, says to do the scratch test. Take a limb that looks dead; scratch it, and if it's nice and green underneath the plant is going to be just fine. Trim away any limbs that don't pass the scratch test. Cut away any mushy parts.

Brent Moon, the horticulture manager at the new Houston Botanic Gardens, says this: "Plants are resilient. Let yours have the time they need to heal and you may be rewarded with even more beautiful plants in your garden down the line." He had these recommendations:

- → Remove mushy foliage as soon as possible.
- → If plants look like they've been killed all the way down, then it is okay to cut them back close to the ground.
- → Time will tell if your palms are dead or just damaged.
