## Westbury in New City Council District K

What is Changing?

Effective for the November 2011 elections, two additional city council districts will be added and Westbury will be located in the newly created District K according to the pre-

liminary map released April 6<sup>th</sup>. About 100 Westbury homes, located on the north side of Willowbend and west of Westbury **United Methodist** Church, will continue to be in District C due to their precinct boundaries.

The new District K will include residents from

the following city Super Neighborhoods: Westbury, Brays Oaks, Fondren Gardens, Fort Bend (that section of Houston which is in Ft. Bend County), and the western portion of Central Southwest (south of US90A and west of Almeda).

**How is Westbury Affected?** 

District C and our new District K are the only city council districts in which no single ethnic group currently exceeds 50% of the population, thus we continue to be situated in a racially diverse

osed Council District K

district. Based on voting age population, District K will be approximately 39% Hispanic, 44% Black, 12% White, and 5% Asian.

As proposed, Westbury will no longer be in the same council district as neighbors

Maplewood and Meyerland.

The Westbury subdivision has almost 5000 homes and a high rate of voter participation and civic engagement, so we anticipate that the Westbury

> area will have a strong influence in the new District K or whichever district it occupies.

It may be helpful that District K spans both sides of US 90A due to the many transit issues pending for the Southwest side of Houston which affect both sides of US 90A railroad quiet zone,

location of future US 90A commuter rail route and stations, and transit issues related to north/south commuting patterns.

City Council lines do not change our police precincts.

### NCAA "68 Courts in 68 Days" Follow-up

As proudly announced last month, three Westbury parks were chosen by NCAA Houston to have their basketball courts refurbished as part of the "68 Courts in 68 Days" initiative. The WCC coordinated successful clean-up events on Saturday, March 26, at the three parks in preparation for the NCAA refurbishment. The work has been completed at Westbury Park and will be completed at Chimney Rock Park and Hager Park in the very near future. Our parks have been cleaned and look great. Thank you to all who participated and helped make it happen!

#### **Westbury Park**

About 25 people showed up early Saturday morning, to clean the grounds. They witnessed the NCAA dedication and the affixing of its decals to the new basketball backboards. Participating were students and a teacher from Westbury Christian; Boy Scouts; basketball players from Parker Elementary and Johnston Middle School; Parker Elementary PTO President Melanie Rosen: and, of course, Jennifer McCleskey, whose nomination to the NCAA got this project going.



#### **Hager Park**

Four new trees were planted and many bags of litter were collected at Hager Park in preparation for the NCAA improvements to the basketball court. There were volunteers from Westbury Christian; PW3 resident Joe Niles; three men who play basketball at Hager and several others including a family from the neighborhood. The court has been re-striped. We are still waiting for Houston Parks and Recreation Department to install the donated backboards and nets. Once they are installed the NCAA decals will be applied. We will also approach the HPARD about getting a water fountain installed by the basketball court and another trash can in an effort to curtail the plastic bottle trash problem.

#### **Chimney Rock Park**

Thanks go out to Westbury United Methodist Church which sent volunteers to the Chimney Rock Park on March 26, for a work day coinciding with the NCAA clean-up project. About 15 volunteers from Westbury United Methodist cleaned the property and filled over 100 bags with leaves. The park's sign garden was cleaned and planted with summer flowers. Four students and their teacher from Westbury Christian planted trees and helped. Thanks also to Ken Wallace, Platou Community Center Supervisor, for opening the building for the use of the volunteers. The basketball court was power washed and re-striped. The park is ready for the new basketball backboards.

#### **Willow Waterhole News**

- ◆ Zack Lopez completed his Eagle Scout project by building an informational kiosk on Compartment 5. Sam Nisley, Troop 99 from St. Thomas More, completed his Eagle Scout project by clearing the overgrown trail beside the Gathering Place. What a difference these young men and their projects have made for park goers.
- ♦ The March bird survey brought 19 birders to the park where 40 species were recorded Including a Crested Caracara. Forty-six species were seen during the April survey with a yellow-headed blackbird as the star. The total species for this survey to date is 153 species! - More than 50 people attended the very informative Spring General meeting where David Hawes explained the Brays Oaks Management District and their Parks Master plan. Raouf Farid of Project Brays gave an update on the Construction progress. Unfortunately, the Federal Government has not reimbursed the Harris County Flood Control for the work done to date and no new work can begin until the federal money is received. ### Security / Crime

#### Crime is Increasing! Have you paid your Patrol Dues? Here's why you should.

If your home is burglarized, how much will it cost you to fix a broken door and replace stolen items? How much time will it take to deal with police, insurance company, and to replace stolen items? How long will it take you to regain your peace of mind?

Having a constable security program may not prevent crime, but it deters criminals who are looking for easier places to commit crimes than in Westbury. The "Westbury Area Patrol" (WAP) constable program is the most expensive program operated by the Westbury Civic Club. It is also one of the most desired amenities and it is an amenity which surrounding subdivisions (Maplewood, Marilyn Estates, Meyerland, etc) provide to their homeowners. Do we want Westbury to be the easy place for criminals to do their misdeeds? Meyerland is half our size and has 7 constables. Westbury has only 3, yet 8 are recommended. Three constables are not sufficient to provide coverage for 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, 52 weeks each year.

We need to raise another \$68,000 to be able to pay for our 3 constables through the end of the year. So far we have only raised enough money to pay for 2 of our three constables. At a minimum, we need another 300 - 400 voluntary supporters to pay for WAP through the end of the year to pay for our existing contractual obligation, not including additional money needed to hire more constables.

We thank the many Westbury residents who have already sent in their dues for 2011 using the form in the newsletter. You have saved the WCC a good deal of postage with your cooperation. Thank you. We urge those of you who are waiting for a dues letter to pay promptly and generously. We appreciate all contributions, large or small, to this important effort which benefits all Westbury residents.

#### A Message from your **Security Director:**

As we enter into the summer months and the school year ends, please be mindful of your safety and the safety of your neighbors. Traditionally, crime statistics for theft and other crimes increases during the summer months when school is not in session. The Harris County Police Department and Precinct 5 Constable's Office are aware of these trends.

As you can see by the numbers on the table, crime is up in our neighborhood. Please be aware of your surroundings, know your neighbors and their vehicles, call the constables if you see anything suspicious.

This recent crime increase shows the need for more constables patrolling. Please support our Westbury Area Patrol and pay your dues.

### Winter has Shifted to Spring in the Community Garden

There was hardly a hitch in moving from winter to spring vegetables. Walking through the garden in the middle of April, I saw small squash on some of the plants, baby okra nodding up through the soil, tomatoes plump on some of the plants, long bean vines half way up trellises, cucumber vines starting to climb, artichoke, pepper and eggplant plants announcing their presence and flowers showing their beautiful faces.

On another front, a garden expansion committee is gathering input on what kind of gardening ideas they would like to see happen. Some ideas are some farmer's rows for planting crops that do well outside of raised beds, an instructional garden for teaching gardening through classes and internships, a children's natural play area, a water catchment cistern off of the pavilion, an aroma/smell garden for young kids, a senior's garden with handicap accessible beds and shade area, painting the storage shed with a garden mural and planting vines to cover part of the shed, adding water spigots in the blackberry patch and E-beds, and finishing up the driveway. This all makes for exciting things in the garden and lots of opportunity for volunteers.

Come by anytime and visit the garden to see what is going on. There is no fence and there is almost always someone there. The next community garden meeting will be Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> at the garden pavilion, beginning at 6:30PM.

### **Westbury Park**

#### **Discovering Westbury Park**

The City of Houston acquired Westbury Park in 1959. Located at 5635 Willowbend, the park is located next to Parker Elementary and is sometimes called "Parker Park" by longtime residents. The park contains a pleasant mix of mature trees, athletic amenities, and grassy spaces within its 5.94 acres. Picnic tables and benches are scattered throughout the park. The park is within easy walking or biking distance to Westbury residents and also has ample parking available on the adjoining residential streets. A Cub Scout house is located between Parker Elementary and Westbury Park on Willowbend.





Westbury Pool, located at

10605 Mullins on the west side of Westbury Park, is the only public swimming pool in the area and also boasts a splash playground area for young children. In 2007, the City of Houston spent more than a million dollars renovating Westbury Pool and improving drainage in the center of the park. The pool was resurfaced, the poolhouse was remodeled, a splash playground was added, a pool lift was provided so that disabled persons can get in and out of the pool without using stairs, and two long-needed shady areas with seating were provided. For the last three years, the City has provided an "AquaFit" exercise class at Westbury Pool, which has been one of the best attended classes in the city. Please check our website for class schedule/dates.

For sports enthusiasts, the park has two lighted tennis courts and a backboard, a baseball field, a multi-purpose (football or soccer) field, and two basketball goals popular with youth. Several swing sets are provided in the central part of the park. A playground for young children is situated on

the south side of the park near Stillbrooke. This playground was built in 1994 after the Westbury community raised money for two years and with assistance from the Houston Parks Board. Many of the "medium-sized" trees at Westbury Park were planted in 1993 by community volunteers as part of the playground project fundraising and publicity efforts. During the fall of 2010, volunteers planted a variety of young trees at the park to replace some diseased trees and to provide new trees at the park.

At this time, we do not know who intends to run for city council for District K or for District C. Westbury will continue to grow and prosper whatever the letter of our District.

### **Brays Oaks Management District**

#### Brays Oaks Management District (BOMD) Expands into Westbury

#### What is BOMD?

A Management District, sometimes called an Improvement District, is empowered to finance projects related to public transportation/mobility, community safety, beautification, economic development and related issues. Currently BOMD covers an area of about 9 square miles and is roughly bounded by US90A, Hillcroft, US59, and Brays Bayou. BOMD provides programs and

services supplemental to those offered by the City of Houston and Harris County, funded through 10 cents per hundred-dollar property value assessment on commercial property and apartment property ONLY. No residential property or exempt property is assessed. A Westbury homeowner will NOT pay an assessment to BOMD.

BOMD was created in 2005 by an act of the Texas legislature and is governed by a board of directors consisting of commercial owners, apartment property owners, and civic leaders. BOMD, the Westbury Civic Club and other local community organizations have worked together on a wide range of projects including: advocacy for Willow Waterhole Park, improvements for Westbury High School, and the creation of a Parks Master Plan for Southwest Houston. #### Why is BOMD expanding into Westbury?

The boards of the Westbury Civic Club and the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation both unanimously endorsed an expansion of BOMD to include the entire Westbury Super Neighborhood. Additionally, communities in the Braeburn area have asked to join BOMD. The 2011 Texas legislature is anticipated to pass legislation approving the proposed expansion both eastward into Westbury and northward into the Braeburn area, which would increase the BOMD service area from 9 to 14 square miles. As noted in the endorsement letter sent by the WCC to BOMD:

"We believe that the Westbury Civic Club has many issues in common with BOMD. First and foremost, we are concerned that some of our Westbury area commercial properties are neglected or underperforming. This reflects poorly on our community. Other issues of common interest include: education, flood prevention in the Brays Bayou drainage system, crime reduction, improvements to multi-family housing, beautification, and parks."
