After years and years of fielding complaints about the home at 5822 Cartagena, the Westbury Civic Club is pleased to announce that the problem was finally solved when the home was demolished on April 8. According to public records, taxes went unpaid on this home since 1987. More than once, attornevs for the Harris County Appraisal district tried to sell the home for back taxes and were finally successful in late 2011. It appears that the home sold at auction for \$50,000 to an individual who then sold it to a management company that he owns. We were continually reporting this house to 311, but once the new owner pulled a permit saying that the home would be repaired no action could be taken until the permit expired.

Several TV channels sent cameramen, and a few sent helicopters, for the house demolition. Erik Barajas from Channel 13 did a very nice job on the story. It was an exhilarating morning.

Hopefully other substandard homes will come into compliance without such drastic measures. We are working hard on behalf of all of Westbury/Parkwest. Join us as we work to make Westbury/Parkwest the safest, greenest, affordable neighborhood in Houston. Read about our exciting new partnership with the City of **Houston Department of** Neighborhoods as we work together to bring all the homes in Westbury into compliance.

District K Capital Improvement Plan Meeting

Westbury was well represented at the 2013 District K Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) meeting with seven Westbury residents in attendance. The meeting held on March 21 began with District K Council Member Larry Green outlining all of the accomplishments in District K of the last year. Representatives of the Parks Dept., Public Works, and General Services talked about CIP projects in the works

for District K. The Parks Dept. spoke about the Westbury Park playground project which they now say will be completed this summer. General Services talked about a library building slated to replace the existing Meyer Library at a new site. Also, the Southwest Houston Police Dept. Substation (the "Beechnut" HPD substation) will be moved to a new HPD building to be built near S. Post Oak, just south of US90A. Public Works made a presentation about Rebuild Houston and how roads will be selected for improvements.

Once the presentations were complete, it was time for Questions and Answers. Becky Edmondson, WCC President, thanked the city for the efforts in revitalizing Westbury. She asked that something be done about Westbury Square. She asked for a new community center to be built in conjunction with the new library and mentioned the Company on Stage theater. She reminded them that our infrastructure, streets, water lines, etc are aging and in need of replacement. Marcia Hartman,

President of the Westbury Community **Tom Gwillim**. Bob Schwartz, President Garden and Vice President of the WCC, spoke eloquently about the garden and asked Mark Ross of the Parks Department how to get the city involved in the acquisition of this 7-acres as permanent greenspace. Russell Schexnayder, resident, spoke about Willow Waterhole bayou and alleviating flooding issues in Westbury. Cindy Chapman, WCC Director, thanked the At-Large City Council Members who were in the audience for attending the District K meeting. She pointed out problems with specific streets and certain leaking water mains. Westbury Christian School asked for safer sidewalks. There for moral support and wearing their community t-shirts were Westbury residents Dita Geary, Hazel Potvin, Karen Schubert and

of the Brays Bayou Association and a resident of Marilyn Estates, spoke about the needs of the Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve. Interestingly a couple, who do not live in Westbury but were there to speak about another issue, complained about street flooding problems near the intersection of Willowbend and Hillcroft.

It was a productive meeting and the city and citizens left with a better understanding of progress that had been made and the continuing needs of District K.

Code Violations

Be a Neighbor, NOT a Nuisance!

The City of Houston Department of Neighborhoods (DoN) seeks to improve the quality of life in neighborhoods by reducing blight and substandard living conditions. All of these municipal code violations described below carry fines ranging from \$50 to \$2,000.

These violations can be reported to the city by calling 311 or using the 311 mobile app. Please record the assigned city service number for the violation. It is also helpful to let the WCC office know of these problems so that we can follow-up on the status. A committee of the Westbury Super-Neighborhood, including reps from the WCC, is working with DoN and the Houston Police Department in a new collaborative effort to monitor and resolve these and other nuisances to our neighborhood.

Overgrown Lots: The property owner/ occupant is responsible for maintaining weeds and grass at nine inches or less and brush and shrubbery at seven feet or less. **Dangerous Buildings:** Vacant buildings must be kept locked and all points of entry must be covered.

Rat Attractions: Property owners may not accumulate lumber, boxes, barrels that may be used for rat harborage.

Garbage, Rubbish, Trash, and Open and Visible Storage of Materials:
Junk, trash, litter and rubbish cannot accumulate on a lot. This includes:
No dead trees, tires, refuse, glass, building materials, appliances, inoperable boats and junk vehicles, auto parts, appliances, furniture, tires, paper, tree trimmings, cardboard and other offensive material.



NOTE – Some residents mistakenly believe that it is a trash violation only if they place trash out on the street too early for collection. If you have a pile of trash sitting in your driveway or front vard waiting for the next Tree Waste or Junk Waste collection day, then that pile of trash is considered to be blight and it is a violation. It is a violation to be accumulating trash ANYWHERE on your lot – whether it is in your front, side, or back yard. It is also a violation for your city trash receptacles to be stored in plain sight or to be placed at the street too early or left standing too late. See photo.

Boat Trailers: The boat must be stored so that water cannot accumulate and the trailer must be operable.

Broken Fences and Structures on Property: All fences and accessory structures including detached garages and sheds must be in structurally sound condition and in good repair.

Thank you to the many Westbury residents who downloaded the new 311 App! We are very excited about this new tool. One of the first hurdles in using the app successfully is knowing what type of violations and problems can be turned into 311. Here's a list of common issues.

- *Storage of Trash/Debris—311
- *Traffic Sign Maintenance—311
- *Street Repairs—311
- *Water Main Break-311
- *Trees in City Easement/ Right of Way need removal or pruning—311





Trash Can Contest

Did you know that your trash cans should be kept out of public view? Leaving your can/cans in public view can result in a citation. We get complaints from neighbors who obey the law and are tired of looking at their neighbors' trash receptacles. We would like to help the whole neighborhood get in compliance. But we need your help.

If your house has an attached garage it takes some effort. At a minimum, trash cans should be stored behind the building set back line and screened from view. They should not be stored on your driveway, in front of the garage, or even worse, on the front porch.

If your house has a detached garage, then it is a little easier to get your trash cans out of view. Many homes now have added gates across the driveways and now it is not as easy to get the cans behind the gate and out of view. The cans should not be stored in front of the gate or in your front yard or on your porch.

We are lobbying regularly for all of Westbury to have Single Stream recycling and that means a second large can to screen from view. Have you found an innovative way to screen your cans? Perhaps you've been meaning to get around to this and now is your chance to implement it and win a prize!

Overgrown yards. Derelict buildings. Trash. through the active enforcement of city These blights and other problems degrade our neighborhood and can be extremely frustrating to live near. This month we feature the Department of Neighborhoods as our community partner.

DoN is a new city department formed by Mayor Annise Parker less than 2 years ago.

"The Department of Neighborhoods (DoN) is an entity dedicated to improving quality of life in our neighborhoods through expanded outreach, stronger community partnerships and improved government responsiveness. This constituent-based service concept creates a "one-stop shop" for

accessing City services and resolving neighborhood issues." Katye Tipton was named director of the Department of Neighborhoods by Mayor Annise Parker and Houston City Council on May 31, 2012, after serving as interim director for several months.

The DoN division of Inspections & Public Service (IPS) aims to defend and improve the quality of life in neighborhoods

ordinances and the reduction of blight and substandard living conditions.

For difficult problems, additional resources may need to be involved. For example, the front page of this newsletter shows the demolition of 5822 Cartagena in April. This achievement involved help from DoN, plus

city Legal, plus the Houston Police Department (via the Differential Response Team -DRT). Starting in May 2013, we will be working even more closely with the city to resolve problem properties. The plan is for the Westbury SuperNeighborhood / WCC to prepare lists of our problem properties. Once each quarter, representatives from

Westbury will meet in person with leaders from DoN, HPD-DRT, and the Health Department to review stubborn and/or difficult properties. Status reports will be prepared monthly for our SuperNeighborhood. The goal is for neighborhoods and the city to work more closely together to solve problems. We are hopeful that this approach will be better at resolving some of our chronic or recalcitrant problem properties.

It is fair to say they were all shocked at the condition of the house. The city legal department persuaded the owner to demolish the structure. We met his contractor at the demolition and were told that there are plans underway to build a new home.

Many thanks to Jennifer Edmondson for diligently staying on top of the issue. We owe major thanks to the City's Legal Department, especially Donna Edmundson and Tim Douglass. And as always we thank our very competent and hardworking city councilmember Larry Green and his Chief of staff, Donald Perkins and our constituent representative Barbara Hite. It is amazing how many talented and dedicated City of Houston employees work on our behalf.



Houston Home Prices

The Houston Chronicle on April 14, 2013 listed housing prices across Houston. Here is data for selected subdivisions in southwest Houston. The median price per square foot means that of all the homes sold, half sold for a higher price and half sold for a lower price. This data does not include home sales in 2013; also, housing inventory is now at a 10-year low for the Houston metro area, so prices continue to rise. Prices continue to lag in areas with high foreclosure rates. We suspect that the big increase in house value in Westbury (Sections 1 to 5) is partly aided by property investors who are buying properties to remodel and then resell. Westbury is THE neighborhood to live in!

There's a jewel in Westbury Square. For 36 seasons, The Company OnStage (COS) has been presenting quality, affordable entertainment for children and adults alike. The excitement of seeing a story come to life never gets old to me and I'm thrilled to be a part of bringing that same joy to kids today," says COS Board Vice President Kathryn Noser. "I believe that live theater is an important part of our culture. By providing shows and classes in our community, the Company OnStage helps to keep that culture alive and fosters imagination and creativity."

In keeping with the vision of Joyce McNally, COS also continues to offer classes at the theater. Actors In Wonderland is a one-week summer drama camp for students entering 1st – 5th grades. Campers learn the basics of the theater experience including stagecraft, improvisation, storytelling, character development and acting. Each session will be fun, energetic

and educational as the students work together to create an original production.

The theater is still focused on providing great productions, too.

General items: Restrooms, Art installations, Parking


Passive: Pier fishing, Model boat launch, Yoga Pilates area, geo-caching, Birding platform, Reading rooms

Houston Audubon Society "Birdathon" **Team at Willow Waterhole**

The Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve had its own Houston Audubon Society (HAS) "Birdathon" team this year – the WILLOW WATERHOLE WING NUTS. The Birdathon is a competition to see which team can see the most bird species and/or raise the most money for the HAS. The team surveyed the Reserve and surrounding neighborhoods to see how many bird species they could see in a single day from dawn until dusk. The team of Mark Meyer, Ben Hulsey, Peggy Boston, and Joy Hester saw 54 species over a 13-hour stretch and walked "every inch" of the reserve.



Highlights of the day included: Roseate Spoonbills, Ibises, and a flock of 65 semi-palmated sandpipers. The HAS sponsors a monthly bird survey each month at Willow Waterhole. How many total species have been observed during these surveys? There have been 178 different species so far!

Remember, please let the **Westbury Civic Club office** look over your proposed plans before you start construction. We want to avoid deed restriction violations before they happen, and without a doubt you would like to find out before wasting money on construction that later has to be modified or demolished. Obtaining a city construction permit requires your written acknowledgment that the plans comply with your deed restrictions.

49 Chimney Rock Bus Route Changes METRO has

proposed a change to the 49 Chimney Rock bus route. If approved by the METRO board, then the change will go into effect on Sunday, June 9, 2013. for Weekday and Saturday service. A public hearing was held in April. The bus will be changed from a 40-foot bus to a new, smaller 27-foot bus with a capacity for 15 riders. These new vehicles include all the amenities of the 40-foot buses; overhead route signage, visual and auditory stop announcements, and increased seating options. The smaller buses will comply with the American Disabilities Act and will have bike racks. The fare will be the same for all buses.

Westbury Community Garden

March 23 Garden Work Day Brings Volunteers

The Westbury Community Garden has been pleased to recently welcome volunteers from various organizations who have offered their time and effort to aid the garden. This is the time of year to attack those fast-growing spring weeds, refresh mulched walkways, and work on projects.

A scheduled work day at the garden on March 23 drew workers from Westbury United Methodist Church(WUMC) and Riceville Mt. Olive Baptist Church. Even the weather cooperated: cool and misty when we first started, stayed cool and cloudy during the work period, and finally started a heavy mist just as we were getting ready to quit--can't get more perfect than that. ReUse Houston delivered a square yard of crushed concrete which we used to spread in the low places at the front of the driveway. We cleaned and re-mulched almost half of the walkways, pulled weeds in the orchard and mulched around the fruit trees, and made a special project out of cleaning up the aisles around one of our new gardener's beds.



Tips for Growing Tomatoes & Peppers

Who doesn't like a ripe, juicy tomato or fresh, crisp pepper -- especially one right off the vine from your own home garden?

Tomatoes can be determinate or indeterminate, hybrid or open-pollinated (the so-called Heirloom tomatoes). The sprawling indeterminate varieties tend to take up more space, but don't necessarily require support (in fact, some gardeners think they are less pest-prone if allowed to sprawl), and can bear fruit over a long period of time. The determinate varieties, single stalk, are more upright and compact, and tend to bear fruit over a shorter time. They are more suitable for container growing, due to their size, but should have at least a 15-gallon pot. The indeterminate varieties, on the other hand, do better in the ground and generally require a sturdy cage at least 4 feet high (6 may be better) and 2 feet across. By all means, experiment with different varieties, but be sure to plant some of the cherry-type tomatoes -- the kids love 'em and will eat them straight off the vine.

Peppers are all easy to grow from transplants available in the stores now. Pepper plants tend to be a little more compact than tomatoes, and you can actually use the larger so-called "tomato cages" they sell in the stores, for peppers. (Just don't use them for tomatoes because they aren't big enough or


