Westbury Park Renovation Begins

Have you been by Westbury Park lately? If so, you have probably noticed the construction trucks! The Westbury Park renovation finally began on June 11. The site work being done now will include: the removal of the old playground equipment, grading of the park, excavation, installation of sidewalks, planting of trees, and building a picnic pavilion. According to the city, final plans will be approved for the playground equipment in July by City Council. The new playground equipment has an expected delivery and installation date



of September. Just in time for cooler weather!

The Westbury Civic Club and the Friends of Westbury Greenspaces committee have been keeping close tabs on this project and will be

President's Message

News is often slow in the summer, but this has been a banner month. The Westbury Crier newsletter won a national award from Neighborhoods USA. Resident Russell Shexnayder won an Arbor Day award from Trees for Houston for his continued commitment to trees in Westbury and especially at the Willow Waterhole. Single Stream recycling (the big green rolling bins) is soon coming to the remainder of Westbury. **And, last but not** least, Westbury was recently listed as one of the 25 best places to live in Houston.

Houstonia Magazine is a new monthly magazine which they say "will deliver Houston in all its complicated glory". The June issue features on the cover "25 Hottest Neighborhoods -Best Places to Live Now." And guess what? Westbury is 5th on that list! They, of course, have to mention the decline of Westbury Square. But they go on to say that "these days, everyone seems to love Westbury, for its still reasonable prices... meanwhile two of the neighborhood's elementary schools ... are among the best in the city, completing Westbury's trajectory as one of Houston's most impressive comebacks".

For those of us who have lived here for a long time, I don't feel we were ever down and out. We may have been showing some wear and gone out of fashion for a while, but what many outsiders do not know is that Westbury has always had wonderful residents. Neighbors make a neighborhood, and Westbury has always been populated by a special class of people people who care. The early "pioneers" who settled in one of Houston first suburban neighborhoods rolled up their sleeves and raised money for street lights, built the churches and synagogues that still serve our area, tended their yards, volunteered for community service, lobbied the City for streets, stop signs, parks, bus routes, and actively participated in the civic process. Many were transferred here in the 60s as the oil business boomed. The 80s brought more residents when the rest of the country faltered. We are still a mix of those early residents, mid-timers, and brand new residents...all of whom bring their special talents to Westbury. We now even have third generation families living in the neighborhood!

Volunteers made a big difference "back in the day", and they make a huge

difference today. About ten years ago, we began the Working on Westbury "WOW" campaign. This started around Hazel Potvin's kitchen table when she and I. Diana Lovelady, and Margaret Lyle sat down and said "What can we do to make a difference in Westbury?" We started the WOW walks, created a garden club, and surveyed the esplanades and parks. In the years since, the Westbury Civic Club and our volunteers have planted or given to residents over 5,000 trees; we lobbied successfully for single stream recycling; we have worked to improve all our parks and esplanades; created programming for our community center; created a great community garden; and have developed strong relationships with our community partners such as the City, the County, the State, METRO, Keep Houston Beautiful, Brays Oaks Management District and nearby communities. We have an army of volunteers in Westbury, all of whom contribute to what the Houstonia Magazine called a "most impressive comeback"! Thanks to all of you who choose to call

Flood Control & Mosquitoes



It's that time of year again. The mosquitoes are out full force! Mosquitoes are not only annoying but they can carry dangerous illnesses. The best way to keep down the number of mosquitoes is to not let them breed.

Mosquitoes can breed anywhere that water is left to stand or collect. If you look in the standing water, you may see little wiggling things. Those are baby mosquitoes (larva). Some examples of where water may be left standing include: pet water bowls, bird baths, low puddle areas, saggy gutters, and plant container saucers. What can each of us do to reduce the numbers of mosquitoes?

- Tip over all the water collectors in your yard and leave them turned over to discourage mosquitoes
- Don't allow standing water in saucers under a pot.
- Rinse and refresh bird baths and pet water bowls daily.
- If you collect rainwater to water your plants, be sure the container has a good screen cover to keep mosquitos out of the water.
- If you have a decorative pond in your backyard, check it for mosquito larva. Small fish called Gambusia (Mosquito Fish) can be added to eat the mosquito larva.
- Keep gutters in good repair.
- Get rid of old tires.

Public Comments for Drainage Design Manual

Chapter 9 is the chapter in the city technical design manual which deals with drainage issues when property is developed. Due to the changes in the Land Development Ordinance (Chapter 42) recently enacted by the city, neighborhood groups and flooding control advocates have been pushing for revisions in Ch. 9 to compensate for the higher amounts of impervious cover across the city anticipated due to the higher density of development newly allowed under Ch. 42.

As homeowners, one major concern is whether our risk of flooding will increase as more land is developed across Houston. Another concern is how the costs of flood protection are allocated – whether the costs are paid upfront by developers or whether the costs are transferred to existing property owners and homeowners via higher taxes to pay for drainage and flood control projects and any costs of flooding to our properties.

The draft of the revised document is scheduled to be released by the Public Works and Engineering Department on July 1. The WCC does not have a copy of the proposed design revisions at the time of newsletter publication; however, public comments on this topic will be accepted at a Special Meeting on Chapter 9 to be held on July 17th @ 5:00 PM in City Council Chambers.

\$aving Money on Your Water Bill

Save Money on your Water & Sewer Bill

It is almost painful to open the monthly city water bill and see the combined water, sewer, and drainage fees. **The city water and sewer fees went up by 8.9% this year** (3.6% due to the increase in city population + inflation from last year, and the other 5.3% because the original rate increase in 2010 is being implemented over several years instead of all at once). The bill for May 2013 reflected a full month of the rate adjustment enacted in April 2013. For example, the cost of 5,000 gallons of water in May was \$26 and the related cost of sewer was about \$30, with a total cost of \$56 dollars, not including the separate drainage fee which is based upon the amount of impervious surface on your property.

Reducing your water usage saves you money on both water and sewer fees because the sewer fee is based on your water usage.

The city says the annual rate adjustment of your water & sewer fees is intended to cover cost increases to provide safe, clean drinking water and to collect and treat wastewater. This fee includes operational costs as well as the costs involved in the repair and replacement of portions of the System's aging infrastructure.

The City of Houston offers a FREE service to monitor your daily water consumption. The Consumption Awareness Program (CAP) provides consumers with several tools to help better manage their monthly water usage and bill. This program includes weekly customized usage reports, weekly projected bill estimates, and alerts/notifications for high usage. You can sign up for this great program thru your online water account. One resident received a email warning for high water usage that ended up being caused by a faulty sprinkler timer.

Here are some other tips to help you conserve water in your garden. Much of Texas continues to suffer severe drought conditions, so wise use of water saves both money and a precious resource.

Garden and Lawn from the Water Saving Tips Texas Water Smart website

- Use a layer of mulch on the surface of beds
- Water only when plants look like they need it. Most plants die from over-watering, not under-watering.
- Water your plants deeply, but less frequently, to encourage deep root growth and drought tolerance.
- Use watering cans, whenever possible.
- Use drip irrigation or soaker hoses for shrubs and trees to reduce evaporation and apply water directly to roots
- Use a rain barrel or buckets to capture rainwater from your downspouts to water your garden
- Keep a bucket in the shower to catch water as it warms up or runs. Use this water to water plants.
- Water in the morning or evening when temperatures are cooler
- Adjust your mower up at least one notch. A taller lawn holds moisture better.
- Adjust your watering schedule each month to match seasonal weather conditions.
- Set a kitchen timer when watering your lawn or garden to remind you when to stop.
- Use a licensed irrigator annually to check your sprinkler system and maintenance
- Make sure that your landscape and grass are still receiving about a ¼ inch of water per week.



Prohibited Yard Parking

No Parking Allowed on Front or Side Yard in ALL of Westbury

It is a violation of city ordinance to park any vehicle on the front or side yard of a residential property in Westbury.

Sec. 28-303. Parking of vehicles prohibited in certain residential areas It shall be an offense for any person to park or to cause, suffer or permit the parking of a vehicle or equipment on any surface that is not an improved surface as defined in this article, within any front or side yard of a single-family residence in a residential area subject to this section.

After hearing numerous complaints about vehicles parked on the grass, in 2009 the City of Houston enacted an -in to an ordinance to regulate the practice of vehicles parked in the front or side yard. City Council noted that parking vehicles on the front or side yard has "a negative effect on the aesthetics of single-family residential areas affected by such practices and the property values of residences in those affected areas". The Westbury Civic Club applied to the program, public notices were made as required, and a hearing was conducted. In

November 2009, the **Prohibited Yard-Parking** ordinance went into effect in all parts of Westbury.

How are violations handled?

Report yard-parking violations to the officers at the Westbury HPD ordinance to allow communities to opt Storefront at 713-726-7126. Since the officers do not work on weekends or in the evenings, photographs of violations are accepted to help document the problem. It is helpful to record the license plate and make/ model of the offending vehicle. Also, please be aware that quirks in the ordinance mean that some practices that appear to be yard-parking violations are not enforceable. Photos below are examples of yard parking.

Westbury HPD Storefront

The Houston Police Department operates the Westbury HPD Storefront, located at 5600 South Willow #116. The Westbury Storefront has been operating for many years. It was originally sited in Westbury Square and then at Westbury Hospital on Gasmer before being opened at its current location. The Westbury HPD storefront is open from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. It is a good idea to call ahead, 713-726-7126, just to verify that officers are there and not on a neighborhood call.



Residents can request home security inspections or file police reports at the storefront. Residents are welcome to drop by to get information.

Currently there are three officers

assigned to the storefront: Sgt. Tim Sutton, Officer John Ly, and Officer Ray Freeze. Each of the three officers are trained to serve on the "Differential Response Team (DRT)", which means that they are trained to handle special problems or issues that regular patrol officers do not handle. They enforce city ordinances for both commercial and residential property. On the commercial side they inspect convenience stores, games rooms, fire codes, health codes, and food trucks, etc.

The officers at the Westbury HPD Storefront also handle certain types of residential complaints. For example, it is a city parking violation to park vehicles in the front and side yards of Westbury residential properties, and these complaints are handled by the Westbury HPD Storefront rather than by regular patrol officers. Why? Because neighborhoods had to apply

to be part of the "prohibited yard parking" ordinance, and it is difficult for regular patrol officers to know which neighborhoods do not allow vehicles to be parked in the yard. Additionally, the "Differential Response Team" training means that the officers at our Westbury HPD Storefront handle complex residential violations of city ordinances, beyond the routine types of violations handled by other city inspectors.

During HPD Week this year, our Officer Ly was awarded DRT Officer of the Year for his work on a home in Westbury that had become infested with roaches and rodents. He worked closely with the homeowner and, in the end, both the homeowner and the nearby neighbors are enjoying a better quality of life.

Donations help defray the cost of operating the location and volunteers help answer the phones. If you are interested in volunteering at the Storefront, call them at 713-726-7126 for more information.

Recycling News

Single Stream Recycling for ALL of Westbury!

Houston is expanding its automated curbside recycling program to include 35,000 additional households, the city announced June 13. The good news is that now ALL of Westbury will be in the single stream recycling program as the 2,437 remaining homes which did not have those big, green rolling bins are included in this program expansion. "Since first implementing the initiative in 2009, residents have overwhelmingly been asking to be included in this program," Harry Haves, director of the Solid Waste Management Department, said in a statement. "It's convenient because participants can place their unsorted recyclables, including glass, in one city -provided container with wheels that makes it easy to roll to the curb."

Parts of Westbury were included in the pilot program in 2009 and more Westbury homes were added during two subsequent program expansions. We have been asking for these additional bins for a long time and applaud the city's commitment to recycling. No more sorting

recyclables, no more having to take your glass containers to a recycling center, no more dragging those heavy bins to the curb, no more excuses!



It really is easy to recycle with one large rolling bin!

Thanks to everyone who wrote letters, emailed, or called the City in support of expanding recycling to all of Westbury. Thanks to Mayor Parker and Director Hayes for their

commitment to recycling. Thanks to Councilmember Larry Green. And thanks to all the good recyclers in Westbury who showed their enthusiasm. We can show our thanks by being the BEST recycling neighborhood in Houston! It is our understanding that the city will not bother to collect the small green recycle bins when they deliver the new, big rolling recycle bins. Those small green bins are great for yard work or chores, so re-purpose your old recycle bins and continue to use them!

Remember to allow at least 3 feet between your black and green rolling trash bins on collection day to allow sufficient room for the robotic arms to pick up the bins


The city will discontinue the Recycle Bank Program on June 30, 2013 in order to finance the distribution of more bins. Residents have one year, until June 30, 2014, to redeem their points.



"Trash Facts" - Solid Waste Department Containers must be removed from the curb-line and/or public view by 10:00 p.m. on the day of collection and stored in a secure location.

No, not really. Please take down your Christmas lights if you have not already done so. Truthfully it just looks tacky and annoys your neighbors.

Storage Pods

We have all seen the big storage pods people use to move or store belongings. It's a great invention. It's also a deed restriction violation to store the pod on your property in front of your building line and in public view. Offsite storage is available, please utilize it.

Weeds / Overgrown Lots

Most of Westbury's lawns are beautiful, however, some people are mowing challenged. If this applies to you, please get out and mow your lawn! Yards must be kept under 9". That is actually quite high. If you don't have a lawnmower, ask a neighbor or hire a service. Overgrown yards are a violation of City Ordinance and the deed restrictions.

Keep Westbury Beautiful!

Signs, Signs, and More Signs

Do you drive down a street and think all the homes are for sale only to find the signs are advertisements for roofers, landscapers, contractors, etc.? The only commercial signs allowed by your DEED RESTRICTIONS are a For Sale sign for a house being sold. Signs advertising the business of contractors working on your home are not allowed. Please ask contractors not to place them in your yard. If they are there now, please remove them. If you love your contractor so much that you want to spread the word, then ask them to advertise in the *Westbury Crier* or spread the word through social media.

By state law, political signs are allowed to be displayed for a period of time during election periods.

Both state law and city ordinances forbid unauthorized signs from being posted on public property. This means signs are not allowed on public easements or on items located in the public easements (trees, posts, poles,

etc). Signs illegally posted on public property are considered to be trash and may be collected by anyone. The WCC Office Manager collects signs almost daily (as seen in the photo to the left) as do many other volunteers with the Westbury Civic Club along with the BOMD.

Santoyo Tree Service Helps Willow Waterhole Trees

Mr. Santoyo of Santoyo Tree Services (pictured below) has delivered four loads of mulch to the Willow Waterhole in the last 6 weeks containing about 40 cubic yards in total. The pile of mulch in the picture is about 5 or 6 cubic yards. The mulch is free, green and uncured. This is win-win situation as Santoyo does not have to pay a disposal charge and the Willow Waterhole doesn't have to pay for mulch! Thanks to Russell Shexnayder, winner of a Trees for Houston Arbor Day award 2013, and Carlos Mata, our Greenspace director, for this great partnership.

WCC Members Attend Ch. 42 Meeting

WCC Directors Marcia Hartman and Genie Mitchell, WCC Office Manager Jennifer Edmondson plus Evelyn Mica from the Westbury SuperNeighborhood attended a District K meeting hosted by Councilmember Larry Green in June. This meeting was facilitated in conjunction with the City of Houston Planning and Development Department to inform civic leaders about the tools available to help protect their residential character as part of the adoption of Chapter 42, the City's Land Development ordinance.

Fortunately, ALL residential lots in Westbury and Parkwest are already protected by deed restrictions specifying minimum lot sizes and building lines ("building lines" define the distances that a structure must be located from property boundaries). The Westbury Civic Club works with the city Legal Department to enforce violations to these type of deed restrictions. Deed restrictions are enforceable for ALL

properties in Westbury and Parkwest, regardless of whether assessments are mandatory or voluntary.

The District K council office has compiled 95% of all deed restrictions within its District. The council staff is reviewing the documents for language pertaining to minimum lot size and building line. The District K office will personally contact any civic associations to notify them if the language within their deed restrictions is sufficient or if they should make an appointment with the Planning Department to pursue the Special Minimum Lot Size/Building Line application.




