## Are you a member of the Civic Club?

My eyes have blurred from reading the number of articles written over the past 50 plus years about membership. Over the years, a variety of appeals have been attempted to encourage residents to join, ranging from: begging for members, cajoling for members; shaming non-members by printing a map of homes paying dues, extolling the benefits of membership, and listing all the wonderful things the civic club dues have supported. One enterprising president allowed members to "earn" a \$5 credit towards their next year's dues for each "full" membership they collected.

The Westbury Area Patrol has helped keep crime down in Westbury for the last 30 years. The same factors that drove us to contract with Harris County Precinct Five in the 80's are with us today. We are in the process of speaking to Harris County to get a 4th deputy added to our rotation. We need 154 more members to pay our current contract for the year and another 325 members to support the new deputy. So that is my challenge to you -- we need 500 new members. If you have already paid, ask your neighbor to join. If you haven't paid, won't you consider doing so. Economically, times are tough, if you can't pay the full amount, please send a donation. Every dollar helps!

This year rather than mailing an invoice to each home, we asked everyone to use the form provided in the Crier. It is delivered to your doorstep each month. Everyone knows that strong neighborhoods need strong neighborhood involvement. Everyone knows what their civic dues, constable dues and beautification dues do for Westbury. Some choose to pay. Some choose not to pay. No amount of begging, cajoling, extolling or shaming will reach those who do not want to pay. For those of you who need a reminder, here it is. ## President's Message

As we put the Crier together each month, one of my favorite things is looking through the Criers of the past. I hope you are enjoying the "This Month in Westbury History" column. I am reminded time and time again of how much work has taken place in order to keep Westbury a viable neighborhood.

The articles on Public Safety, Crime prevention, and the Constable patrol remind me that these are not the "worst of times"; having had the Constable program in place now for almost 30 years has reduced crime from the high crime days of the 1980s. The Deed Restriction article written in 1984 is as timely today as it was then. Recently someone told me that Westbury's strong Deed Restrictions were the main reason Westbury was still a great place to live. Articles on what it means to be a good neighbor appeared regularly in every decade. There were bounties paid for bandit signs taken from the esplanades.

Amazingly, the list of past board members finds people still serving today. Wally Davenport, president in 1978, serves as treasurer of the Friends of Chimney Rock Park in 2011. Russell Schexnayder, vice president in 1979, is our representative on the Brays Bayou Association and immediate past Director of Flood Control & Infrastructure. Our upcoming speaker for the 2011 September general meeting, METRO president George Greanais, was our speaker at our annual covered dish suppers in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

In 1966, there was an article on the number of complaints about loose dogs. In this issue 45 years later, the same subject. The list of programs from 1979 at the Platou center mirror those offered in 2010. There are the White Elephant Sale articles; the Candidate nights; the illustrious speakers at our annual meetings from Mayors to City Council Members to Congressmen.

A big thanks goes to all of those who have served on the Beautification Team over the years and to those who worked on our esplanades. Can you imagine if nothing had ever been planted? I had always wondered when the trees and oleanders were planted. Check out the history column on page 11 for the rest of the story.

It has taken thousands of people tens of thousands of hours working together to make and keep Westbury a livable and desirable community. It has taken each of us as homeowners maintaining our property and being good neighbors to make Westbury the desirable neighborhood that it is. I salute you all!



#### A message from your Security Director by Morgan Gaskin

There has been an increasing number of auto theft incidents this summer. There are two times of the day where your car is most vulnerable if parked in a driveway or on the street: 10PM - 4AM and 12:30PM - 4PM. These times correspond to normal hours when people are sleeping, or in the middle of the normal work week. HPD has put out a crime prevention notification informing Houston residents how to protect vehicles from being stolen or burglarized. The tips include parking in a locked garage, installing motion sensors on the side of the home where the driveway is located, always removing computer items or other valuables from the car (including the trunk), and installing a kill switch or alarm into the car. Unfortunately, crime happens. Fortunately, there are things that you can do to stay protected. Ensure that you and your family take steps to minimize the risk of losing your vehicle or incurring substantial damage due to vandals, burglars, and thieves in the area.

#### True Crime by Becky Edmondson, WCC President

Early on the morning of July 1<sup>st</sup>, I received a phone call from my neighbor telling me that I needed to go outside and check my car. I walked out front to find my car up on landscape blocks with all four tires and wheels stolen. My husband's truck had the lug nuts removed from all his tires, but the truck slipped off the jack and they left his tires behind. What a way to start the 4th of July weekend! I called the Precinct 5 number and an officer arrived within minutes. While I waited for a wrecker, I noticed some good fingerprints, so I called HPD Non-Emergency and they sent an officer to take fingerprints. (I've since discovered the deputies could have done this too.) Hopefully they will be able to track down the thieves.

A neighbor several blocks away had the same thing happen earlier this year. Both the police and the tow truck driver said this was happening all over Houston. We have implemented some security measures they recommended.

What did this incident cost me? Two separate deductibles on the two vehicles; six days without the use of my car because of the holiday weekend; a missed day of work and several sleepless nights as I now get up and look around watching for the thieves to return.

My experience with the Deputy Constables and HPD was outstanding. I liked having that quick response time from our contract program. Last month in PW3 there was someone continually shooting a gun in the air and both HPD and the Westbury Area Patrol were called. Only the WAP officer showed up. Please support the WAP patrol.

### It's Time to Think About Fall Planting by Ray Sher

During the heat of July and August, you may not feel like very much gardening, especially between 9 in the morning and 6 at night. We all think that Spring gardening is the great gardening season, for that is what books and magazines tell us, but those publications were written for northern gardeners who have mild summer temperatures. ## **Drainage Easement Greenspaces**

#### **Greenspaces Along Westbury Drainage Easements**

A century ago the bayous in Houston were considered to be potential parkland, but drainage problems in a rapidly expanding city overshadowed the park concept. Houston is now a big city and our drainage bayous are becoming valued as greenspaces which can connect people to places, while also reducing flooding. Long-time Houstonians may call them "ditches", but the flood drainage easements in Westbury are used for exercise, dog-walking, bicycling, and even gardening. Westbury residents Noreen Heard and Betsy Cross have created a beautiful coastal prairie garden in Westbury 2 planted with wildflowers and native grasses for a 200 foot strip along the drainage easement near their homes. To see the garden, park on Burdine next to the drainage easement (in the 11000 block of Burdine, midway between Sanford and Hummingbird).

Now that Westbury is part of the Brays Oaks Management District, it is anticipated that the BOMD Parks Master Plan will be updated with plans for Westbury parks and greenspaces. Some goals related to our drainage and utility easements could include:

- 1. Develop linear parks, gardens and jogging/walking trails.
- 2. Provide habitat for our wildlife with the rehabilitation of these areas into "Habitat Highways ™" while improving our quality of life through the creation of a "Green Network".



#### This Month in Westbury History

The first *Westbury Crier* was published in July 1956. We have 55 years of monthly history at our fingertips. Here are some headlines and stories from the past.

#### August 1961

◆ Rev. Greer is appointed Pastor of Westbury Baptist, which has purchased a 5 1/2 acre building site between Hillcroft and Rampart in Maplewood South.

#### August 1962

◆The drought has greatly increased our costs on the esplanade beautification. If you haven't sent in your annual beautification dues of **50 cents**, do it today!

#### August 1978

♦ Westbury receives Municipal Arts Award. The 346 live oaks and 145 oleanders planted by the Club on the esplanades of Hillcroft, Chimney Rock, and West Bellfort during the last year and a half won the 12th annual Environmental Improvement Award presented by the Houston Municipal Arts Commission and the AIA, Houston. The award noted the efforts for long-range planning for natural beauty through a far-sighted planting program. We are indebted to John Garrett and his beautification project which enabled our area to take on a new look, to win an award and to look to the future when the small trees and bushes will grow to resemble the area near Rice University.

#### Responsible Pet Ownership Begins With the "4 L's"

LICENSE, LEASH, LATCH, LOVE. This is what BARC calls the 4 L's, we believe it, we practice it, and we promote it. The "4 L's" are the basis of responsible pet ownership and the key to creating safe, secure environments for your pets. License your pet. Leash your pet. Latch your gate. Last, but certainly not least, give your pet lots of love and attention.

**BARC** promotes safe animal human encounters. Here are some general tips about animal safety: Do not pet unfamiliar animals. Always ask the owner before petting an animal that is not yours; also teach children this rule. Never tease animals. Do not surprise any animal. Do not touch a sleeping animal. Do not turn your back on a dog. Do not bother a dog while it is eating. Do not leave small children alone with a dog. Do not stare into a dog's eyes.

**Learn and watch for signs of aggressive and fearful animal behavior:** Ears are erect or back. Body is stiff. Tail is stiff or moving rapidly. Body is crouched with head down. Tail hangs down or is tucked between legs. Growling. Staring straight ahead. Hair standing on end.

And last but not least, for all of you dog walkers out there, PLEASE PICK UP THE POOP. Your neighbors are thanking you in advance for this polite consideration.

#### **Westbury Community Garden Update**

Our garden is growing! Literally! The Student Conservation Association will be in the garden the first week of August and will be building ten or eleven new raised beds. Now is the time to get your name on the waiting list if you have an interest in gardening. Be sure to check out page 8 for the Urban Harvest classes that will be taught at the Westbury Community Garden. This is the fourth year the Student Conservation Association has worked in Westbury and we are thrilled they are back this year.

This year they have 20 high school students (recruited from a number of local high schools) in their program, separated into two crews, for a six week paid summer job. They've worked at Little Cypress Creek Preserve, Sheldon Lake State Park, the Houston Arboretum and Nature Center, Memorial Park and they are ending the program at the Westbury Community Garden. As well as doing conservation service work (such as trail building/ maintenance, invasive species removal, habitat restoration and community gardening) the program includes environmental education, introduction to green jobs and a recreation camping trip at the end of the program. They also have a school year program for high school students, which involves conservation service projects, camping, environmental education and outdoor recreation.

#### "Little Classes" for Children

Yes, our community center was allowed to stay open this summer due to the hard work by many people in the Westbury community. However, it is still at risk both because of ongoing city budget issues and because of the way the Parks department judges whether a center is serving the community well or not.

Their base line is: How many youth ages 6 to 13 use the Platou Community Center on a daily basis? This does not count the adults that use our center, preschoolers, or students from Johnston or Westbury High School.

Can we do something to bring in more children ages 6 to 13? Answer is YES. First, the Platou Center now has a new supervisor, Sean Gray, who graduated from Madison High and knows the Westbury area well. He will be visiting area schools and apartments to urge families to bring their children to the center for After School Enrichment on the weekdays, 3-6PM, during the school year.

The community can help out by providing enrichment experiences to children in the form of "Little Classes". If you have art training, could you host an art class for 6 weeks from 3:30 to 4:30? If you knit or crochet or do hand sewing, could you teach children how to do one of these skills for 6 weeks? If you like to do woodworking, could you be able to guide children to make something out of wood using hand saws, hammers, etc? If you like to play chess, could you form a chess group to introduce children to this very important game? Children love to learn how to make things to eat, could you give a class on making healthy good snacks? (There is a stove) If you can coach children in drama, could you come and lead them to learn performance skills? The possibilities are endless.

Special offerings could really make the difference as to whether elementary students want to come to the Platou Center or not. You would have the support of the supervisor and the Friends of Chimney Rock Park. There are funds can help out with buying supplies. We would like to see at least three "Little Classes" offered each week with a possible repeat of those classes at a later date.



#### **METRO Update**

Phyllis Frye, Ken Downey and Becky Edmondson recently had a meeting with METRO officials at METRO headquarters. METRO has branded itself as the "New METRO" with an interest in hearing community input. They have hosted several meetings in our area and have also attended many meetings of local community organizations to discuss future plans. METRO is currently in the EIS (Environmental Impact Statement) scoping stage for a US90A (South Main) rail line. Some of the potential routes would directly impact the Westbury area, although no money has been set aside for this line.

## The purpose of the meeting was to reiterate key points to METRO:

- 1.) Westbury's neighborhood integrity must be maintained.
- 2.) Surveys indicate residents want a Westbury station. A station in the Chimney Rock / West Airport area is the most favored option.
- 3.) The impact of a future extension of West Airport in that general area was also discussed, including the possibility for a pedestrian crossover bridge.
- 4.) Concerns over fair market value, the size of easements and the sound wall were discussed on the north of the current rail alignment option.
