President's Message

I hope everyone has had a wonderful summer. It's hard to believe that summer is just about over. School starts this month so watch out for children and school zones. Westbury High School (WHS) has a new principal, Mr. Jason Catchings. You can read about him and his new staff on page 15. We are looking forward to working with WHS in whatever way we can as a community to make Westbury High School the best that it can be. Monies were allocated and promises made during the 2012 bond referendum about what improvements would be made to WHS. We want to make sure that these things happen. Our new school board trustee, Wanda Adams, hosted a meeting last month to discuss these issues. We deserve a neighborhood high school where neighbors want to send their children. Can you picture structurally sound buildings with no shacks used for classrooms? Can you picture a 50 acre campus with a regional athletic facility and natatorium sitting on the banks of the 300 acre Willow Waterhole Park? Can you picture the music programs available at this school when the talented children from Parker and Johnston come here? Can you picture them performing at the Levitt Pavilion? Can you imagine the

environmental science courses available? There is so much potential!

And speaking of potential, the Westbury Community Garden just continues to evolve and expand. The fresh organic produce available at the garden from the Plant it Forward Farms (PIFF) on the weekends is very exciting to me. You will read more in this issue about getting a regular order of fresh vegetables through a "farm share" program, see page 8. I picked up a sack to give it a try and was amazed at the delicious vegetables I had never tasted before. The patty pan squash was better than zucchini and could be eaten raw in salads or cooked. The two farmers, Alain and Sarment and their families, are a wonderful addition to our community. You may have read in an earlier Crier that they are refugees from a war torn area of the Congo. Alain's daughter just graduated from Westbury High and will be attending college. She is smart, articulate and sent me a lovely email. Stories of refugees and immigration are in the news daily. Come out to the garden and meet the PIFF farmers and see the human side of this story.

We are growing more than vegetables at the WCG now. We started a tree farm last month thanks to Trees for

Houston and Scotts Miracle Gro. Back in 2008, the Westbury Civic Club adopted an Urban Forest Compact and created a Treeprint proposal and launched an initiative to plant 10,000 trees. Close to 5,000 trees have been planted or given away to residents since 2004. Growing our own trees is the next step. These trees will be planted in our parks, on our esplanades and on the street right-of-ways. You can read more about it on page 7.

August is the month to put your name in if you'd like to serve on the WCC board. We'd love to see some new faces! Serving as a board member can be as simple as attending a meeting once a month and getting a few emails. We desperately need someone for the Secretary's position. This involves taking the minutes at 11 meetings during the year and typing them up. We even have cookies at the meetings! Friends, food and fun: how can you resist?

We are in the planning stages for our annual meeting on September 17th. Mark your calendars as we should have some exciting news to share about the Westbury Community garden!


After School Enrichment



Westbury Tree Farm

The WCC is pleased to announce the creation of a tree farm at the Westbury Community Garden. The evolution of this positive ecological turn unfolded over 10 years.

In 2004 the Westbury Civic Club realized that our tree canopy was declining and dying, especially the Arizona Ash trees planted more than 40 years ago. Urban foresters estimated that the number of trees in the 8-county Houston region had declined by 17% between 1992 and 2000.

The Westbury Civic Club developed a community forestry plan to better understand our needs and to encourage more trees to be planted. We inventoried and documented the trees on our 7 miles of esplanades. We partnered with the city "Neighborwoods" program to obtain free trees for Westbury homeowners to plant in their yards in the city right-of-way. Hundreds of trees were planted in Westbury under the Neighborwoods program. The WCC planted hundreds more trees on city esplanades here in Westbury. But we wanted to do more.

In 2008, the WCC Board adopted a resolution to create a "Westbury TreePrint" proposal for our Westbury urban forest. One goal was to create a greater level of community involvement in the planting and maintaining of our urban tree canopy. Another goal was to institute policies and practices to maximize the benefits of our urban tree canopy in Westbury. We had a dream and a vision for at least 10,000 trees to be planted in Westbury yards and esplanades.

Our Westbury TreePrint proposal received front page coverage in the Southwest News. Jim Cherner of Seven Oaks Tree

Farm read that article and generously donated 1,000 oak trees for our neighborhood. We kicked off our "Sustain Westbury's Urban Forest by planting

10,000 trees" initiative by holding a free tree giveaway event in October and November of 2008. That first year over 1,200 trees were given away! The event was so successful that Jim Cherner donated trees again in 2009. On October 31, 2009 we held a "Trick or Tree" event and distributed 975 free trees. Another free tree giveway was held in 2010. The WCC has continued to distribute trees in the years since.

This summer we have taken our mission one step further with the creation of a tree farm right here in Westbury! We are pleased to announce that the Westbury tree farm is now in operation with 170 trees. Trees for Houston suggested that we start the tree farm and they supplied the trees, larger pots, and the expertise to set it up an irrigation system. Scotts Miracle-Gro generously provided the volunteers and the soil to repot the 170 trees. We thank all who helped make this project a reality.

How would you like to have fresh (just picked today), organic fruits and vegetables for your family? Would you feel good about supporting local, urban agriculture (rather than some place in California), right in your own neighborhood? Well, that's what Plant It Forward Farms (PIFF) is all about. You already know from previous



articles that we have two graduate PIFF farmers working right now alongside the folks at Westbury Community Garden, farming 2 acres to support their families.

In addition to selling their produce at the Garden on the weekends, they also offer Farm Shares. For a little more than \$20/week you will get fresh, organically-grown vegetables in season, generally enough for a family of four. It's grocery shopping the old fashioned way—you get to know the people who grow the fruits and vegetables you eat. That is no small thing in this day and age, when a sticker that says "Product of Guatemala" is all the information you get about the carrots you send in your kids' lunch! Farm Share Details

What is a Farm Share?

A farm share is a weekly supply of vegetables purchased in advance and picked up right at the farm stand.

When is the Farm Share Season?

The next 16-week season begins the week of September 8th and ends the week of December 22.

How much does it cost?

It is \$384 if paying by check or \$396 if paying by credit. Registration deadline is August 29.



City of Houston FYI

Road Work In Westbury 1 & 2

The streets marked in blue below will be resurfaced by the City of Houston between July 10 and September 4th according to the door hangers that were delivered to affected homes last month.

Phase 1 is the removal of the old asphalt. During Phase 2 of the project, tack oil will be sprayed and it can adhere to your vehicle and tires and can

strain your driveway. Please observe signs posted that read FRESH OIL and avoid those areas during that phase of the project.

Overlay is not designed to improve or correct drainage issues; it is used to preserve and prolong the life of the road base and provide a smoother riding surface.





Trash Can Placement

- City-provided trash containers must be placed on the curb between 6PM Wednesday and 7AM Thursday
- The container must be accessible to the automated collection truck and not blocked by obstacles, including parked cars or next to light poles or trees.
- Homeowners MUST place trashcans at least three (3) feet apart.
- Homes on corners must place their trash cans on the front street (not side).
- Trash cans must be removed from the curb by 10PM Thursday





Welcome Jason Catchings to WHS!

New Principal for WHS

Westbury High School has a new principal, Jason Catchings. Mr. Catchings previously served as principal at Scarborough High School for 3 years, and before that was an Assistant Principal at Westside High School. He has been very busy in July as he has been transitioning to WHS while still helping at Scarborough as they search for a new principal. Here are some highlights from a community meeting on July 8 and his presentation at the WCC Board meeting on July 16. Members of the Westbury community will have another opportunity to meet him at a WHS "Back to School Bash" on August 21.

Mr. Catchings notes that there are vacancies at WHS that urgently need to be filled. He believes it is important to find people for WHS who know his systems, values, and vision. He is bringing 3 members of his administrative team from Scarborough High School with him to WHS.

Some important issues he sees for WHS include:

- * Recruitment of students from middle schools and connections with the community. He has set up a community room on campus for use by community members. He plans to hold events and performances to get elementary and middle school students to visit WHS. Already a middle school track meet has been scheduled that will host students from 32 middle schools. However, he expects students who request a transfer to WHS to have good records. WHS will not accept transfer requests simply to get headcount. WHS deserves to be a dominant school in the area.
- * Construction and Maintenance The new building is definitely needed. There are also maintenance issues at WHS that need to be fixed. He hopes to have much of it done this summer before school starts (leaky roof, clean the flooring, fix the basketball court surfaces, prune the trees on campus, etc). Curb appeal and perceptions are important.



school. He will create a student leadership team. He also has created a student advisory team over the summer, with students randomly chosen until all the slots have been filled, so that he can get feedback from students over the summer about dress code and behavior expectations. He is working with HISD to get a school logo approved for WHS.

* Academic Rigor – He plans to phase in rigorous PreAP and AP classes for all kids. Some kids may never have taken a PreAP or AP class before, but it is worthwhile even though grades may come down during the transition period for the more difficult classes. It is important for kids to graduate, and he will have one person working with the seniors to make sure that they have the required credits to

METRO Public Meeting

On July 15, METRO held a public meeting at Westbury Baptist Church to obtain public comments about their "Transit System Re-Imagining Project" to revise and improve bus routes city-wide in 2015. To learn more, go to TransitSystemReimagining.com

Here are some highlights of the proposed system from METRO.


Go when you want to go, including weekends! The routes in the proposed network run all weekend, just as frequently as the weekday midday. Getting around on Saturday and Sunday will be much easier than it is today.

Service you can remember. The routes are simpler, straighter and easier to remember and since most routes come more often you can spend less time waiting or worrying about the schedule.

More reliable. Many delays result from buses being stopped by freight trains and are compounded by long, complicated routes. The proposed network reduces the number of street level freight rail crossings by 30% each day. The new routes are shorter, come more often, and have virtually no branches so METRO can do a better job of keeping them on time.

A network for the Houston of today, and tomorrow.

The Houston region is dynamic and growing. The new system serves the biggest job and activity centers, and is ready to grow with the multi-centered region of the future.



How Will Westbury Be Affected?

Although many bus routes across Houston will see an increase in frequency, none of the routes servicing Westbury will have the highest frequency of 10-15 minutes. There will be some modifications to the bus routings. Since the Chimney Rock bus will no longer traverse all of Chimney Rock, the North/South bus routes will be Hillcroft, S. Post Oak, and Fondren. Bus routes will be renumbered across the city. The goal is to move away from a "spoke" system radiating from downtown and move more toward a grid system.

Future Hillcroft Draft Plans

Hillcroft- DRAFT Future Plans

Those of you who travel back and forth to Ft. Bend County may be interested to know that the City of Houston Planning Commission held a Public Hearing in July to get comments about proposed changes for the southern part of Hillcroft (south of Beltway 8).

PROPOSAL:

* Fort Bend County Engineer's Office is requesting an extension of Hillcroft Avenue from Fondren Road to McHard Road (FM 2234) along the Fort Bend Parkway Toll Road be added to the City's Major Thoroughfare and Freeway Plan * The City of Houston - Planning & Development Department is requesting to add Hillcroft Avenue as a Major Thoroughfare between Fondren Road and Beltway 8.

JUSTIFICATION and HISTORY:

Fort Bend County is working with the City of Houston on a joint project to construct northbound and southbound roadways adjacent to the Fort Bend Parkway Toll Road from the intersection of Hillcroft Avenue and Fondren Road to McHard Road within the city limits of Houston. Each roadway will be designed in accordance with City of Houston and Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) requirements and shall have a

cross section of two concrete lanes each with curbs, gutters, storm drainage, illumination, and sidewalks. The extension of Court Road from Quailynn Drive to the proposed southbound road is also included in this construction project.

The addition of these roadway segments allows for the connection of three Major Thoroughfares: Fondren Road, Court Road, and McHard Road providing for north-south connectivity and accessibility between the neighborhoods. The northbound road not only provides connectivity, but also improves access for hurricane evacuation for those residents in the area.

The city of Houston is using this opportunity to evaluate the Hillcroft corridor between Fondren Road and Beltway 8 to ensure continuous connectivity of the Hillcroft Avenue along the Fort Bend Parkway Toll Road as it crosses Fuqua Street, Chasewood Drive and Beltway 8.

The proposed analysis will evaluate the extension of Hillcroft Avenue as a one-way northbound and southbound frontage roads along Fort Bend Parkway Toll Road



Concrete Crushing a Possibility at Willow Waterhole

Southern Crushed Concrete Applied for Permit at Gasmer Location

On July 29, a public meeting was held at Westbury High School to discuss the Southern Crushed Concrete's application for a proposed Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration No. 119443L001 to allow concrete crushing at its Gasmer location.

The TCEQ (Texas Commission on Environmental Quality) director has accepted the application because it follows all the rules and regulations. The public meeting has two parts, an informal discussion and a formal comment period. After the formal meeting, the director of the TCEQ will review the case and determine if a contested hearing is needed.

Risks to Human Health

Concrete dust and particulate matter from the plant will negatively affect the health of nearby residents. Concrete dust has been known to cause lung disease, exacerbate pre-existing pulmonary conditions and exacerbate heart disease. Concrete dust will get into the air not only from the plant, but from trucks driving over the unpaved property, and from trucks bringing in material and idling on Gasmer Road waiting to enter the property.

In addition, there will be risks to the users of the Willow Waterhole Greenway Park. Many residents of the local area utilize the park for outdoor recreation. The park is located within 440 yards of the proposed plant. Users of this park will be exposed to the concrete dust and particulate matter generated from the plant. Since this plant is permitted to run for six days a week, 12 hours a day, it will be difficult for users of the park to escape the dust and noise caused by the plant and the trucks using this plant.

Environmental Effects on Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve / Willow Waterhole Greenway Park

There will likely be environmental impacts (dust and water runoff) at the adjoining

Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve/ Willow Waterhole Greenway Park. The effluent from the water sprayed to reduce the dust from the plant and from storm water will exit the site and flow into the detention areas of the Willow Waterhole. Such effluent would be highly alkaline and would negatively affect the water quality in Willow Waterhole.

The dust and water runoff will negatively impact the Texas Prairie Dawn Flower, an endangered species that grows at the Willow Waterhole.

According to the Texas Administrative Code, Title 30, Part 1, Chapter 101, Subchapter A, Rule 101.4, states that, "No person shall discharge from any source whatsoever one or more air contaminants or combinations thereof, in such concentration and of such duration as are or may tend to be injurious to or adversely affect human health or welfare, animal life, vegetation, or property, or as to interfere with the normal use and enjoyment of animal life, vegetation, or property."

Warning for Drivers near Westbury Fire Station

Drivers Be CAREFUL near the Westbury Fire Station

Westbury is fortunate to have our very own city fire station located on Chimney Rock in the center of Westbury. Please be very careful when driving in the vicinity of the Westbury Fire Station. Emergency response vehicles leaving the fire station may be heading SOUTH (the regular way) or NORTH (the wrong way) on Chimney Rock. Also, sometimes traffic must stop to allow emergency vehicles to back into the fire station.

Cars waiting at the traffic light at the corner of Burdine and Chimney Rock are not allowed to turn right on red onto Chimney Rock near the fire station. Additionally, it is advised that drivers waiting at that intersection allow sufficient room for emergency vehicles driving the wrong way up Chimney Rock to make a quick turn onto Burdine.
