Yard sales, garage sales, estate sales, moving sales, etc. are **NOT ALLOWED** at residential properties in Westbury. This applies to **ALL** sections of Westbury and Parkwest. The Civic Club provides fall and spring community garage sale events to our members. The Civic Club will provide security and publicity for the sale. The Civic Club does NOT provide tables, chairs, or shade.

Booth space will go on sale Monday, September 26, for Westbury residents ONLY. Booths will be on sale during the normal Civic Club office hours 9:30AM to 1:30PM. The WCC office will be open late on Wednesday, September 28, from 6PM to 8PM for booth space purchase. You must be a current member of the Westbury Civic Club to purchase booth space. This means you had to have paid your WCC membership dues of \$36. The booth prices for Westbury residents will be \$15 (small) or \$20 (large). Booths will go on sale to non-residents on October 5. The booth price for non-residents is \$50 and \$55.

The Westbury White Elephant Sale allows residents an opportunity to sell unwanted items at a highly visible central location with security provided. Most crimes are crimes of opportunity, so the fewer non-residents that we invite down our streets on the weekends, the fewer weekday crime problems we have to contend with.

So, have fun, make money, be safe and be a good neighbor. Plan on having a booth at the Westbury White Elephant Sale!

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MANDATORY WATER RESTRICTIONS

On August 15th, due to persistent drought conditions and continuously decreasing water levels in Lake Houston, Mayor Parker mandated the implementation of the City of Houston Stage Two Water Conservation Measures in accordance with the procedures outlined in Chapter 47 in the <u>Code of Ordinances</u>. Please see below for a copy of the city ordinance. **Failure to follow requirements may result in fines. For questions or to report a violation, please call 3-1-1.**

"While these restrictions are mandatory, we will begin with warnings and an informational campaign because the goal is voluntary compliance," said Mayor Parker. "For those who insist on not being good neighbors, citations will follow."

CITY OF HOUSTON ORDINANCE FOR STAGE TWO WATER SHORTAGE

Sec. 47-252. - Stage two water shortage.

- (a) A stage two water shortage is a period of time that begins when, upon the recommendation of the director, the mayor declares a stage two water shortage upon finding that one or more of the following conditions exist:
 - (1) Combined reservoir storage supply is approx. 24 months' surface water supply for a period of ten consecutive days;
 - (2) Average water production is 80 percent of the combined pumpage capacity of the treated ground water and surface water system for a period of three consecutive days; or
 - (3) Average water pressure within the city's treated water distribution system is 45 pounds per square inch or less. The declaration, may cover all or only a part of the city, shall be in writing and filed with the city secretary. A stage two water shortage ends when the director finds that the conditions leading to the declaration have ceased to exist for a period of between three and ten days, taking into consideration weather reports, the condition of the water system, and associated factors, and the director files a written declaration to that effect with the city secretary.
- **(b)** During a stage two water shortage, customers are required to:
 - (1) Repair detectible water leaks within 72 hours of discovery; and
 - (2) Limit outdoor irrigation to the hours between 12:01 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. or between 8:00 p.m. and midnight on no more than two days per week in conformity with the following schedule:
 - a. Sundays and Thursdays for customers with even-numbered street addresses; and
 - **b.** Saturdays and Wednesdays for customers with odd-numbered street addresses.
- (c) During a stage two water shortage, the director shall institute a water use reduction program for city departments, including but not limited to:
 - (1) Establishing a ten percent water consumption reduction goal for all city departments;
 - (2) Ensuring that city irrigation systems do not wastewater;
 - (3) Discontinuing of water main flushing except to protect life or health; and
 - (4) Discontinuing washing of city vehicles.

WAYS YOU CAN HELP CONSERVE WATER

- Keep showers under five minutes
- Turn water off while brushing your teeth
- Wash only full loads of dishes or clothes
- Refrain from washing any vehicle or motorbike unless the dirt poses a driving hazard
- Refrain from washing down any sidewalk, walkway, driveway, parking lot
- Refrain from filling, refilling or adding water to any indoor or outdoor swimming pool, spa or whirlpool.

Decrease in Crime Morgan Gaskin, Security Director

There was a remarkable decrease in crime in the latter part of July through the middle of August. This may be attributed to the scorching heat and/or to the great job done by our law enforcement officers who report more frequent patrols throughout the neighborhood. Interestingly, most of the crimes for this reporting period are centered around public areas, specifically Hager Park and Anderson Elementary School. Parents, please make sure that as school starts, instruct your children about the need for safety at all times and the importance of knowing your surroundings, especially as they travel to and from school if they travel unaccompanied. I look forward to a continued decrease in crime in the next reporting cycle. Continue to take the small steps to secure your family and your property such as testing your alarm system, removing valuables from your vehicles, and reporting any unusual activity.

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Waste Management, Inc.

Waste Management hosted the grand opening of their state of the art single stream recycling facility on Gasmer near South Post Oak. They will be recycling over 100 million tons of recyclables a year. This is the facility that processes Westbury's recyclables as well as recyclables from all over the city.

In addition to recycling, this facility has an education room on the second floor that overlooks the recycling operation. This beautiful new education room that was created by artist Dan Phillips and the Phoenix Commotion. The entire room including the chairs were made from recycled material. The room is educational, inspirational and completely unique. Look for opportunities in future Criers to visit this incredible facility.

It was with great pleasure and heartfelt thanks that the Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy accepted a \$6,000 donation from Waste Management. WWGC President, Howard Sacks and WWGC Recording Secretary, Becky Edmondson accepted the donation from Paul Ware and Laura Stein of WM.

September 1956

- ◆ Bikes, bikes everywhere! With the start of school, did you notice the great increase in number of bicycles on the streets of Westbury? Please drive slowly.
- ♦ New club "Home" The September meeting will be the first one held in the 250 seat community hall of the Harris County Water Control and Improvement District 49 (now called the Platou Center).

September 1962

◆The start of the first direct-to-downtown air conditioned bus service south of Brays Bayou and west of Main Street. We are pleased to have the start of this line in Westbury.


September 1985

♦ Message from the board: We get many complaints regarding vacant houses, 18 wheelers, garage sales, multi-family dwellings, businesses in homes, illegal carports, plumbing company in homes, garage apartment rentals, building code violations, lot line inquires, car repair business in homes, stagnant pools, health violations, bee hives, chickens, rabbits, signs on esplanades, trash/garbage on the esplanades, high weeds, water leak complaints, loud music, junk cars in driveways, junk cars in yards, loose stray dogs, and more. Sometime the office is more like a zoo. Remember the tiger we had out in Westbury 4? We recently found a gorilla on Hillcroft.

Proposed ByLaw Revisions

At the upcoming September general meeting, there are several modifications to the WCC ByLaws proposed by the ByLaws Revision Committee, as summarized below:

- 1. Decrease the interval between when directors are elected in September and when they commence duties. Currently duties commence on January 1.
- 2. Eliminate section director geographic restrictions for Westbury 5, as consistent with Westbury 3 and 4.
- 3. Add Director of Communications position to the board.
- 4. Provide more flexibility for meeting times.
- 5. Modify financial oversight responsibilities and remove requirements that are covered elsewhere.

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

Commercial Businesses operating out of Westbury Homes

All Westbury homes are protected by deed restrictions which limit how the property may be used. One requirement is your property is to be used for residential purposes. The City of Houston Legal Department enforces this deed restriction (and others). Recent violators handled by the city involved: an auto repair business, a landscaping business, and vehicles defined as commercial (tow truck, ambulance, delivery truck, etc) parked on residential property. Violators can be fined and may incur expenses for legal representation in court.



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
