Get Involved with Westbury Area HISD Schools

Do you wonder what you can do to make a difference? Do you wish our area schools were better? Well, here are some opportunities for you to help.

Join the Westbury High School PTO!

Principal Catchings listed three things that must happen for Westbury High School to be the best that it can be. One of these is the support of the community. He encouraged everyone to join the WHS PTO, even if you don't have kids at WHS. The PTO membership form is on the WHS website, www.houstonisd.org/Domain/8388. There is a list of volunteer activities to choose from and membership is as low as \$10. He is asking the PTO to raise its fundraising goals this year to raise over \$100,000 and to allocate most to scholarships.

Buddies for Kids at Parker Elementary

WHAT IS IT? As a child's buddy, you will be called to provide consistent support, guidance, and concrete help to a child who is in need of a positive role model. Children involved in the Buddies for Kids program may be going through a difficult and/or challenging situation, a period of life in which they need extra support, or they may simply need to have another significant adult present in their life.

WHAT DO BUDDIES DO? Each child is a little different and there is a required orientation/ training session in order to serve as a buddy. We ask that you dedicate 30 minutes per week for at least one year to be a buddy to a child. It may be during their lunch break or recess as long as it is a consistent time that has been arranged with your child's teacher.

READY TO INVEST IN A CHILD? You can begin the process for volunteering at Parker by going to www.houstonisd.org to fill out the background check information. Once at the website, the "Community" tab will take you to the "Volunteer" information which will lead you to the registration process. This takes about 2 minutes to fill out. Once you have filled out the on-line form, simply take your driver's license to the receptionist at Parker Elementary and she will scan it for approval.

QUESTIONS? Parker Elementary is located at 10626 Atwell (near Chimney Rock and Willowbend intersection). Start by contacting Michelle Vanderwater at mvanderwater@att.net. The training/orientation-date will be in early October and the pizza kick-off party will follow soon thereafter.

Literacy By 3 at Foerster Elem.

Houston ISD's new pilot program is Literacy By 3 which is supporting a movement to have every child reading on grade level by the end of third grade. This program is at a Westbury area school, Foerster Elementary near the Westbury Community Garden.

HISD has identified nearly 300 first-grade classes at more than 50 schools where children are desperately in need of an adult to read aloud to them and to listen to them read. This will reinforce the process their teachers have started in the classroom. You will build an important relationship with a student that can make a lasting impact on their self-esteem, ability to learn, and ultimate success.

Houston is in a literacy crisis, and it will take everyone – schools, families, community — to help provide this basic skill that can make the difference between lifelong learning and achievement or frustration and failure. By working with the same students for an entire school year, you have the potential to become a mentor who helps change the direction and life of these youngsters — simply by sharing the gift of reading.

Foerster Elementary, located on Fonmeadow near the Westbury Community Garden, is on the list of schools seeking reading mentors. Some residents of Westbury and the Westbury Super Neighborhood are zoned to

Foerster
Elementary. If you are interested in sharing your love of reading, please consider aiding children at Foerster Elementary.

2014 Annual Meeting

The 2014 Westbury Annual Meeting kicked off with a meet and greet period with residents getting a chance to meet board members. All attendees were greeted with free Westbury "swag" including a shopping bag, cup, and magnet, all with the WCC logo. Pizza was provided by the WCC and Jackie Murray of Weichert Realtors provided water and cookies.



President Becky Edmondson welcomed the crowd of over 100 residents and guests. Becky acknowledged our guests from Houston City Council: District K - Larry Green, At-Large 2 - Stephen Costello, At-Large 5 - Jack Christie, and District G - Oliver Pennington. HISD Trustee Wanda Adams and Mary Seymour, representing Texas State Rep Borris Miles.

Guest Speakers:

Westbury HS Principal Jason Catchings, made an extraordinary effort to speak at the Annual Meeting, since WHS was having its Open House on the same night. Mr.
Catchings called
WHS a
"sleeping giant"
with huge
potential. WHS
is the first HISD
AP Campus
(AP = Advanced
Placement). All

students are encouraged to sign up for Pre-AP and AP classes, and they are doing so. WHS is about a year ahead of schedule for the 2012 bond project.

To be successful as an AP campus, WHS needs three things to happen: A strong leader principal, the kids to accept the program, and support of the community. He encouraged everyone to join the WHS PTO, even if you don't have kids at WHS. The PTO membership form is on the WHS website. The kids and families attending WHS are already accepting the vision. The Back to School Bash was attended by 495 people, and the Open House had over 600 people on the campus. He is asking the PTO to raise its fundraising goals this year

to raise over \$100,000 and to allocate most to scholarships. **Oliver Pennington,** current District G Council member and mayoral candidate for 2015, spoke briefly.

District K CM Larry Green gave a fast-paced update since he had a long list of issues to cover at the meeting. CM Green urged residents to use 311 to make service request, then contact the WCC Office and the District K Office. He emphasized that each city department has a liaison with city council, so council requests get higher priority. The Westbury Community Garden has been saved. TxDOT has cleaned the intersection of S. Post Oak and W. Bellfort. Homeless at intersection of S. Post Oak and W. Bellfort, call his office. CM Green gave an update on Capital Improvement Projects through the City (CIP). Waterlines in WB5 and WB2, asphalt overlays in WB1 and WB2, have been pushing flooding problems in Westbury area. The Public Works Dept. will be doing a study this fall. (Continued on page 9)

CM Green shared the exciting news that an LA Fitness is proposed for the "Westbury Centerette" property and hopefully will be a catalyst for economic

development. District K received \$2.1 M for street lights and a center barrier from TXDOT. This will extend from Beltway 8 all the way to the Loop along US90A. District K held a workshop on Sept. 20 at WHS for Code Enforcement. CM Green's goal is to train neighborhoods to solve issues and be proactive. He concluded by saying that Westbury always make him look good!

Our schools are an important piece of our neighborhood. HISD was in attendance at our annual meeting to show their commitment to bringing quality education to Houston and Westbury. It was quite impressive to have 20 HISD administrators on hand, including our Trustee Wanda Adams!

HISD Trustee Wanda Adams spoke about the Westbury High School band trip to Canton, Ohio. She reiterated her commitment to our neighborhood schools and asked us to keep her accountable.

Top HISD Chief School Support Officer Dr. Shonda Hardman spoke eloquently and passionately about HISD. Variance Request for Westbury Centerette

Perhaps you have seen the sign posted on the old Westbury Centerrette property at West Bellfort and Chimney Rock. Last month we told you that the owners of the property had filed a re-plat request and we noticed that the setbacks were incorrect. The purpose of the City requiring applicants to post PROMINENTLY for variance requests is so that everyone will know that a request has been made to the city to allow a variation to a city ordinance and to allow input from the public. In this case, it is for the property setbacks. The city ordinance in Chapter 42 requires a property setback of 25 feet on major thoroughfares and 10 feet on residential streets (when not otherwise created by deed restrictions). The original re-plat showed 10 foot setbacks. The WCC opposes a 10 foot setback on West Bellfort. This is a busy thoroughfare and we felt 10 feet is too close. On Chimney Rock we do not have the same concerns. As of press time, we have not seen the actual variance request but we suspect it is just for Chimney Rock as the owners understood our concerns about West Bellfort.

Please remember that any developer that purchases any unrestricted commercial property in Houston (Westbury) can build whatever he wants as long as it does not violate a city ordinance and even then things like property setbacks can be waived by the city planning department. We work closely with the City to try to address concerns of negative impact such as traffic, light pollution, aesthetics, flooding etc. We also try to work with owners, potential investors and developers to encourage them to be good neighbors.

The **proposed** plan by Samantha Fitness is for a 38,000 square foot 2 story building that is proposed to house an LA Fitness center with a parking garage. This should be a wonderful addition to Westbury.

Sometimes development such as cell tower erection, pollution causing processes, like concrete batching, etc. require that MAILED notice be sent to residential property within a certain distance of proposed developments. (This is not one of them.) If any of you receive a written notice in the future, please let the WCC office know. Several years ago a cell tower was proposed for Westbury Square and because a handful of residences were within the required radius, we were able to oppose it.



Ditch De-Silting to Begin Soon Hummingbird and Bankside—D139-04-000

For years, residents and the Westbury Civic Club have been concerned about the state of the Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) ditches in Westbury. We were concerned that our ditches had not been de-silted for decades. Water has accumulated and does not drain from the Hummingbird/Bankside ditch (D139-04-00) creating flooding fears for nearby residents. Work along this section of the ditch is to begin very soon. The WCC was told that it would be the first project in the bid. We are pleased to announce that HCFCD has reported the following timeline:

De-Silt Packet Bid Date: August 27, 2014

Bid Opening: September 8, 2014

Projected Award of Contract: September 23, 2014

Projected Start Date: Mid/Late October 2014

House Numbers

Also, take a look at your house number today. Do you have house numbers on your house and are the numbers readily visible from the street? Did you know that the city requires EVERY home to have a visible house number, so that emergency vehicles can respond quickly to the correct address. A house number painted on the curb is helpful, but it can be obscured by a parked car. The ordinance says a house number should be placed either on the primary door or within 18 inches from that door. If your house was built before 1979, then the numbers have to be at least 2" tall. If your house was built between 1979 and 2010, then the numbers have to be at least 3" tall. If your house was built after January 2010, then the numbers should be at least 4" tall.









WHERE IS THE GARDEN?

2014 Election Information

VOTER ID IS REQUIRED TO VOTE

- **1.** A voter will be required to show one of the following forms of photo identification at the polling location before the voter will be permitted to cast a vote:
- Texas driver license issued by the DPS
- Texas Election ID Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS
- U.S. military ID card with photograph
- U.S. citizenship certificate with photograph
- ☑ United States passport

2. My ID is expired. Will it still work?

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 60 days before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place.

- **3.** A **permanent exemption** is available for voters with documented disabilities. Voters with a disability may apply with the county voter registrar for a permanent exemption. Affidavits are available for voters who have a consistent religious objection to being photographed and for voters who do not have any photo identification as a result of certain natural disasters as declared by the President of the United States or the Texas Governor within 45 days of the day the ballot was cast.
- **4.** Election officials will review the ID and if a name is "substantially similar" to the name on their list of registered voters, you will still be able to vote, but you will also have to submit an affidavit stating that you are the same person on the list of registered voters.
- **5.** If a voter does not present proper identification, the voter will still be permitted to vote provisionally. The voter will have (six) 6 days to present proper identification to the county voter registrar for the voter's ballot to be accepted.

WAIC / Southern Crushed Concrete

TCEQ & Southern Crushed Concrete Air Permit Application

Southern Crushed Concrete has applied for a permit through the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to allow concrete batching at its Gasmer location. In August, State Representative Borris Miles facilitated a community meeting by the TCEQ at Westbury High School.

Concerns expressed at the public hearing focused on the concrete dust and particulate matter from the batching plant that will negatively affect the public health of nearby residents and possible environmental impacts of dust and water runoff into the adjoining Willow Waterhole.

The public comment deadline was August 25. It is expected to take up to at least 60 days to hear from the TCEQ on the decision. Please stay tuned to our Facebook page *Westbury Houston*, or our website,

The nonprofit WAIC monthly meeting was held on September 17.

School Reports

Parker Elementary currently has 843 students. To support the HISD literacy effort they have several events planned: a movie night with the movie *Narnia* and books available to read from the series, a "Little Free Library" where a child can bring a book and take a book, and monthly drawings for Lego kits for children who have read at least 3 books.

Anderson Elementary announced that they have closed the performance gap in math and language and once again meet requirements. A NEW dual language program was started at the kindergarten level this year. An additional grade level will be added each year until dual language is available at all grade levels. Dual language offers instruction in both English and Spanish and is intended to have both native English speakers and native Spanish speakers fluent in both languages. Realtor Wayne Murray of Weichert Realtors offered to donate prizes for drawings for the literacy efforts at Anderson Elementary.

Westbury High School – Cindy Chapman and Becky Edmondson are on the Project Advisory Team for the WHS bond construction project. Principal Jason Catchings spoke at the WCC annual meeting.

Officer Reports

Treasurer Marcia Hartman noted that the WCC has donated \$2,000 to the WAIC, part of which has been used to purchase insurance. The nonprofit WAIC will now operate the Westbury Community Garden, rather than the WCC. The city requires insurance.

The following organizations gave updates: Friends of Westbury High School Foundation, Westbury Little League, Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy, the Westbury Community Garden, Barbara Hite from District K, and Veronica Hernandez from the Mayor's Office.

Barbara Hite reported that there were about 35 requests submitted to District K for the new "Council District Service Budget" of \$1,000,000 that CM Larry Green can choose how to allocate across District K. The WAIC and the WCC both submitted several requests.


