#### **Chimney Rock Park Needs Your Help**


Chimney Rock Park is a City Park in Westbury. Located near the US Post Office on Chimney Rock, the park features the Platou Community Center, a playground, and tennis and basketball courts. In order to make the playground area more user friendly and comfortable, four benches and a picnic table were recently donated to be installed in the shade near the playground.

The donated benches and picnic table must be installed on concrete pads in the park, per city requirements. Some of the money to install these amenities has already been raised, but more money is needed. The Friends of Chimney Rock Park need to raise about \$2,500 to pay for the installation costs. Park goers are eagerly awaiting these benches and picnic table. We all know how important a comfortable spot in the shade is during our hot Houston summers.

### A Message from the Westbury Civic Club President

This is my first President's Message as I follow Becky Edmondson as President of the WCC. Becky served 8 years as President, longer than any other President in more than 60 years of the existence of the WCC. Her accomplishments are many and her accolades are well deserved. Both Texas Senator Borris Miles and District K Councilmember Martha Castex-Tatum presented official recognitions to Becky at the September Annual Meeting. Even though I have been involved with the Westbury Civic Club for years, it is somewhat intimidating to follow a legendary WCC President. Some of you have seen my name here and there in the monthly newsletter, but may not know much about me. So, let me introduce myself! I settled in Westbury as a newlywed 30 years ago in 1988 when my husband, Walter, and I moved to Houston. We were both chemical engineers and Houston had, and still has, lots of jobs for chemical engineers. We bought our home in Westbury because we loved the trees and spacious yards, and the proximity to the 610 Loop boded well to be able to drive to any future job location across the Metro area in any direction. More importantly, we could afford a house in Westbury, even with interest rates at the shockingly high rate of 10.25% interest. Even today Westbury has continued to be one of the more affordable neighborhoods near the 610 Loop.

My first involvement with civic volunteer life started a few years later. A neighbor, Chris Sovereign, and I were both on maternity leave. We saw that another community had raised funds to improve their local playground, so we started talking about what we could do to change Westbury Park, which had ancient swing sets for play equipment. Chris decided

that she would start soliciting funds to improve Westbury Park if I agreed to help her. So we started the process for fundraising and working with the City. We started planning the project while on our first maternity leave, but the process took 2+ years, such that my second child was resting on my hip during the Grand Opening. (This happened so long ago that the "improved" Westbury Park playground has since been demolished and replaced). During that era, I served a few years as a WCC Section Director, but I stepped down after family and work life got more hectic.

I stopped working as an engineer in July 2005 and saw in the *Crier* that there were openings available on the WCC board for the upcoming Annual Meeting. After two years as a Director, I became President of the WCC in 2008. That year was memorable for Hurricane Ike – where much of Westbury and the WCC office were closed for almost 2 weeks due to no electricity, followed by a huge market crash. I served as WCC President for 3 years and then served as WCC Director of Community Relations and last year I served as Vice President.

Both Becky Edmondson and I agree on the importance of building relationships and connections as a key part of being strong advocates for Westbury. Happily, Becky will continue with her many advocacy efforts while in her new role as WCC Treasurer. Over the years, Becky and I have attended so many meetings together (or have substituted for each other) that sometimes people have a hard time remembering who is Cindy or who is Becky (so we answer to either name or to variations like Cindy Edmondson or Becky Chapman – ha!), but they do remember that we are advocates for Westbury!

In addition to being WCC President, I will continue to serve as the primary Westbury Super Neighborhood delegate to the Super Neighborhood Alliance(SNA) and as a member of the SNA executive committee. I am a board member for the following organizations: the Brays Oaks Management District, SWHouston2000, Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy, Neighborhoods to Trails SW, and the Women's Club of Rice University.

As you can see in this issue, October is a busy month. A key item is that this is an election year for state and federal elections, and there are two city ballot propositions to vote on. Early voting starts on October 22. I encourage all eligible Westbury residents to vote. Westbury has a reputation for having a solid level of civic engagement and voting, which is unusual in Houston and in Texas.

I want to thank each and every one of you who support the Precinct 5 Constable Westbury Area Patrol with your dollars. Precinct 5 recently arrested 7 members of a juvenile gang (astonishingly, ages 11 – 14) who had been attacking vulnerable victims in the Westbury and general area. You can read more about it on page 15.

Let me finish this message with a small request. Please consider supporting some of our fine Westbury non-profits with your financial donations. This month I would like to highlight the Friends of Chimney Rock Park /Platou Community Center. The "Friends" need to raise about \$2,500 to implement some park improvements in this city park right located in the middle of Westbury. I have sent them a donation, and I hope that you will also consider doing so. If 100 people donated \$25 each, then they would have the funds needed to complete their small project. Thanks and have a great October!

#### Franny Oxford, Westbury 1 Section Director



#### Safe Driving in School Zones

With our schools back in session, please be mindful to take extra care around school zones and crosswalks, especially during drop off and pick up times. Take a look at the diagram below to refresh your memory about when and where you are required to stop for school buses. Drivers going in both directions must **STOP** for a school bus (Willowbend) unless the school bus is stopped on a road which has a divider / esplanade separating the lanes of traffic (W. Bellfort and W. Airport).


The HISD Transportation Department changed its magnet bus program to have centralized hubs throughout the city. Both Anderson Elementary and Parker Elementary have become regional school bus "Hubs" for magnet students, resulting in more bus activity and traffic in our area in both the morning and afternoon.

We remind you to take caution when driving through school zones. Those strict speed limits are there for a reason and we have asked Pct. 5 to closely monitor traffic near Anderson ES, Parker ES, Meyerland Middle School, and Westbury HS to make sure our school kids are safe.

Put down your phone while driving near schools. It is illegal to text or talk on the phone while driving in school zones. Also, make sure you stop when school busses are loading and unloading.



### **Election Information - Proposition A & B**

**Questions and Answers by the Westbury Civic Club** 

Questions and Answers by the WCC about Proposition A What is the intent of this ballot item? Voters are being asked to restrict the Rebuild Houston fees so that the revenues are DEDICATED for flooding, drainage, and street improvements. A vote YES means that the revenue funds will be restricted to those uses. A vote NO means that the funds will not be restricted. Whether you vote Yes or No, the monthly drainage fees paid by Westbury and Houston residents will still continue to show up on your utility bill.

Why are we voting on Proposition A; Didn't voters vote on this same topic years ago? The Houston Chronicle on August 9, 2018 describes this ballot item as, "a 'do-over' of ReBuild Houston, the 2010 charter amendment that created the city's program for repairing streets and drainage pipes and ditches. The Texas Supreme Court voided the original election because the ballot language did not make clear that the program envisioned a new drainage fee residents would pay." Whether you vote Yes or No, the monthly drainage fees paid by Westbury and Houston residents will still continue to show up on your utility bill.

What is the impact of this ballot item on residents of Westbury? Our subdivision was built more than 60 years ago. The infrastructure in Westbury has not been updated or replaced for most of our streets or street stormwater drainage systems. Westbury has several capital improvement projects waiting to be implemented and funded. These projects are currently under ReBuild Houston.

Questions and Answers by the WCC about Proposition B Why are we voting on this ballot item? The Firefighters Union did a petition drive to place this item on the ballot to increase fire department salaries and provide certain other benefits. If approved, firefighter pay would be linked to police officer pay.

What are the pros and cons? This is a complicated topic and the WCC encourages residents to do their own research. There seems to be general agreement by both sides that fire department workers deserve a salary increase. There is disagreement about how to implement a salary increase, how much the salary increase should be, and whether the City can afford the proposed salary increases without adverse impacts such as reduction in city services or personnel.


The fire union says that its workers are leaving the City of Houston for higher pay elsewhere and that this will continue if the ballot item is not approved. They say that the City has not followed through on pledges to increase their salaries. The City says that in the first year a 25% increase in salary would be needed at a cost of \$98 million (with up to \$298 million in costs anticipated over 3 years), and that the City may have to lay off employees and reduce city services to implement the proposed salary increase. The City says the Mayor has offered a 9.5% raise over 3 years.


What is the impact of this ballot item on residents of Westbury? This is a city-wide issue and does not seem to have a specific impact on Westbury residents.

"Shall the Houston City Charter be amended to establish a Dedicated Pay-As-You-Go Fund, to be used for the enhancement, improvement, and ongoing renewal of Houston's drainage and streets, funded annually from the following sources: (i) developer impact fees; (ii) drainage charges, to property owners or users, to recover costs of providing drainage to benefitting real properties; (iii) a portion of the City's ad valorem tax levy; and (iv) third-party contracts, grants, or payments earmarked or dedicated to drainage or streets?"

Persons employed in the following firefighter classifications shall receive the same base pay as persons of like seniority employed in the following, similarly numbered police officer classifications....."

The September WCC Annual Meeting was opened by Parker Elementary School Principal, Lori Frodine, who welcomed the enthusiastic crowd to the incredible new Parker Auditorium. Tours were given of the new school before the meeting began, and everyone agreed it was quite a beautiful school that would serve our community for decades to come.

It was an ambitious agenda and many of the people who serve and represent us in Westbury were on hand to give updates. However, before the speakers began, the Westbury Civic Club recognized Becky Edmondson for her 8 years of excellence in service as WCC President with a video trip down memory lane and a beautiful bouquet of flowers.



Mary Seymore with Senator Borris Miles' office presented Becky with a resolution from the Texas Senate.

At-Large Council Member(CM) Mike Knox said being an At-Large CM was a bit like being a mini-mayor as you represent the whole city. He grew up in Westbury, and has always been available when we've reached out to him with issues. There are five At-Large council seats

and the WCC often reaches out to them. At Large CM Amanda Edwards attended the WCC August meeting.





Annual WCC meeting continued with news from District K CM Martha Castex-Tatum. She is working hard to get federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to help reduce flooding in the Westbury area. She invited City of Houston Chief Resiliency officer, known as the "Flood Czar", Steve Costello, to the WCC Annual Meeting.

**Steve Costello** explained the difference between federal HUD and FEMA funds for flood funding, and the status of the pursuits of money for Houston from each. He also discussed the purchase of an area for the future Larry Green Memorial Detention Basin. This was a detention project that CM Green had made possible with money from the 2015 flooding, but had not yet come to fruition at the time of his untimely death. It would serve as a wonderful memorial to his memory as he

> worked tirelessly with Westbury for infrastructure improvements and stormwater detention to mitigate Westbury flooding woes.

Meet & Greet before meeting

TX State Rep. Shawn Thierry was

accompanied by her staff David Janise and Sheryl Scott Taylor (pictured below). She announced that a group was offering \$35k in loans for businesses impacted by Hurricane Harvey. Rep. Thierry is very concerned about flooding in her district and worked hard to bring resources to the area after Harvey. She brought a letter, dated Sept. 10, to Harris County Judge Ed Emmett outlining a list of potential projects for the Harris County bond project to implement to mitigate flooding in southwest Houston. She facilitated several meetings of the "Southwest Stakeholders Higher Ground Resiliency Group" which brought together informed constituents and invested stakeholders. She is organizing a bill writing workshop and looking for feedback for bills to pursue to improve the area. Do you have an idea for a change you'd like to see that might work as bill before the State? Last session (2017) 1,252 new laws were passed.





HISD Trustee Wanda Adams (pictured above) represents most of Westbury in District IX, which includes Parker, Anderson and Westbury High School. She noted that the 2012 HISD Bond money is in full effect as evidenced by the new buildings at Parker Elementary and Westbury HS. She updated the crowd on the new Fine Arts wing which will be built at Westbury HS, and the ongoing Fine Arts magnet program which she brought back to Westbury High School several years ago.

No annual meeting is complete without an update from the Harris County Flood Control District. They brought their display boards and were set up both before and after the meeting to answer individual questions. Deputy Executive Director of HCFCD Matthew Zeve gave an update on the flood plans for the area, including the news that the Willow Waterhole Bayou area was being evaluated as part of the Fondren Diversion Channel bond work. He was followed by Project Brays Project Manager Gary Zika who gave an update on Project Brays.

Public Safety is always a concern and both HPD and Pct. 5, gave updates. Lt. Julie Manfre, from the HPD Southwest Station, said that crime was down 26% in Westbury – when comparing Jan-Aug 2018 vs Jan-Aug 2017 (down 9.5% in Houston). This is good news as sometimes when we read social media reports from all over the area, it seems crime is worse. Lt. Hutter from Harris County Constables Pct. 5 introduced the 4 deputies who patrol our neighborhood as part of the Precinct 5 security contract with Westbury, also known as WAP (Westbury Area Patrol).

Malkia Hutchinson, Representative for Pct 1 Commissioner Rodney Ellis, brought greetings from Commissioner Ellis' office which represents about 1.1 million residents. She reminded us of the free swimming lessons available for all residents of Pct 1 at the Harris County Aquatic Center, located just a few miles away near NRG stadium. Sign up on http://hcp1.net/

#### **Investigation Leads to Arrests**

The contract that the Westbury Civic Club has with the Harris County Precinct 5 Constable office, the Westbury Area Patrol (WAP), is more than just the security patrol. Obviously, through highly visible security patrols, they are able to deter crime and respond faster when a crime does occur in our Westbury neighborhood. But did you know that they also investigate crimes?

When Westbury South had a recent rash of crimes being perpetrated by a group of young kids, the Precinct 5 constable placed a Special Response Unit, an unmarked car, in the neighborhood. These investigators spotted some juveniles attempting to steal a gas can from a lawn service truck. They called in a marked patrol unit which pulled over the stolen vehicle. Two juveniles escaped, but the other two were apprehended and confessed that they were planning to use the stolen gas to burn the stolen vehicle. Shockingly, the two juveniles apprehended were 11 and 12 years old.

The two who had been apprehended helped Precinct 5 investigators arrest the rest of the gang, who admitted involvement in the assault on longtime Westbury resident, Ray Johnson. Thankfully, Ray was only shaken up and sustained minor injuries during the aggravated robbery. These young boys took the 76 year old Mr. Johnson's walking cane and beat him with it. They also had a gun. A neighbor heard the shouting and ran out outside which sent the young thugs scurrying.

This group of kids is suspected of being responsible for a number of aggravated robberies, carjackings, and thefts over the past several months. At the time of printing, 7 juveniles had been arrested, all between the ages of 11 & 14 years old.

#### Westbury 1 Break In and Auto Theft

On a Sunday afternoon, shortly after leaving home, a Westbury 1 resident had a notification from their alarm company. Precinct 5 WAP was dispatched but, in just those brief 5 minutes, the perpetrators were able to kick in the back door, steal the resident's car, and get away.

Anything you can do to make your home more secure and slow down thieves is helpful. Put a lock on the gate to your backyard, arm your alarms, and use extra security locks if possible. There are several ways to slow down the kick in thieves: Door jamb armor that replaces your existing strike plate or the Master Lock door security bar that nests against your door knob.

If you see anything suspicious, remember to call the Westbury Area Patrol dispatch number at 281-463-6666. Legitimate people won't mind being stopped.

Mark your calendars for the October PIP meeting as officers from Auto theft will be on hand to offer VIN number etching on your car windows as a theft deterrent and possible insurance cost saving. The etching will sart at 5PM with the PIP meeting starting at 7PM.

# Burglar Alarm Ordinance Alarm Permit Requirement Information

City Ordinance requires burglar and panic alarm systems installed, in use, and/or monitored within the city limits to receive emergency response from the Houston Police Department to have a valid and current alarm permit. The residential or non-residential alarm system owner is responsible for any false alarm fees and penalties for violation of this ordinance.

Why get a permit? The Houston Police Department (HPD) may refuse to respond to an alarm notification from a non-permitted burglar alarm system. Non-permitted locations receiving police response are subject to costly penalties ranging today from \$114.03 to \$478.93 for each false alarm.

Additionally, residential burglar alarm permit holders receive their first 3 false burglar alarms and first false panic alarm free. Did you know last year 96% of all alarm calls HPD responded to were false? When HPD responds to false alarms, they are diverted from true emergencies, citywide response times increase, and limited city financial resources are strained.

#### Burglar Alarm TIP from the Westbury Civic Club:

For those who pay to support the Constable Precinct 5 Westbury Area Patrol (WAP), you can request that your alarm company call the WAP patrol dispatcher instead of calling HPD. Using this tip will usually result in much faster response time to your burglar alarm call for service. Why? WAP already has constable officers patrolling in our area. Also, HPD gives higher priority to emergency calls than to burglar alarms, so it can take a long time for HPD to respond to a low priority call. If a burglary has occurred, then WAP will file the crime report with HPD. Also, the Constables have a crime investigation team.



#### Westbury Area Improvement Corporation

The September Westbury Area Improvement Corporation (WAIC) meeting, which serves as the Westbury Super Neighborhood meeting was held September 26 at St. John's Presbyterian Church. Twenty three people, representing a broad base of the Westbury SN and surrounding area, were present.

HPD Sgt. Ortiz was on hand and described the need for an AFIS portable fingerprint scanners. These units, about the size of a cellphone, match fingerprints in the various databases so that officers can quickly identify people without IDs. The WAIC approved the purchase of 2 AFIS units (\$900.00 each) which will be donated to HPD. The Brays Oaks Management District recently matched funds for the purchase of these units for the Gessner station and this same match will be requested for the Southwest station.

Sgt. Derkowski from the Westbury Area Pct. 5 patrol said that he had a unit and, if needed in the meantime he could meet HPD officers in Westbury to use his machine. Sgt. Derkowski reported on the arrests made of the juvenile gang. He reminded everyone to call in ANY suspicious activity to their Pct. 5 dispatch.

Representatives from Tinsley Elementary, Anderson Elementary, and Westbury High School were on hand to give school updates. Westbury High School will be participating with the Houston Food Bank to host a mobile Food Pantry to Westbury twice a month to provide food to area residents. Students will help facilitate this program. On October 18th Westbury High School will host Parents University from 5 to 8 PM.

Barbara Hite from CM Castex Tatum's office reminded everyone to attend the Mayor's Town Hall meeting on the Propositions on the ballot. Meeting is October 17 at 6PM at the Fountain Life Center at 14083 South Main.













#### Willow Waterhole - At the Races!

The Willow Waterhole greenspace makes for a great location for a Cross County meet. There were 3 meets in September and one planned for October.

- ⇒ On Saturday, September 8, the "Bellaire High School Cross Country Invitation Meet" was held at Willow Waterhole.
- ⇒ On Saturday, September 22, was the "Westbury Invitational Cross Country Meet." This cross country competition featured student athletes from across the greater Houston area and was held at "Westbury Lake" (the stormwater detention lake closest to the Westbury Little League fields).
- ⇒ On Saturday, September 29, St. Thomas Episcopal High School hosted another Cross Country Invitational Meet at Willow Waterhole.



Parker Elementary students, Lylah and Lyza Sosa, won 1st and 2nd place in the Girls Elementary Division on September 22.

On October 20, the "Texas Charter Schools Academic League Cross Country Meet" will be held, with the start and finish line near the Schwartz Gazebo at 5300 Dryad, Houston 77035.

These high school athletic events held at Willow Waterhole bring thousands of visitors to Westbury and to Willow Waterhole. The site is popular for cross country events because of the variety of topographical features along a closed loop trail.

#### **Project Brays Update from 9/17 BBA Meeting**

As of September 10, 2% of the project to widen Brays Bayou between Fondren and South Post Oak has been completed. Construction is starting from Fondren and moving eastward to avoid interfering with contractor work to widen the channel between Buffalo Speedway and South Rice area. It is anticipated that work will start in mid-October to replace the Buffalo Speedway Bridge. The bridges at South Rice and Chimney Rock will also be replaced. The bridge at Hillcroft will be elevated by about 15 inches. By next year, all these projects will be in progress.

#### **City Trash Trucks Have New Technology**

The City of Houston has recently updated ALL city trash trucks, so that the trucks are now equipped with GPS tracking and video cameras. This means that the Solid Waste Department will now be able to better determine if truck routes have been missed and to verify what has happened when 311 service complaints are received. The city will also be able to determine whether trash was properly placed for collection at the curb by the appropriate day and time

#### No Plastic Bags in Recycling

As a reminder, please do not bag up your recyclable materials before putting them in the green recycle bin. The plastic bags disrupt the automated sorting machinery at the recycle center of the recyclable materials.

#### **City Fees for Repair/Replacement Cans**

These are the current 2018 city fees for repair or replacement of city household trash or recycle containers.

- ⇒ Replace damaged parts such as wheels, lids, and handles no charge by city.
- ⇒ Replace containers damaged by city collectors beyond use no charge by city. Container Replacement: Residents needing to replace containers more frequently than once every 10 years will have the following fees added to their monthly water bill. The fee reflected on the property owner's water bill must be paid in full before delivery of new trash container. Fee includes the container delivery fee and the cost to purchase the replacement container.
- ⇒ Container Delivery/Retrieval \$23.84, plus the Cost of Replacement Container which varies at the time of each purchase order.
- ⇒ Cleaning & Disposal of Content \$40.14 (\*Only applies to retrieval of unauthorized containers).

#### **Traffic Woes in Westbury**

Those of us who drive through the intersection of Chimney Rock and West Bellfort have been having a miserable experience for the past few months due to construction activities related to Project Brays by the Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD). At first, several lanes were blocked northbound on Chimney Rock, but this month the eastbound traffic on West Bellfort at Chimney Rock has been restricted to a single lane. Since traffic counts are higher for east/west traffic through Westbury, this squeezing of traffic on West Bellfort has caused traffic delays, especially in the mornings.

When will these travel woes end? During the September WCC Annual Meeting, Gary Zika from HCFCD says the end is nearing for the lane obstructions. At the time, he said HCFCD needed 10 working days of good weather to complete the connections underground and about a full month to get everything finished and cleaned up. We have had several rainy periods since the September Annual Meeting, but perhaps the HCFCD work at this intersection will be completed and traffic lanes restored by mid to late October. When finished, more water will flow toward the detention lakes along Willow Waterhole Bayou instead of flowing north along Chimney Rock to Brays Bayou.

### **Recycling Problems for Westbury United**

**Methodist** Westbury United Methodist Church (WUMC) is having major problems with the recycling bins (for paper and glass) located on their property due to continuing issues with debris and trash. These bins do NOT provide any income to the church; the bins are located on the WUMC property as a public service. Westbury UMC is **seeking volunteers** to help clean up these recycle areas on a regular basis, or else the recycle services may be discontinued. Are any volunteers interested in helping to keep these convenient bins in Westbury? If so, then please contact Mark Chatfield by private message on NextDoor.

As a reminder, if the recycle bins are full, return another day. Never leave materials outside of the bins. The truck drivers do NOT clean up any materials or any messes left outside the bins! If you leave your recycle stuff outside of the recycle bins, then you are illegally dumping on the property of WUMC.

#### Flood Bond Election Results, Aug. 2018

When the votes were counted, just 6.69% of Houston's voters went to the polls to vote on HCFCD's Prop A. We in Westbury are proud of the voter turnout here and in the precincts that we share with our neighboring communities. Pct. 281 that we share a corner of with Meyerland had the highest turnout with 27.13%. Next was Pct. 403 that we share a corner of with Maplewood South. Westbury's Precinct 14 was 18th in the city. Of the 1012 precincts in the city, about 18% saw voting percentages in double digits. The two precincts in the southern part of Westbury that we share with other neighborhoods to the west and south were slightly below the city average. But when you average them all together we had a turnout of 16%. And while the proposition passed with an 85% approval rating our precincts weighed in at 92%.
