Health and Wellness Workshop at the Platou Center



Why Support the WCC?

Westbury is a unique neighborhood. While all 5,000 homes in our Westbury neighborhood have active deed restrictions, only 463 have mandatory assessments. This means the Westbury Civic Club heavily relies on voluntary financial contributions from residents.

Westbury has historically had strong voluntary support because residents understood the great benefits of the WCC and our programs. The past several years' contributions to the Westbury Civic Club and to the Westbury Area Patrol have been down. By working together, we can meet the challenges head on and keep our neighborhood the jewel that it is. We all want a safe, flood free neighborhood with great schools and nice neighbors.

The total amount for the **2022 Voluntary Dues is \$365**. That is well worth a dollar a day! The Westbury Civic Club dues are \$60 for the year. The WCC suggests a contribution of \$305 for the Westbury Area Patrol (a paid contract with Precinct 5 Constables).

COMMUNITY MEETING

You asked and we listened. The Westbury Civic Club will be hosting a community meeting in November exclusively devoted to Flooding and Drainage issues. Our guest speakers will be the Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD), and we have asked them to bring in speakers working on flooding or drainage projects for the City of Houston that impact the Westbury area. This topic is of high importance in a city like Houston that is relatively flat and can experience high rates of rainfall.

Flood & Drainage Community Meeting Westbury Baptist Church, Game Room Thursday, November 10, 7 PM

HCFCD has been studying the Fondren Diversion Channel, located upstream of Westbury, to identify potential projects to reduce flood waters overflowing when that channel exceeds capacity. The city has several flood reduction or drainage projects in various stages of progress in the Westbury area and also upstream of Westbury.

Speakers from the city and HCFCD were guest speakers at a WCC board meeting earlier this year; this meeting has been scheduled because the studies are now farther along. After that meeting, feedback from the attendees was to allow more time for explanations and for Q&A, so we have scheduled this community meeting to be entirely devoted to the topic.



Deed Restriction FAQ

ALL sections of Westbury have active deed restrictions that are enforced. The deed restrictions can be enforced by any resident that lives in that section, by the Civic Club or by the City.

Can I convert my detached garage into living space?

No. No section in Westbury allows for garage apartments. The deed restrictions allow for ONE single family dwelling and a detached garage for either 2 or 3 cars depending on your section.

My neighbor has a garage apartment, why can't I?

First, some additions may appear to be apartments but aren't actually built that way nor do they function that way. Second, one property's violation of the rules does not give you the right to violate them. This is NOT a valid argument. There is no mechanism in the current deed restrictions to allow for any variances to the deed restrictions. The Westbury Civic Club does NOT approve any construction that has a separate living space.

Prelimin

My neighbor is converting their detached garage into living space. What do I do? Report to the WCC office immediately or directly to the City of Houston legal department at drcomplaints@houstontx.gov

By-Law Changes Approved

The following by-law changes were presented to the membership for a vote at the September Annual Meeting. All by-law changes were approved by a majority of the membership. Thank you to Westbury residents, Priscilla Bloomquist and Pat Metcalfe, for tallying the votes at the end of the evening. Pat and Priscilla are both election judges, so you might see them at the polls.

Summary of Changes—

→ Section 5: Add a requirement that candidates for Vice President shall have a minimum of 12 months experience on the board and candidates for President shall have a minimum of 24 months.

→ Section 6: Continue to keep 8 At Large Director Positions, but restructure to have 4 specific positions and 4 general At-Large. The intent is to provide more flexibility for the talents or interests of candidates who wish to serve in an At-Large position.

→ Eliminate provisions for Proxy Voting in Section 9.

State, and some County positions. Both the City of Houston and Harris County have announced that they will have bond propositions on the ballot. We encourage Westbury residents to express your opinions by voting! Westbury is well-known as an area that has high numbers of voters, so let's keep that tradition going. Voting shows that our residents are informed and engaged with issues.

Please note that voting boundaries in the Westbury area were modified earlier this year as a result of redistricting after the 2020 federal census.

VOTING FAQS

* **Identification**— Voters must bring approved forms of identification to vote. (For example: Texas driver's license, Texas personal ID, passport, military ID.) If you do not have an acceptable form of photo ID, then you can vote with a provisional ballot, BUT you must provide appropriate ID or other allowable supporting documents within 6 days after the election.

* What is prohibited? No wireless devices. No photographs. No electioneering within 100 feet of the doors (for example, you should not wear campaign materials inside the polling place)

* Where can you vote? At any designated polling location anywhere in Harris County, during early voting and during the general election. This means you can vote near your home, your work, or at any location convenient to you in Harris County.

* Deadline to Register to Vote? October 11

What is on the Ballot?

Federal — US Representative

State — Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Comptroller, General Land Office, Agriculture Commissioner, Railroad Commissioner, Judges for many state courts, State Representative, State Senator.

Harris County — County Judge (the executive of Commissioners Court), Judges for many county courts (such as Criminal, Civic, Probate), County school trustee, 3 County bond propositions (see below), County Commissioner (Westbury voters will vote in either Precinct 1 or Precinct 4)

City of Houston— 7 bond propositions (See below)

City of Houston Bond Propositions

There are 7 bond propositions on the ballot for a total of \$478 million. The City says that property taxes will NOT increase if the propositions are approved. Of this total, \$156 million is for deferred maintenance and \$60 million is for inflationary costs.

Proposition A— Public Safety (Police and Fire) \$277 million
Proposition B— Parks \$60 million
Proposition C— Animal Care- BARC \$47 million (new animal care building)
Proposition D— Public Health \$33 million
Proposition E— General Permanent Improvements \$29 million
Proposition F— Library \$26 million
Proposition G— Solid Waste \$6 million

"I thank members of the City Council for approving the November 8, 2022, bond election. I am asking voters to support it because it will allow us to meet critical needs within the City of Houston without raising property taxes. Specifically, the bond allocation will fully fund projects currently included in the 2023 – 2027 Capital Improvement Plan," said Mayor Sylvester Turner. "These are critical projects located in every council district throughout the city. The bond allocation will also allow us to fund other priority projects, such as public safety, representing 60 percent of the total request. Additional priorities include deferred maintenance, parks, libraries, solid waste, and BARC. The Nov. 2022 bond election is a pragmatic, forward-looking proposal that focuses on responsible investment for the long-term benefit of all Houstonians."

Harris County Bond Propositions

There are three Harris County bond propositions to vote on for a total of \$1.2 billion. Each of the 4 County precincts will receive a minimum of \$220 million, \$100 million will be reserved for public safety facilities regardless of location in the County, and \$220 million will be distributed based on need. The County estimates that for the owner of a \$300,000 home, taxes will cost an extra \$32/year over the 25 year bond period. (If the appraised value for a home increases, then taxes may increase due to the higher appraisal value)

Roads, Drainage, Transportation - \$900 million Parks- \$200 million Public Safety - \$100 million

Let's Talk Parking

We regularly get complaints from residents about parking issues in the neighborhood. What should you do? Call 311, then ParkHouston will schedule a parking inspector to review the situation and issue a ticket to the violator. (Please note that ParkHouston may survey the surrounding area and issue tickets for other parking violations that they happen to observe while they are in the general area.)

Our most common parking complaints are: vehicles blocking a public sidewalk, vehicles parked too close to an intersection or a driveway, vehicles parking in the front yard on an unimproved surface, and vehicles parking on city esplanades. Yard parking is prohibited in Westbury. It is against City Ordinance to park on the City esplanades (medians).

Here is a list of some of the parking code violations we see in Westbury. Call 311 to report these violations:

→ Parked on street more than 24 hours. Parking in the same space on the public street is limited to 24 hours.

→ Parked blocking a private driveway. A car parked curbside may not block any portion of a driveway.

→ Parked within 15 feet of fire hydrant.

→ Blocking or parking on sidewalk. Sidewalks must remain clear for pedestrian safety.

- → Parked within 20 feet of a crosswalk or intersection.
- → Violations of posted No Parking signs.
- → Vehicles parked on the street facing the wrong direction.

→ Commercial vehicle parked between 2am and 6am. Commercial vehicles cannot park on the public street from 2am-6am.

→ Large Vehicles can only park on residential streets while loading and unloading, or for 72 hours (if leased for moving).


→ A trailer/semi-trailer parked on public street over 2 hours. Trailers and semi-trailers are limited to two hours on the public street.

OTHER Parking Violations: Yard Parking and Esplanade Parking complaints are handled by the Houston Police Department, not by ParkHouston or 311. Contact the Southwest HPD station to report violations of Yard Parking and Esplanade Parking. Photos, license plate info, and vehicle descriptions are helpful information, as well as the specific street address / location of the problem.






