



Mayoral Debate & Candidate Forum

The Westbury SuperNeighborhood (Westbury Civic Club and the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation) were among a group of southwest Houston community organizations which helped organize a Mayoral Debate and Candidates Forum on October 15 at the Bethel's Place Empowerment Center on Sandpiper. Other host organizations included the Braeswood SuperNeighborhood, the Ft. Bend County - Houston SuperNeighborhood, and Southwest Houston 2000.

This event was outstanding. Most of the city non-mayoral candidates showed up and 6 of the 8 mayoral candidates participated in a fast-paced debate moderated by Carmen Watkins. Bethel's Place Empowerment Center provided a



wonderful meeting space with an excellent audio system, clear visibility for all, and welcoming greeters. The crowd was estimated to be about 150 - 200 people and one Westbury resident said it was the "Best. Mayoral. Debate. Ever."

Voter ID Will Be Required to Vote in Election

VOTER ID WILL BE REQUIRED TO VOTE IN THE 2013 ELECTION

- **1.** The new photo identification requirement is effective immediately.
- **2.** A voter will be required to show one of the following forms of photo identification at the polling location before the voter will be permitted to cast a vote.
- Texas driver license issued by the (DPS)
- Texas Election ID Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS
- U.S. military ID card with photograph
- U.S. citizenship certificate with photograph
- United States passport

3. My ID is expired. Will it still work?

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 60 days before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place.

4. A **permanent exemption** is available for voters with documented disabilities. Voters with a disability may apply with the county voter registrar for a permanent exemption. Affidavits are available for voters who have a consistent religious objection to being photographed and for voters who do not have any photo identification as a result of certain natural disasters as declared by the President of the United States or the Texas Governor within 45 days of the day the ballot was cast.

- **5.** Election officials will review the ID and if a name is "substantially similar" to the name on their list of registered voters, you will still be able to vote, but you will also have to submit an affidavit stating that you are the same person on the list of registered voters.
- **6**. If a voter does not present proper identification, the voter will still be permitted to vote provisionally. The voter will have (six) 6 days to present proper identification to the county voter registrar for the voter's ballot to be accepted.

WAIC Board Meeting

Pending Court Date for Foxxy's Caberet "Adult Entertainment" Club

On October 16, Laura Cahill, Assistant County Attorney in County Attorney Vince Ryan's office, spoke to the board of the non-profit Westbury Area Improvement Corporation (WAIC). The County Attorney's office has a nuisance abatement program to prevent or reduce recurring criminal activity. The state allows the county to go after nuisances under Texas Sec. 125.0015. COMMON NUISANCE. "A person who maintains a place to which persons habitually go for the following purposes and who knowingly tolerates the activity and furthermore fails to make reasonable attempts to abate the activity maintains a common nuisance". The state list of nuisances includes: gambling, prostitution, aggravated assaults, organized criminal activity, delivery/ possession/ use of controlled substances, among a long list of nuisance activities.

Ms. Cahill said that a civil court date for Foxxy's Caberet, 11112 S. Post Oak, is anticipated to be set soon, perhaps for early November 2013. Since litigation is pending, Ms. Cahill could not talk about the specifics of the Foxxy's case. She noted that the county litigation is separate from litigation by the city about Foxxy's not having a city license to operate a sexually oriented

business (SOB) within city limits. The city has joined the county suit. Foxxy's is too close (closer than 1500 ft) to a church and to the Varnett School to be able to have a license for a sexually oriented business in Houston.

On its Facebook site, Foxxy's describes itself as "adult entertainment". In February of 2013, the County Attorney's Office filed for and was granted a temporary injunction against Foxxy's due to prostitution and drug offenses. The temporary injunction required Foxxy's to take specific listed actions to reduce criminal activity at the property. For example, they had to remove the "champagne lounge", add surveillance cameras, hire four licensed security guards, check all bags for drugs or weapons, and do background checks on all employees.

It is anticipated that the WAIC and the WCC will not receive much advance notice about when the court case will be held. We have also been warned that the time and place are subject to change with little notice. Both the WAIC and the WCC hope to have representatives in the audience at the court case. Up-to-date information will be posted on the Facebook pages for the WCC (Westbury Houston) and the WAIC (Westbury37WAIC) as we learn more about the place and time for this court case.

WAIC Meeting Notes: October 16

As part of our ongoing effort to bring you more information about Westbury and our surrounding areas, we will feature a new monthly column with a synopsis of the monthly WAIC board meeting, which is also the official meeting of SuperNeighborhood #37. DeFunding of Local Magnet Program

HISD Announces Plans to DeFund Local Magnet Programs

We have just discovered that HISD plans to defund the magnet programs at several local schools, including the Fine Arts magnet program at Westbury High School. We are awaiting more data to formulate our response and to "rally the troops" to protect our community.

For many years, advocates from the Friends of Westbury High School, the Westbury Civic Club, and the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation have pushed to create a Fine Arts / Music Magnet program at WHS because feeder schools in the Westbury area (Parker Elementary and Johnston Middle School) have renowned Music or Fine Arts magnet programs. We consider this to be important to keep ZONED students enrolled at WHS rather than transferring to other schools.

Unfortunately, HISD is only considering how successful magnet programs are at attracting transfer students to a campus. The Fine Arts magnet program at WHS is a young program, but the students and teachers are enthusiastic and have already achieved awards.

As WHS Principal Tim Wainright notes, "the district is only considering non-zone transfers to affected schools... This poses a problem for Westbury HS because while we may only attract 125 non zone students to Westbury via our Magnet Program, many of Westbury's zoned students are in the Magnet Program... our Magnet Programs are a significant factor in keeping zoned students at our campuses".

WCC Director of Community Relations, Cindy Chapman said, "Personally, I am very disappointed that our community strongly supported the recent HISD bond referendum and now HISD threatens to defund a magnet program which our community has worked very hard to implement at WHS. The Music Magnet program at WHS ties into the Music and Fine Arts magnet programs at area feeder schools. It is important to this community that WHS has a strong music program.

HISD states that it is closing the magnet programs at 20 schools. "HISD is phasing out less popular magnet programs, the district is also adding new magnet programs designed to meet current demand. Last month, HISD won a \$12 million federal grant for six magnets that emphasize science, technology, engineering, and math instruction. Magnet programs that are being eliminated after the current school year are located at the following schools: Burbank, Elrod, Law, Pleasantville, Wesley, and West University elementary schools; Attucks, Deady, Dowling, Holland, Jackson, Key, and Patrick Henry middle schools; and Jones, Lee, Madison, Sharpstown, Westbury, Wheatley and Worthing high schools."

Westbury High School Fine Arts Department Mission Statement:

The Westbury High School Fine Arts Magnet program serves committed, highly motivated students interested in Dance, Choral and Instrumental Music, Visual Arts, Speech and Debate. The program assists students in the development of performance skills and techniques while nurturing individuality and creativity.

Westbury Community Garden Outreach

Composting Taught at the Garden



Girl Scouts from the troop at Windsor Village United Methodist worked on the "lasagna bed" on Sat., October 12. They built the

sheet composting bed from a cardboard base and added brown matter (leaves), a layer of newspaper, green matter (fresh grass clippings), and then continued in this manner. We also added coffee grounds from Starbucks and produce trimmings from Randalls and chopped up cantaloupe and peelings from a private home and banana peels from their snack. The term "lasagna bed" fits perfectly.

Children from **Post Oak Montessori** visited the garden on Saturday, October 5. The children, with their parents, came out to learn. They planted garden 4A for Hazel Potvin, one of the WCG members. Potvin prepared the soil in advance. The children planted cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli plants, and the onion bulbs. Then they planted radish, carrots, beet, parsnip, and kohlrabi seeds. The children learned about growing their own vegetables and their parents learned about our wonderful garden.

The Westbury Community Garden uses fruit, vegetable, and habitat gardens to bring the entire community together and improve the health, nutrition and quality of life for Westbury residents. The garden serves to educate adults and children about good nutrition and ecology, strengthens community spirit, provides organic food and serves as a gathering place for community events. Our slogan is "Growing Community through Gardening." The WCG outreach programs serve all of Westbury and also impact many others, as described below:

- * Tours and Classes: Hundreds, if not thousands of people have been educated at the WCG over these past 3 years, ranging in age and skill from school groups to adult classes. Visitors can learn how to compost, collect rainwater, and start their own gardens at home.
- * Foerster Elementary In September of 2013, WCG gardener volunteers worked to clear weedy vegetable beds at nearby

Foerster. The WCG also provided sweet potato plants to grow in the school beds.

- * Westbury High School a Special Needs teacher from WHS brings his autistic students to the WCG site to stay in touch with nature and food. The WCG is also advising the teacher about bringing gardening to WHS.
- * **Urban Harvest** teaches classes at the WCG at the *June Holly Leadership Houston pavilion*.
- * Plant it Forward Farms a farm -to-market program which trains refugees as organic farmers, will be sponsoring two graduates of its program onto large plots
- * Trees for Houston The WCC and WCG are working with "Trees for Houston" to start our very own tree farm at the WCG so that we grow trees for Westbury parks, esplanades, and even for homeowners.
- * Future Farmer's Stand Last but not least, a dream is to have a Farmer's Stand

Willow Waterhole Volunteers collected trash and cleared tree limbs and debris.





MsBeehaven Quilting Bee


