# Anderson Elementary Participates in "Read Across the Globe"

Isn't it fun to read a book with a child? Did you know that there is a Guinness World Record for the "most children reading with an adult in 24 hours"? On October 19, Anderson Elementary, other schools in Houston, and schools around the world participated in an initiative to impact literacy while also attempting to break that Guinness world record. The book read to children here in Houston was "Farmer Will Allen and the Growing Table", a true book about a former basketball player who operates an urban farm and trains people on how to grow their own fresh food.

At Anderson Elementary, more than 40 volunteers showed up to be either classroom readers or official witnesses. Volunteers included parents and relatives, community volunteers, members of Westbury United Methodist Church, members of the Fountain of Praise Church, and HISD Trustee Wanda Adams.



### **WAIC Updates**

The Westbury Area Improvement Corporation (WAIC) board met on October 21. This meeting is open to the public and includes Westbury residents, business owners, and reps from local organizations, METRO government, and schools. This meeting also serves as the meeting for the Westbury Super Neighborhood.

SCHOOLS: Anderson Elementary had been projected to have 690 students but actually has 761. Enrollment may increase since it is a regional hub and will accept students from schools that have hit maximum enrollment. Both Kindergarten and First Grade are Dual Language. Next year, Pre-K will be added to Dual Language. Parker Elementary has 832 students, and First and Third grades are capped at maximum enrollment. They are working on plans for a new SPARK Park, in conjunction with the new school building, including a great entry plaza for the school. Westbury High School has 2,121 students. The school is in an attendance contest with several other high schools. Principal Monaghan is working to change the school culture and emphasizes talking to students and building relationships with students.

METRO: Concerns about bus stop maintenance on W. Bellfort at Burdine were discussed with the METRO rep. The bench has been repaired and efforts to improve mowing are on-going. A bus shelter has been requested for that location.

**Commercial Update:** Much discussion about strengthening ties between WAIC, WCC and area businesses.

### **WAIC Projects:**

**Neighborhood Trails** - signs paid for by the WAIC have been posted. A coalition representing several communities is working together to advocate for trails.

Westbury Community Garden – \$5,000 approved by the Brays Oaks Management District board for driveway repairs.

Westbury Park – the city has finished replacing the tennis backdrop and the new fence along Stillbrooke. A plaque to acknowledge donors to the playground project has been again delayed and the Houston Parks Board may switch to another contractor.



## WHS and Bond updates

### **HISD Bond Project Updates**

**Parker Elementary:** Although construction has not yet started, the project team still hopes to have the new building completed and open for the 2017-2018 school year.

**Westbury High School:** City permits have been issued and contractor approved to build a new baseball and softball field on Gasmer, with field completion anticipated in February 2016. Work should begin soon with fencing and trailers arriving in several weeks.

Amenities such as lighting and restrooms will be completed in the summer. The team is working with the city regarding detention requirements for the new tennis courts with construction beginning in Summer of 2016.

Design work for the new building wing continues. A traffic consultant will be used to examine the parking areas and drop-off zones. The baseball fields are Phase 1 as the new building will sit on the existing baseball field.

### Student Success Center at WHS

Westbury High School recently rebranded its Truancy Office, now called The Student Success Center. The name change was made to better reflect the office's overall mission of helping students graduate by providing a more positive and encouraging emphasis. This re-branding effort is particularly timely because the Texas Legislature passed groundbreaking legislation, HB 2398, that will end the criminalization of truancy, protecting hundreds of thousands of Texas children from receiving hefty fines and criminal convictions for being absent from school.

The name change coincided with new initiatives that are relevant to all students on campus. The first initiative of The Student Success Center was a school-wide awareness campaign called "Relationships Matter: Every Student Needs a Champion", which spotlighted teachers on the campus who have made positive and powerful connections with students and who have created classroom environments that motivate them to thrive.

Each month, "Relationships Matter: Every Student Needs a Champion" will plan, produce and market student-led, school-wide awareness campaigns that include Great Things That Are Happening Behind the Doors of Westbury, Anti-Bullying, Culture Awareness, Parental Involvement, and First Generation College Readiness. Each campaign is designed to attract, inform and motivate everyone from students to teachers to the community.

# Election Information & Mayoral Debate Recap



The Westbury Super Neighborhood, Southwest Houston 2000, and the nearby Super Neighborhoods of Braeswood, Brays Oaks, Fondren, Hiram Clarke, and Fort Bend Houston jointly hosted a non-partisan Candidate Forum and Mayoral Debate on September 29, 2015, called "Moving Forward Together". The event was held at Riceville Mt. Olive Baptist Church and was also live-streamed. We are very pleased to announce that this event was well-attended by the public with about 400 persons in the audience.

The Westbury community has a tradition of being involved in civic activities and having a high rate of voting. Cindy Peden Chapman, Co-President of the Westbury Super Neighborhood, said that "we want our residents to have a chance to learn more about the candidates, but it is equally important that the candidates learn about our issues and our concerns. Another point that I hope these candidates notice is that the communities in southwest Houston are working together on many projects. We are expanding our focus beyond our own boundaries because we have many issues in common. We know that we are stronger when we work together."

One unusual aspect of the "Moving Forward Together" event was the emphasis that was placed upon participation by youth. The Westbury High School Choir provided the musical prelude. The Presentation of Colors was jointly provided by the 4 ROTC units from Westbury High, Sharpstown High, Madison High, and Willowridge High. The Westbury High and Willowridge High debate teams helped sort the questions from the audience for the event moderator. The high school students stayed for the entire event and were able to talk to candidates before and after the event.

Among the Westbury residents spotted in the audience were WCC Board Members: Becky Edmondson, Eugene Sirls, Marcia Hartman, Cindy Chapman, David Cummins, Larry Ellis, Robert Montgomery, Virginia and Taylor Livingston. # Westbury Civic Club News

As part of the service provided by your Civic Club and the Super Neighborhood, we monitor the monthly 311 service calls submitted for the Westbury area. The Department of Neighborhoods, in addition to touring Westbury each month, also provides a monthly report



of 311 calls. This report helps us monitor trends in missing trash pickups, broken water mains, nuisance properties and other items.

Please call 311 or use the handy 311 app for all your City of Houston guestions and concerns. If you would like the WCC to monitor a situation after you have reported it to 311, please send an email to westburycc@sbcglobal.net with the Service Request (SR) number you have received. Provide a brief description of the problem.

For the 30 day period from September 19 to October 20, there were 344 service requests submitted to 311 from Westbury. The top calls made to Neighborhood Services were to report: Nuisances on properties, heavy trash violations, and parking violations. Calls to the Parks Dept.

were for tree removal and stump grinding primarily. Sewer wastewater issues. water leaks and street hazards topped the calls for Public Works. Solid Waste reports generated the highest number of calls. Top issues were missed trash pickup which totaled 121 calls. Sadly, there were 20 calls for dead animals.

### WCC Proposed 2015 Budget

The Westbury Civic Club (WCC) Budget Committee is working on the 2016 budget. The budget will be published in the Crier newsletter once it is approved at the upcoming November 2015 board meeting. This year's proposed budget will be similar to last year's budget.

The WCC operates on a calendar year budget. We estimate our income for the coming year (based on prior history), and then we budget proposed expenditures based on the predicted income.

Our biggest expense is the Westbury Area Patrol (WAP) security control contract with the Precinct 5 constable office. The WAP Patrol cost will remain the same as 2015 at \$316,925 for 4 patrol officers. For the past two years, we have been required to have a minimum of 4 patrol officers in our contract with Precinct 5. Although our patrol income had been sufficient in the past to pay for 3 officers, for the past 2 years we have NOT received enough funds to pay for 4 officers. The WCC board considers this to be a very concerning and serious situation, and the board is considering ways to increase income in 2016 for the security patrol. Our goal is raise sufficient patrol funds each year to pay for the patrol costs for that year. On page 1, you will see a request for residents to contribute additional funds toward the 2015 patrol costs.

The Greenspace Committee is evaluating its service contract with our landscape company. At this time, the proposed 2016 budget for our Greenspaces is \$42,600, but this may change as more information is obtained. The remaining proposed General Expense budget for the Westbury Civic Club is anticipated to be \$142,500. The General Expense category includes all the items that go into operating the Civic Club: printing and distribution of the Crier, operating an office and staffing it, insurance, professional fees (financial reviews, legal expenses), doing projects and programs, and deed restriction enforcement. Advertising in the monthly newsletter offsets the printing costs.

# Keep the Street Storm Drains Clean and Clear

### **Storm Water Drain Lines Vital to Prevent Flooding**



### Do Not Blow Your Leaves into the Storm Drains!

As you know, Houston has street flooding. Streets in Houston are designed to be channels for the raising water to gather into and then allow the water to flow into the storm drains. The rain water drains away and eventually ends up in Galveston Bay. Houston homes are set on higher ground, ideally, to keep them from flooding.

If you, or your hired lawn crew, blow leaves and debris into the storm drains, then the drain lines will be obstructed, resulting in slow draining and potential flooding. If your home has a storm drain in the street, make sure to regularly clean the top of debris. Often in heavy rains, the storm drains clog with sticks and newspapers, etc.

Leaves, grass and other debris can clog storm water drain lines and impede street drainage.

KHB provided tools and a roll off dumpster, ordered the plants, obtained a landscape architect to create a landscape design plan for the Dryad entrance, and also provided general support and expertise. Trees for Houston donated 8 beautiful large oaks and a crape myrtle. Scotts Miracle Gro, a long-time Westbury partner that helped the Westbury community garden get built, provided garden soil and mulch and two hard-working staff!

Board members of the Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy supervised several large workday projects. Ralph Rieger and Ray Runge led a project to repair trails. Bill Burhans and Howard Sacks oversaw beautification projects. Becky Edmondson led the team which

Some volunteers were from Westbury, such as WCC board members Marcia Hartman, Cindy Chapman, Jeff Benavides, David Cummins and Kate Wilson. Some were nearby residents. Some volunteers came from as far away as San Antonio. Commissioners from KHB helped out, as well as a contingent of Bud Light employees.

The Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy, along with the Westbury Super Neighborhood, were thrilled with this investment by Silver Eagle Distributors and Bud Light for making this corner of our world more beautiful and appealing.



Did you know that Westbury 2, Westbury 3, and Westbury 5 have a 25 foot rear setback for the main structure? Did you know that there is a minimum percentage of brick that must be on your home? Did you know that you can't build in front of your building line? We want to help you! We want you to find out about possible violations before it costs you money and time. Several homeowners in the past couple years have had to tear down and/ or modify their construction due to deed restriction violations.

The City of Houston does not review deed restrictions when issuing permits. They require a signed affidavit acknowledging that the plans comply with your deed restrictions. This holds YOU, the homeowner, accountable for knowing and complying with your deed restrictions. We are here to help you. All deed restrictions are available online at westburycrier.com.
