# COMMUNITY MEETING Flooding & Drainage Harris County Flood Control November 10, 7PM

Westbury Baptist Church, Game Room

You asked and we listened. The Westbury Civic Club is hosting a community meeting on November 10 that will be exclusively devoted to Flooding and Drainage. Our main guest speaker will be Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD). We asked HCFCD bring in speakers working on flooding and drainage projects for the City of Houston that impact the Westbury area. This topic is of high importance for Westbury.

HCFCD has been studying the Fondren Diversion Channel, located upstream of Westbury, to identify potential projects to reduce flood waters overflowing when that channel exceeds capacity. The City has several flood reduction or drainage projects in various stages of progress in the Westbury area and also upstream of Westbury.

HCFCD and the City attended a WCC meeting earlier this year and now the studies are now farther along. Feedback from the previous meeting was to allow more time for explanations and for Q&A, so we have scheduled this community meeting to be entirely devoted to the topic. We hope to see you at this very important community meeting to learn more about flooding and drainage issues in Westbury.

Thank you to all who participated in the many Westbury Civic Club activities this past month: the Neighborhood Night Out event, Deed Restriction revision community meetings, Working on Westbury volunteer workday, October board meeting, and Halloween Yard of the Month. Many of you have already purchased your White Elephant Sale space for the upcoming Westbury giant community garage sale on November 5. In addition to the White Elephant garage sale, the WCC will be hosting a volunteer workday (Working on Westbury) at Westbury Park on Saturday, November 12. In December, the Yard of the Month program will be looking at holiday decorations (see pg. 17).

Flooding is a problem that can affect any place in Houston or Harris County. Anywhere it can rain, it can flood. I encourage you to attend a community meeting on November 10 where Flooding and Drainage will be the sole topic. Both the Harris County Flood Control District and the City of Houston have been invited to discuss projects that these entities are evaluating to reduce risk of Flooding in southwest Houston and in Westbury. Did you know that we pay approximately \$22,000 every month for the security patrol services by the Precinct 5 Constables? The security patrol contract with Precinct 5 Constables is the biggest expense every month/year. Public Safety has to remain a top priority. Please help us continue these vital services provided by the Constables, so that Westbury continues to be a desirable and safe community. The financial challenges of the WCC are very real, and we cannot continue to spend our savings accumulated over many years to pay our bills. For the many of you who have voluntary dues, it is much better to send at least some contribution rather than paying nothing at all.



Trash, yard waste, recycling, and heavy trash are picked up by the City of Houston.

#### **Regular Household Trash**

Pick-up is EVERY Thursday. Regular household trash goes into the black trash can.

#### **Yard Waste**

Pick-up is EVERY week either on Thursday or Saturday or any day the City decides to come by. Yard Waste MUST be placed in the correct City bio-degradable bags.



#### Recycling in Westbury

All of Westbury recycles on Schedule A. Recycling is every other week. Recycling goes into the green trash can.

#### Why Support the WCC?

Westbury is a unique neighborhood. While all 5,000 homes in our Westbury neighborhood have active deed restrictions, only 463 have mandatory assessments. This means the Westbury Civic Club heavily relies on voluntary financial contributions from residents.

Westbury has historically had strong voluntary support because residents understood the great benefits of the WCC and our programs. The past several years' contributions to the Westbury Civic Club and to the Westbury Area Patrol have been down. By working together, we can meet the challenges head on and keep our neighborhood the jewel that it is. We all want a safe, flood free neighborhood with great schools and nice neighbors.

The total amount for the **2022 Voluntary Dues is \$365**. That is well worth a dollar a day! The Westbury Civic Club dues are \$60 for the year. The WCC suggests a contribution of \$305 for the Westbury Area Patrol (a paid contract with Precinct 5 Constables).














# National Night Out 2022

#### Calling Westbury Golfers

Westbury High School is hosting its 1st golf tournament on November 21. Proceeds will be for the benefit of the Senior Class of 2023 and the WHS Athletic department. WHS Alumni and former NFL player Charles Sims will be a part of this tournament.

Sims attended Westbury High School, class of 2008, where he played football and ran track. He was named District 21-4A MVP and first-team All-District as a junior. He attended the University of Houston and the University of West Virginia, and was drafted in the 2014 NFL draft after graduation as one of the top running back prospects. He played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 2014 through 2017 before a knee injury ended his playing career. Sims is back in Houston and looking for ways to give back to his community. State, and some County positions. Both the City of Houston and Harris County have announced that they will have bond propositions on the ballot. We encourage Westbury residents to express your opinions by voting! Westbury is well-known as an area that has high numbers of voters, so let's keep that tradition going. Voting shows that our residents are informed and engaged with issues.

Please note that voting boundaries in the Westbury area were modified earlier this year as a result of redistricting after the 2020 federal census.

#### VOTING FAQS

- \* Identification Voters must bring approved forms of identification to vote. (For example: Texas driver's license, Texas personal ID, passport, military ID.) If you do not have an acceptable form of photo ID, then you can vote with a provisional ballot, BUT you must provide appropriate ID or other allowable supporting documents within 6 days after the election.
- \* What is prohibited? No wireless devices. No photographs. No electioneering within 100 feet of the doors (for example, you should not wear campaign materials inside the polling place)
- \* Where can you vote? At any designated polling location anywhere in Harris County, during early voting and during the general election. This means you can vote near your home, your work, or at any location convenient to you in Harris County.
- \* Deadline to Register to Vote? October 11

#### What is on the Ballot?

Federal — US Representative

**State** — Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Comptroller, General Land Office, Agriculture Commissioner, Railroad Commissioner, Judges for many state courts, State Representative, State Senator.

Harris County — County Judge (the executive of Commissioners Court), Judges for many county courts (such as Criminal, Civic, Probate), County school trustee, 3 County bond propositions (see below), County Commissioner (Westbury voters will vote in either Precinct 1 or Precinct 4)

City of Houston— 7 bond propositions (See below)

#### **City of Houston Bond Propositions**

There are 7 bond propositions on the ballot for a total of \$478 million. The City says that property taxes will NOT increase if the propositions are approved. Of this total, \$156 million is for deferred maintenance and \$60 million is for inflationary costs.

Proposition A— Public Safety (Police and Fire) \$277 million

Proposition B— Parks \$60 million

Proposition C— Animal Care- BARC \$47 million (new animal care building)

Proposition D— Public Health \$33 million

Proposition E— General Permanent Improvements \$29 million

Proposition F— Library \$26 million Proposition G— Solid Waste \$6 million

"I thank members of the City Council for approving the November 8, 2022, bond election. I am asking voters to support it because it will allow us to meet critical needs within the City of Houston without raising property taxes. Specifically, the bond allocation will fully fund projects currently included in the 2023 – 2027 Capital Improvement Plan," said Mayor Sylvester Turner. "These are critical projects located in every council district throughout the city. The bond allocation will also allow us to fund other priority projects, such as public safety, representing 60 percent of the total request. Additional priorities include deferred maintenance, parks, libraries, solid waste, and BARC. The Nov. 2022 bond election is a pragmatic, forward-looking proposal that focuses on responsible investment for the long-term benefit of all Houstonians."

#### **Harris County Bond Propositions**

There are three Harris County bond propositions to vote on for a total of \$1.2 billion. Each of the 4 County precincts will receive a minimum of \$220 million, \$100 million will be reserved for public safety facilities regardless of location in the County, and \$220 million will be distributed based on need. The County estimates that for the owner of a \$300,000 home, taxes will cost an extra \$32/year over the 25 year bond period. (If the appraised value for a home increases, then taxes may increase due to the higher appraisal value)

Roads, Drainage, Transportation - \$900 million

Parks- \$200 million

Public Safety - \$100 million

# Support the Westbury Constables

Public Safety is always a hot topic. We are thankful that Westbury is patrolled by Harris County Precinct 5 Constables. They patrol all of Westbury because the Westbury Civic Club (WCC) has a contract with Harris County Precinct 5. Nearby neighborhoods (Maplewood SN, Meyerland, Barkley Square) also have contracts with Precinct 5, which gives our corner of Southwest Houston great coverage and quick response time.

This is the largest and most important expense of the WCC. We need to collect another \$130,000 by the end of the year. In today's world with crime increasing, it is extremely important to maintain this vital service. The quick response time of the Constables, the intimate knowledge of our neighborhood and residents, and their special units and programs make this an invaluable asset to our neighborhood and community. At the October WCC board meeting, Sgt. Derkowski reported that their average response time is right under 5 minutes, for ALL calls.

Westbury contracts for two deputies and one sergeant to patrol our neighborhood. Sgt. Derkowski attends the monthly WCC board meetings and makes a report about crimes and crime trends in Westbury. He emails the WCC office about crimes and incidents in Westbury and provides updates to major issues. Sgt. Derkowski has been patrolling Westbury for almost 5 years and has a wealth of knowledge. This is hands on policing at its best. He knows where the hot spots are, and if there spikes in crime, then he works with Pct 5 to bring extra resources to our neighborhood.

Westbury relies on voluntary support of residents like you to pay for this much needed service. The requested amount per home is \$300 for the Constable program. If you have not paid yet for 2022, please consider paying today. If you have already

### Multiple Shootings on Hillcroft

The Friendly Mart convenience store at 12511 Hillcroft has been the scene of multiple drive by shootings in the last 60 days. On August 23, at 9:55PM, a 49 year-old man was shot and killed. According to the investigation, a crowd of people were in the parking lot when a white Nissan Altima approached and fired multiple shots. Gang activity is suspected. Due to the new convenience store ordinance passed as part of the City's One Safe Houston program, cameras were required to be placed outside of the store. Surveillance photos of the person and vehicle of interest were obtained from the security cameras.

On October 12, at 1 AM, a group of people were loitering in the convenience store parking lot when a vehicle drove by and opened fire. Three men were shot.

Back in July of 2022, another man with a lengthy criminal history was shot and killed by another man out on bond in this same parking lot.


The WCC and WAIC are working closely with law enforcement, our City Council office, and the Mayor to get this very troubling situation under control. HPD met with the owner of the store and he agreed to close his store at midnight rather than have it continue to be a 24-hour store. The U-Haul rental business at the site has promised to modify its fencing so the vehicles can be moved away from the corner and inside the fenced area. The area is now under close watch by both HPD and the Pct 5 Constables, but we want to warn residents to travel through this area carefully.

This property has been a long-standing nuisance to nearby Westbury homes.

#### Deed Restriction Revisions

The WCC held several community meetings in September and October for residents of Westbury 4, Westbury 5, and Parkwest 3 to discuss deed restrictions and the need for a revision. There is a serious need to revise the Deed Restrictions for Westbury 4 and Parkwest 3 due to issues associated with homes being rebuilt by the Texas General Land Office (GLO) after flooding in 2017 during Hurricane Harvey. Some residents in Westbury 5 have also expressed an interest in revising their Deed Restrictions. The WCC held 2 meetings for Westbury 4 and Parkwest 3 residents and then 2 additional meetings solely for Westbury 5 residents.

We appreciate so many Westbury homeowners taking time out of their busy schedules to attend these important meetings about deed restriction revision. It is incredibly important to get resident feedback. In a City like Houston, which has no zoning rules, Deed Restrictions are one of the few tools available to protect home values and to restrict home sites from being used as a commercial business. If you have every wondered why the church site at the corner of Hillcroft and West Bellfort has not been turned into a pharmacy or convenience store or other commercial use, the answer is that the site is protected by deed restrictions which do not allow certain uses. Every home in Westbury has active Deed Restrictions.

The WCC plans to continue to reach out to residents of Westbury 4, Westbury 5, and Parkwest 3. The meetings are a starting point to explain what deed restrictions, why deed restrictions are important, and to answer questions. Improving the wording in the deed restrictions will help protect and defend property values. Adding definitions and clarification will help insure that your deed restrictions mean what you, the owners want, not what some current legal definition is by the City or State. Committees for each section are being formed by residents that selected to be on the committee. This process is open to any homeowner that lives in that particular section. Each committee will now meet at the WCC office and start a survey that will go out to all residents of that section.

#### Exciting Westbury Library Update Address Changed to Chimney Rock


The WCC is very pleased to announce that the City of Houston has listened to local concerns and is changing the official library address from Belrose to Chimney Rock. The Westbury Civic Club, the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation, and local residents have all reached out to the City regarding the new address for the Dr. Shannon Walker Library that is being built in Westbury.

The new library building is being built on the site of a former post office which had an official address on Belrose. Belrose is a Westbury residential street and its location is not well-known since it does not directly connect to any major thoroughfare. There was concern about traffic cutting through Westbury residential streets to reach the future library. It was pointed out to the City that the future library site has a direct driveway off Chimney Rock, and Chimney Rock is a well-known major thoroughfare.

The main recommendation to come out of the Westbury Library Action Committee was to have the address changed to Chimney Rock. The committee felt the address change was very important to help maintain the residential character of the surrounding neighborhood on Atwell and Belrose. Mapping apps would have directed people to the Belrose entrance through our quiet residential streets but with a Chimney Rock address, most people would be directed to take the Chimney Rock entrance down major streets not our residential streets.

After consideration, the City has agreed to change the official address of the new library from Belrose to Chimney Rock. The front door will continue to face Belrose and the visitor parking lot will continue to be on that side of the building with access from Chimney Rock. The only change is the official address.

It is very satisfying when a government agency listens to public comment to improve a project. We thank District K CM Martha Castex-Tatum, the Library project team, and the Houston Public Library Director Rhea Lawson for listening and taking action to improve the address of the library so that it can be more easily found and to reduce traffic through Westbury residential streets.

#### **Martha's President Advisory Council**

District K Councilmember Martha Castex-Tatum hosted her inaugural Martha's President Advisory Council (MPAC) on the morning of Saturday, October 15. Attending were Presidents of Civic Clubs, HOAs, POAs, and other civic organizations located in District K, including Cindy Chapman of the Westbury Civic Club and Becky Edmondson of the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation.

The featured guest speaker was Mayor Sylvester Turner. Executive Assistant Police Chief Larry Satterwhite discussed crime statistics for District K. Alyce Coffey answered questions about Solid Waste issues.

Mayor Turner said that Public Safety is the number 1 priority and he reviews crime statistics every morning. CM Martha Castex-Tatum noted that District K has one of the best safety records in Houston, behind only the Kingwood and Memorial areas. Assistant Chief Satterwhite reviewed the initiatives which were implemented as part of the One Safe Houston initiative to reduce crime. Crime was higher in January and February. Programs implemented include: overtime for 125 HPD officers/day, mental health crisis team, ordinance implemented to make it harder to resell stolen catalytic converters in the city, ordinance to require security cameras outside certain businesses, more urban park rangers, more funds to reduce domestic violence, etc.



#### Trash-What is Wrong with this Picture?

During a recent walk on trash day, some bins clearly contained items that were not acceptable for recycle collection. These problems were readily observable by anyone passing by along the street. The green bins are intended ONLY for items that are accepted by the City of Houston for recycling, not what you think the City should accept or



what you hope the City might accept. If you are not sure, then visit the website for the City of Houston Solid Waste Dept or consult the "Waste Wizard" on the official City of Houston phone app called "HTX Collects".

What is wrong with the photos shown here that were taken of local Westbury recycling bins? Plastic bags. Never put your recycle materials inside a plastic bag before you place it in the recycle bin. Plastic bags, or anything that is inside a plastic bag, will not be recycled. Placing recyclable materials inside a plastic bag means that the sorting equipment at the recycle center won't be able to separate the items. Plastic bags, especially those that are empty or



loosely filled, can also end up getting tangled in the sorting machinery, which can place workers at risk. Plastic bags are FORBIDDEN in recycle bins. NO Plastic bags of any kind— No trash bags and no grocery plastic bags.



# New Donations Raise Total to 10 Million Dollars

The Willow Waterhole Greenspace Conservancy received a \$500,000 grant from Wortham Foundation in August and the Fondren Foundation awarded the Conservancy a \$350,000 grant in September. As part of a \$12 million capital campaign to improve the 291-acre greenway, the Conservancy has now raised \$10 million from public and private funders.

The capital campaign will fund construction of eight miles of trails around the six Willow Waterhole lakes, additional parking, construction of a fishing pier, purchasing additional acreage, and developing a 15-acre native coastal prairie preserve where endangered plants have been identified. Neighborhood connections will also be added to the Greenway hike and bike system via easements.

"We are incredibly grateful to Wortham Foundation and Fondren Foundation trustees for these monumental gifts. The Greenway is a refuge for all Houstonians and their support will help transform the greenspace," said Bill Burhans, the Conservancy's president.

It is exciting to envision the improvements that these major donations will implement over at Willow Waterhole. As residents of Westbury, we are fortunate that this is located so close to us and available to enjoy just a few minutes away. We congratulate the board of the WWGC for their ongoing efforts to transform it into an amazing place.
