WHS Art Club Paints Mural for Westbury Community Garden

Two storage sheds at the Westbury Community Garden, serviceable yet unattractive, have been transformed into a large, colorful mural. Students Frank Rojas, Aide Ajostadero, Maurilio Perez, and Imari Johnson from the Art Club at Westbury High School devoted hours painting the vibrant mural on Saturday. November 16. Art teacher Shelby **Lenderman** supervised the work and helped with the painting. A talented member of the community garden, Sara Lyons, helped paint the mural and crafted the lettering which says "Westbury Community Garden" in a bold, purple script. Ross and Dawn Asher, members of the garden, cleaned and primed the surfaces several days before the mural was started.

The Art Club at WHS had been inactive for several years, but resumed this school year. They meet during lunch several times each week. Art teacher Shelby



Lenderman asked Art Club members to submit designs for consideration for the mural, which were then consolidated into the final mural design. Other projects which the Art Club has participated in this year include:

creating banners for homecoming and face-painting for the school fall festival. Club members will also do face-painting for upcoming school events.

The WHS Visual Art program has three teachers and about 200 students. If you would like to see examples of award-winning designs from the WHS Visual Art department, then visit website http://



Negotiations have progressed favorably for us to purchase the 7-acre site of the Westbury Community Garden, but we have to raise the money to buy the land. This land has been leased for public use for more than 30 years. What future do you prefer for these seven acres – build apartments on it next to an existing huge apartment complex with hundreds of vacancies **OR** rescue this flourishing land to keep it public and green forever? We think the choice is clear, and we are working to raise the money to buy the land from the Houston Housing Authority. We know that folks in Westbury and in Houston care deeply about our youth and our public lands. We ask for your help. Families, scouts, schoolchildren, and people from across Houston come to the Westbury Community Garden land to learn about growing healthy veggies and orchard plants, see bees and butterflies, and learn how to build raised garden beds and compost bins. Our future vision is to expand the garden, create a tree farm to grow trees for planting here in Westbury, and hopefully have a farm stand where people can buy fresh food from our organic gardeners.

We would like to raise at least \$50,000 by the end of this year. Our goal is to raise \$500,000 in total.



VOTE—Election Run-off for Two At-Large Council Seats

The City run-off election is December 14th. Polling locations will be announced.

Westbury residents can be proud that we had some of the highest voter participation in the city. According to a recent study, Texas ranks last or close to last in civic participation, but that's not true for Westbury! An amazing 87% of Harris county residents did not vote. Of the 1076 precincts, only 45 had turnout above 30% and another 146 precincts had turnout in the 20 to 29% range.

The highest voter turnout percentage was

39.11% and that was in precinct #403, which Westbury voters share with Maplewood South. Westbury residents voted in numbers far greater than the 13.21% countywide vote, as can be seen in the chart below.

What this means to Westbury residents is that our votes do count. The Westbury community is

respected by politicians because our residents are aware of civic issues and we vote. We urge all eligible Westbury residents to vote in the December 14 runoff. If eligible, you can vote in December even if you did not vote during the November general city election. There are 2 at-large positions city council positions in the election. The League of Women Voters is a great resource to evaluate candidates. These at-large council positions DO matter because the successful candidates will represent all residents of Houston. Let's show them Westbury cares!

Many thanks to the hardworking poll workers and precinct judges who put in

long hours during the early voting and Election Day proceedings. Westbury appreciates you all!

WESTBURY SQUARE STATUS

The City's litigation over the Westbury Square dilapidated buildings is now at an end. The Texas Supreme Court ruled that the City's Building to Standard Commission orders against the dilapidated buildings remaining within Westbury Square are final and can be demolished. The current owner of the decayed buildings has until November 25 to suspicious vehicles and people obtain demolition permits and begin demolition of those buildings.

However, the owner has until February 10, 2014, to completely demolish both buildings. Even though the owner will seek an extension of the repair order entered against the theatre building, once an extension is granted, an inspector from the City's Public Works and Engineering Dept. will perform the requisite inspections to determine what repairs are needed. After all repairs are made, the owner can request a Certificate of Compliance to have the repair order released. The City Legal Dept. will check for permits and continue to monitor progress to ensure demolition progresses relative to the timetable discussed with the owner.

The Department of Neighborhoods, which heads the Neighborhood Protection Division, has been alerted and given a "heads up" that, if satisfactory progress has not been made in November, the Dept. will need to find an available funding source and process these buildings for demolition. The District K office will continue to keep us posted on this evolving development.

WHS Magnet Program Cancelled

The Magnet program at Westbury High School has been cancelled by HISD.

This situation about the WHS Magnet

This situation about the WHS Magnet Program affects the Westbury community, regardless of whether you have a school-aged child or which school your child currently attends. It is vital to the Westbury Community that the high school, which shares our name, continues on its path to become <u>a school of choice</u> with a stellar reputation.

For many years, Westbury residents and community leaders begged HISD to create a Fine Arts Magnet program at WHS to allow local students who have participated in the excellent Music Magnet program at Parker Elementary (or nearby Lovett Elementary) and the excellent Fine Arts Magnet program at Johnston Middle School to be able to continue with an outstanding Fine Arts Magnet program at WHS. HISD finally agreed to allow a Fine Arts Magnet at WHS just a few short years ago and the program has been growing.

We see the WHS Fine Arts Magnet program as vital to attracting both ZONED and NON-ZONED students to WHS; however, HISD has cancelled the WHS Fine Arts program. Next year (2014-2015 school year) HISD will eliminate magnet bus transportation to WHS. HISD eliminated all magnet funding for WHS. Why? Because HISD is only looking at how many NON-ZONED students participate in the program. We believe that HISD has not considered the full picture of the situation.

- 1. The WHS Fine Arts Magnet program is young and growing. WHS has not yet hired a Strings instructor, despite the well-known Strings programs at Parker and Johnston. We believe there is room for significant growth of student enrollment in the WHS Fine Arts Magnet program.
- 2. HISD has not considered that it is reasonable and desirable for a Fine Arts magnet program to be available for local high students who have been enrolled in high quality Fine Arts programs since they were in elementary school and who prefer to attend a local comprehensive high school rather than a specialized high school devoted to the Fine Arts.

- 3. Furthermore, we believe that HISD was not aware that the Westbury community will be the location of a new Levitt Pavilion (see page 18), a new outdoor venue for the performing arts, because the Levitt Pavilion formal announcement was made on November 12, 2013 AFTER HISD had made its magnet decision. The selection of the Westbury area / Willow Waterhole Nature Reserve by the national Levitt Pavilion Foundation was partly based on its proximity to Westbury High School.
- 4. The Levitt Pavilion will be bringing 50 free, high quality outdoor performances each year to the Westbury area. It makes sense to us that having a Fine Arts Magnet program at WHS is a natural fit with the new Levitt Pavilion. WHS will be the closest public school to the Levitt Pavilion.

Although fine arts at WHS will continue even if the magnet program is discontinued, the lack of transportation and the decrease in funding will be detrimental to the fine arts programs at WHS and also be detrimental to general funding of WHS if school enrollment drops. A loss of enrollment could cause the school to lay-off teachers in the Fine Arts Department.

We believe that a strong Magnet Program at WHS is vital. We are continuing dialogue with WHS and HISD. We are hopeful that our new HISD Trustee, Wanda Adams, will be helpful in this effort when she takes office in 2014. We will have more information about how you can help Westbury High School and the status of programming at WHS in future editions of the *Crier*.

HISD Board Votes to Expand WHS Property

On November 14, the Trustees of the Houston Independent School District (HISD) voted to give "Authority to finalize negotiations for purchase and approval of resolutions for the initiation of eminent domain procedures, if necessary, for the acquisition of property to expand the Westbury High School site".

The property is to be used for a public purpose, including "additional grounds for public school building(s) and appurtenances or additions thereto, playgrounds, athletic fields, green space, and/or parks in connection therewith".

Westbury High School Sponsors Band Night

The Parker Advanced Band performed at Butler Stadium on October 25, 2013, at the invitation of the Westbury High School Band. Bands from Welch MS and Fondren MS were also invited to perform. The performance was at half time during the WHS football game. Parker band students, wearing Band Night t-shirts given to them by WHS, reprised their pieces from Parker's recent FunFest (on October 19) and also performed several songs with the WHS Band. Band students performed from the stands. Performing in the open air is so different from a closed space. The music soared into the sky to glorious heights!

Parker and WHS Jazz Band director Al Campbell said, "We (Parker musicians) watched the performance from the field to give them a view of how a performance looks from standing on the field. We wanted to give them the total experience of a marching band in the stands and on the field. It was a great night for all schools that attended."



Westbury Power Of One

The Power of One 2013

Last December I had an article "the Power of One" about what a difference one person can make. So many people work tirelessly on behalf of Westbury with their only compensation being the satisfaction of doing what needed to be done. I am pleased to announce the 2nd annual "Power of One" award winner. I could think of no more fitting candidate than Rita Woodward.

Rita Woodward is a power house of energy packed into a small package. She is a mother, a grandmother and a great grandmother. All three of her daughters attended WHS in the 1970s. She joined the PTO while her granddaughter attended WHS in the 1990s and saw the incredible amount of work that needed to be done to bring WHS back to the school she remembered from the 1970s. To that end in 1992 she founded the all-volunteer Friends of Westbury High School Foundation. It is a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation funded by the generous support of Westbury alumni, friends and business partners. The Foundation has raised over \$200,000 and awarded 180+ scholarships to Westbury High students from 1994 through 2013. Not only was she the founder, but 21 years later at the

age of 86 she was still the powerhouse behind the 2013 gala.

Another goal and objective of the Friends group is the "enhancement and expansion" of the WHS campus. When the new Hollingsworth Science Center was built nearby, Rita lobbied to have the old "frog farm" building torn down. In its place sits the beautiful Rita Woodward Environmental Park, which was dedicated in April of 2008. She would also like to see the campus expanded from 25 to 50 acres. To that end she lobbied to have the apartment complex adjacent to the school torn down and HISDs first ninth grade academy was housed there. She also dreams of a permanent ninth grade academy to replace the portable buildings and an athletic complex complete with a natatorium. She dreams of the rest of the dilapidated apartments being torn down to make way for her dream. The difference is that when Rita dreams she backs it up with tenacity, fortitude, volunteerism and a can do spirit that is indefatigable. Her passion to reform the school, and the area, is clear.

But her passion isn't just confined to this one area; Rita is a long time board member of the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation; she was the chair of SW



Houston 2000s annual band concert; she works with the Brays Oaks Management District and over the years has held many positions in educational, environmental, police and civic organizations. I can't imagine what Westbury High School would be like without Rita Woodward's strong advocacy all these years. As principals and school boards changed, one constant voice could be heard: Rita's sweet voice. Perhaps even more remarkable than her many accomplishments is the fact that Rita is just one terrific person who always has a smile on her face and a twinkle in her eye. Rita, we thank you for your years of service and for showing us all what can be done.


