President's Message

Hopefully someday there will not be a President's Message that begins with the sad report that homes in Westbury were flooded again. About 100 homes that flooded on Memorial Day again had water enter their homes, this time on Halloween. I went down to speak to City Council on November 10 and asked that the City replace our aged and inadequate storm sewers. It is unfair that residents have paid their taxes year after year for 10, 20, 30, 40 and even 50 years without the City re-investing in our neighborhood storm sewer infrastructure.

Two of the hard hit areas have been pre-engineered through the Rebuild Houston project, but other affected areas have been omitted. The section west of Hillcroft is in the CIP plan for 2020. The section east of Hillcroft MUST be included. Residents cannot live in fear that every rain cloud could bring devastation to their lives. People are angry, upset and stressed. This is taking a toll on their health and their lives. Once the new city administration is in place, we will continue advocating for these much needed storm water infrastructure improvements.

Please be sure to vote in the upcoming run-off election on December 12. Who represents us does matter. I am pleased that most of our precincts are again in the top 5% in Houston for voter participation, with several having more than 40% of eligible voters voting. But that still means 60 percent of Westbury's registered

voters did not vote. A chart on our voting percentages is on page 6. PLEASE VOTE! Turnout is expected to be light, making each vote that is cast even more important. Don't know who to vote for? The League of Women Voters has a lot of information on their website. We have even included a sample ballot on page 6. Mark your choices and bring it to the polls with you!

The City has several projects beginning in Westbury and you can read about them on page 8. Be sure to report infrastructure problems with your water line, your sewer, or your streets to 311.

This is my favorite time of the year. We are reminded to be thankful and to take time to enjoy our family and friends. It is also a time to look back over the past year. 2015 started on a high note with the Neighborhood USA conference and Westbury winning first place in the neighborhood of the year competition! The Westbury Crier took home a Second Place Award. Improvements were made at

our parks. Our community garden continued to thrive. The Willow Waterhole hosted many great events. The dilapidated Centerette was finally demolished. Home sales were brisk in Westbury and our property values are up.

It is also time to look forward to the new year. 2016 will be a celebratory year. The Civic Club will be celebrating its 60th Anniversary! Check out page 7 for ways to join in the celebration.

For 60 years, volunteers have come forward year after year to ensure that Westbury is the best neighborhood it can be. I work with an amazing group of volunteers who give so much of their time to make Westbury a great place to call home.

It is a joyous time of year when hope and love and the gifts of the spirit are evident everywhere. Soon our streets will be awash with the glow of Christmas and holiday lights. The December Yard of the Month judging will focus on holiday decorations. Holiday celebrations like the Deck the Halls parade and the Willow Waterhole Holiday Music in the Park can become holiday traditions for you and your family. We wish you all the joys of the season!

NEXT WCC Board Meeting: Wed., January 20

Board Committee Motions were all approved unanimously by the WCC Board on November 18, 2015.

- Beginning in 2016, Mandatory Assessments now be billed for as one item to be called Mandatory Assessments.
- Beginning in 2016, Voluntary Dues now will be solicited and accounted for as two components: Westbury Civic Club Dues and Westbury Area Patrol. The 2016 Westbury Civic Club Dues will be \$50 and the Westbury Area Patrol Voluntary will be \$285. The total will be \$335.
- ♦ Beginning in 2016, Transfer fees will be increased from \$100 to \$125.
- ♦ Beginning in 2016, Refinance fees will be increased from \$50 to \$75.
- Beginning in 2016, Resale Certificates will be available by request for all sections of Westbury and Parkwest. A normal Resale Certificate request is \$100. A RUSH request is \$150. The WCC President and Treasurer are authorized to determine the definition of a RUSH.

Westbury Votes Count

Westbury residents can be PROUD that we have some of the highest voter participation in the city. According to a recent study, Texas ranks last or close to last in civic participation, but that's not true for Westbury! An amazing 72% of Houston's registered voters did NOT vote. Of the 1076 precincts, only 60 precincts had turnout above 40% and another 126 precincts had turnouts over 30%. Check out your precinct below. Westbury's 4 main precincts averaged over 40% making them in the top 5% for voter turnout. The average was 36% when all nine of the precincts where Westbury voters participate were examined. Both of these percentages were better the county, city and District C and K averages.

What this means to Westbury residents is that our votes do count. The Westbury community is respected by politicians because our residents are aware of civic issues and we vote. We urge all eligible Westbury residents to vote in the December 12 runoff. If eligible, you can vote in December even if you did not vote during the November general city election. The League of Women Voters website at http://lwvhouston.org is a great resource to evaluate candidates. This runoff election is so important to Houstonians. The 4 at-large council positions that are in the runoff DO matter because the successful candidates will represent ALL residents of Houston. Let's show them Westbury cares! GET OUT AND VOTE on December 12!



City of Houston Public Works Projects

Willowbend Asphalt Overlay

Willowbend Blvd. from Albury to Cedarhurst is scheduled to receive an asphalt overlay. This is a continuation of the overlay done on Willowbend several years ago that ended at West Bellfort.

We had hoped to have the street reconstructed, but the asphalt overlay will be a big improvement. Conditions on Willowbend have seriously deteriorated and drivers often drive in the wrong lane to avoid the potholes. Work was scheduled to begin November 30th and will be completed in March 2016.

Please make note of this construction and adjust your routes accordingly. We expect delays around the area due to the construction and the number of schools located off Willowbend. Look to future *Criers* for updates.

Water Main Line Replacements

Have you noticed strange markings on the sidewalks and streets? These are signs of upcoming improvement projects in our area. Alert residents notified the Civic Club of workers along Fontenelle. After some research and help from our City Council office, we were able to determine that portions of Westbury South and Westbury 3 will be having their water lines replaced. This is NOT storm drains. These are the water mains that break in the summer! This project is still in planning and design phases. Construction is not going to start until at least 2019.

Ashcroft from Cartagena to Burlinghall Landsdowne from Burlinghall to Ludginton Burlinghall from Mullins to Renwick Cerritos from Mullins to Cartagena Mullins from Burlinghall to Cerritos Cartagena from Cerritos to Ashcroft Cartagena from Burlinghall to Cerritos

Sanitary Sewer Line Replacement

Most of Westbury 5 West of Hillcroft and Parkwest 3 are getting their Sanitary Sewer lines replaced. See photos below. All homes affected will receive a notice from the contractor. Almost all the sanitary sewer lines are located in our backyards. They are in the 5 foot utility easement at the rear of most properties. The contractor will need access to your backyard when they are working in your area. Watch for notices if you live in the below areas. The work by HCFCD to correct the flow and desilt the Braewick ditch is complete. The fence at the end of Warm Springs that had been removed has been replaced. PW3 section director, Joe Niles, reported that the work on the ditch made a difference for his section as, so far, there have

been only a few reports of homes with water entering them in PW3. However, as of last week someone had vandalized the fence and knocked it down. This has been reported and should be fixed soon.

If STRUCTURAL flooding isn't reported to 311, then the city doesn't know where structural flooding has occurred. It is very important to report your structural flooding to both the City AND to Harris County. If you haven't done it yet, please do it right now, without delay.

Halloween Brings More Flooding in Westbury

When Westbury residents woke up on Halloween morning, some found streets and yards to be flooded. About 100 Westbury homeowners had water INSIDE their homes. These same residents flooded on Memorial Day and most of them at least one other time before that but for some this was their 7th time to flood.

All the homes (except a few in isolated areas) are along the Willow Waterhole Bayou. We believe the City's infrastructure has failed and is resulting in continual flooding. The hardest hit area of Westbury is NOT part of the current CIP project to reconstruct the storm drains. We are demanding that the City look at this "middle section" of Westbury as well. The Westbury Civic Club is advocating for our residents in the flooded sections of Westbury to have their drainage issues fixed.

Becky Edmondson, the WCC president, spoke before City Council on November 10 regarding the flooding along the illow Waterhole Bayou and Willowbend. We are planning for a big group to go speak before City Council after the new administration takes over. Look for future *Criers* for more information and a call to action.

2016 WCC Budget

The 2016 Westbury Civic Club (WCC) budget was approved at the November board meeting. Underlying the proposed budget were several changes recommended by the Budget Committee, which were separately discussed and unanimously approved by the board before the final budget was approved.

Much advance preparation work was done by the Treasurer and the Budget Committee. The committee investigated fees charged by nearby neighborhoods to verify that our charges are reasonable and consistent with industry norms. The committee extensively discussed funding for the Westbury Area Patrol. The committee also looked for ways to simplify data entry and accounting at the WCC office, although significant effort may be needed to transition from legacy methods. For example, traditionally the WCC has solicited and tracked funds for the Greenspace program separately from other WCC programs. After much discussion, the committee recommended that it would be simpler and provide more flexibility if the Greenspace program were treated the same as other programs of the WCC. The Westbury Area Patrol (WAP) will continue to be solicited and tracked separately.

The WCC will seek to boost the number of people who make voluntary payments.

Mandatory Assessments for 2016:

Residents of Parkwest 1 and Parkwest 2 who bought their homes after 1993 & 1994 have mandatory assessments. Mandatory Assessments are adjusted annually for inflation. Mandatory assessments will increase to \$233.50. We will no longer separate out categories in billing or accounting. While the \$233.50 is mandatory, we encourage our residents with mandatory assessments to pay the higher amount that other Westbury residents are paying.

Westbury Civic Club Dues:

The Westbury Civic Club Dues (encompassing all operations, programs, and services including greenspace, of the Westbury Civic Club, except patrol services) will increase to \$50. In 2015, the WCC Dues were \$40 but did not include Greenspace which was \$25. Dues and Greenspace will no longer be solicited separately. The 2016 budget includes increased funding for: deed restriction enforcement, payroll (higher wages plus another part-time worker), and hospitality (60th Anniversary celebration of the WCC in 2016).

Westbury Area Patrol (WAP): The WCC will seek to boost the number of people who financially support the WAP security patrol. The dues for the Westbury Area Patrol will increase from \$230 to \$285. This higher amount is similar to what is paid by residents of Maplewood N/S and Meyerland for their mandatory patrol assessments. The board will investigate additional fundraisers to support the WAP program.

Voluntary Dues TOTAL: The total sum of Westbury Civic Club Dues plus the Westbury Area Patrol will increase from \$295 to \$335.

Other Fees: Certain fees were also approved to be increased to accepted industry norms in 2016. Transfer fees will increase from \$100 to \$125. Refinance fees will increase from \$50 to \$75. Resale Certificates will now be available by request for all sections of Westbury and Parkwest. A normal Resale Certificate request is \$100, while a rush Resale Certificate request will be \$150.

2016 Mandatory Assessments


Homes purchased in Parkwest 1 and Parkwest 2 after 1993 and 1994 have mandatory assessments. These assessments may be adjusted by the most recently published annual percentage change for US Urban Wage Earners, US City Average, in accordance with the deed restrictions.

Definitions of Crime Types

Burglary - (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purposes of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

Theft - the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal goods or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

Auto Theft - the act of stealing your automobile or truck **Robbery** - taking or attempting to take anything of value by force or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated Assault - an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Rape - unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a female or person under age, or incapable of consent.

Murder - the unlawful premeditated killing of one human being by another.

<u>Holiday Travel:</u> For those who participate in the WAP Patrol, please make sure you take advantage of their vacation watches. You may call it in directly to Pct. 5 at 281-463-6666 or go to their website and fill out the form electronically.



<u>Packages:</u> For those that are having packages delivered to your home, make sure someone is there to accept the package or consider having it delivered to an alternate location such as your work or directly to the UPS store. Several porch package thefts have occurred in Westbury in the past month. As holidays approach, the thieves will be looking for easy targets. Do not be one!

<u>Shopping</u>: Be aware of your surroundings. Make sure to park in well lit areas. Do not carry large amounts of cash. Do not wear large amounts of expensive jewelry. Consider shopping during the day or with a friend. Be aware of strangers approaching you with questions to distract you.

<u>Visible Presents/gifts:</u> Large displays of presents/gifts should not be visible thru your front windows.

<u>Scams/Suspicous Person(s):</u> One common scam in our area involves someone coming to your door asking about trimming your trees. They get you to take them out back while someone else, unbeknownst to you, is robbing you. Call WAP at 281-463-6666 for any suspicious vehicles or people. One way criminals screen the neighborhood and homes is by going door to door with fake solicitations or by knocking to see if the homeowner is home. Do not open the door to strangers, however, let them know that someone is home.



Westbury Christian Hosted Holocaust Museum Lecture

Westbury Christian Campus Hosted Holocaust Museum Lecture

Ruth Vinn Hendler Lack, the late former director of the Holocaust Museum Houston and a Holocaust survivor, imparted in her son Jonathan the importance of building bridges with different communities to ensure that a tragedy like the Holocaust would never happen in America.

Twenty years after his mother's death, Lack – president of Al's Formal Wear and the father of a Westbury Christian School senior, Noah, who is being raised Jewish – brought the annual museum lecture series named in his mother's memory to the Westbury Christian campus in an attempt to demonstrate the kind of cultural and religious bridge-building she advocated.

On Nov. 18, Susannah Heschel, Eli Black Professor of Jewish Studies at Dartmouth College, gave the 2015 Ruth Vinn Hendler Lack Lecture, titled "Remembering the March on Selma and the Voting Rights Act 50 Years Later," for a multicultural group of attendees representing both the Jewish and Christian faiths. Much like Lack, Heschel had a parent who encouraged and modeled bridge-building. Her father, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, marched with Dr. Martin Luther King at Selma.

"My father's friendship with Martin Luther King Jr. has become a point of profound inspiration," Heschel said, "but people weren't proud of this in those days. That historic photo of my father marching arm-in-arm with Dr. King and other civil rights leaders is now iconic and a source of hope, but it should also be an image of challenge, not complacency. My father and Dr. King lived in a state of moral emergency, because that's what it means to be a religious person."

Lack chose to invite
Heschel to speak about
Selma, and the resulting
passage of the Voting Right
Acts, on the occasion of its
50th anniversary because
he also believes the
significance of the march
continues to reverberate,
not simply as a political
event, but as an
extraordinary moral and
religious one as well.

"I believe my mother would have been honored to know that through this event held in her memory on the campus of the Christian school where her grandson is receiving academic and moral training, parents from

various backgrounds were able to learn alongside their sons and daughters more about how people of different ethnicities and faiths came together at a key moment in history to make our country a better place for all," Lack said. "Perhaps through dialogue like this, we can all learn something from the past to help us work better together on the many challenges currently facing our nation, and the ones our children will face over the next 50 years."



The board of the Westbury Area Improvement Corporation approved the following motions:

Commercial Updates: A single family residential patio home project on Mullins north of Westbury has been proposed on the site of the former St. Nicholas School (Medical Charter School) site, which might exacerbate flooding issues in the Willowbend area. HPD Officer Vick was asked to look at certain nuisance locations for dumping or high grass.
